

ians by just under 10 goals, to


knock Parade out of the four.





LOOKING BACK BY NOEL RUNDLE

5 years ago — 1971

St. Bernard's scored a last minute win over Caulfield Grammarians when they kicked 3 goals in the last 5 minutes. It was Caulfield's second defeat in succession as the previous week they went down to Ormond by 20 points.

No doubt about the umpires real sense of values! After two vears of "we must have a board for our important notices" architect Trevor Rowe produced a beautiful work of art, green with gold lettering. The first notice the world shattering "Please wash your cups"!

200 games to National Bank Reserves captain - coach Geoff phillips.

National Bank, after leading all day, went down by a point to Tooronga-Malvern who kicked 6.3 to 2.5 in the final quarter to triumph 17.10 to 16.15.

"Trueboots" were Foulsham (Ormond) 8 v. Collegians, Douglas (Coburg) 9 v. M.H.S.O.B., Barkley (Uni. Blues) 7 v. De La Salle, Nihill (Kew) 6 v Old Xav's and Hick (Ivan.) 7 v. U.H.S.O.B., while in a high scoring match, Power House 23.12 defeated Old Geelong Gram. 17.6, Bartlett (Power House) and Rick Whalley (O.G.G.) kicking 13 and 7 respectively.

10 years ago - 1966

Six leading teams were beaten in the biggest upset of top sides for years. Coburg (2nd in "A" Section) forged ahead of Melbourne High (on top) and went on to an easy win, 8.9 to 3.6. Faster and scouting better with Norm Beattie and Phil Parkes the stars, Coburg adapted well to the wet and muddy conditions. Kew (on top in "B") lost their

first game for the season when they went down to **Ivanhoe** (3rd) by 21 pts. Elsternwick held a reunion of their 1925 premiership team with 22 players and officials in attendance, including Peter Mountjoy (captain) Norm Macdonald (secretary for 25 years) Chas Loughrey, Alex Martin, Eddie Shaw, Clarrie Williams, "Tuds" Heard, Les Morris, Leo Walsh, Harold Macdonald (goal umpire) and Frank Martin (boundary umpire).

100 games at Old Haileybury to Peter "Circles" MacFarlane and Brian Henderson.

AJAX were the only undefeated team — 12 straight wins in "E" Section, two games ahead of Glenhuntly while Old Ivanhoe and Reservoir Old Boys made up the four.

25 years ago — 1951

The first Amateur Carnival to be staged in Victoria was held at St. Kilda Cricket Ground with Canberra making up 5 with Victoria, South Aust, Tasmania and West Aust.

In a peculiar draw Victoria finally only played two matches winning both, and kicking 39.18 to Tasmania's 4.4 and 18.20 to Canberra's 2.5.

South Australia went down by 11 points to Canberra on the opening day and no doubt this loss upset the draw. Some names of interest — in W.A.'s team was Billy Snedden 24, 6.0., 13.10 (today's Speaker in the House of Representatives) while R. Woolcott, 23, 5.11, and 11.12 represented Canberra.

(Dick Woolcott in 1976 is Australian Ambassador in Indonesia.)

The Australian Amateur team to play the V.F.A. in Canberra was picked at the close of carnival with Victorians **Doug Arnold** and **Peter Cox**, captain and vice-captain respectively, 13 other Victorians, 3 from W.A., and 2 each from S.A. and Tasmania.

Umpire Committee Chairman ALF KEAM

Alf Keam was appointed Chairman of the Umpire Committee of the V.A.F.A. after serving a term of five years as a member of that committee, and after an even longer playing career.

Alf spent most of his Amateur football days wearing the maroon, green and black of Melbourne High School Old Boys, apart from one season with University Blacks.

He started with Melbourne High in 1940 and chalked up more than 150 games with them, and even as late as 1967 or 1968, when he was over 40, he still stripped with the Reserves on occasions.

Alf's playing position was the wing, where his sprinting ability and solid $5'7\frac{1}{2}''$ and $12\frac{1}{2}$ stone stood him in good stead, but as he himself admits, he dropped back into the back pocket as he slowed up in later years.

He served in the Royal Australian Navy during the War (from 1942 to 1946) and rose to the rank of Lieutenant.

During his war service, Alf played football with Sydney Naval Depot in 1943 and with Subiaco (W.A.) in 1945.

Then it was back to his old club, but he transferred to University Blacks in 1949, in the final year of his Commerce degree course.


Alf was Melbourne High's Delegate to the V.A.F.A. for about 10 years, and became a member of the Umpire Committee in 1971. The following year he was appointed to the Selection Committee, a position he still holds.

He was Treasurer of M.H.S. club in 1948 and held the office of President from 1967 to 1971.

Golf and tennis are among his other sporting interests, and he is a member of the Finance Sub-Committee of Metropolitan Golf Club — rather appropriate, as Alf is a stockbroker.

In his younger days (Alf is now in his 50's), he was keen on athletics and won a Sports Champion award at Melbourne High.

Serving on committees and so forth is not the limit of Alf's attributes — he has done a wonderful job as compere of St. Bernard's Grand Final Breakfast the last three years.
