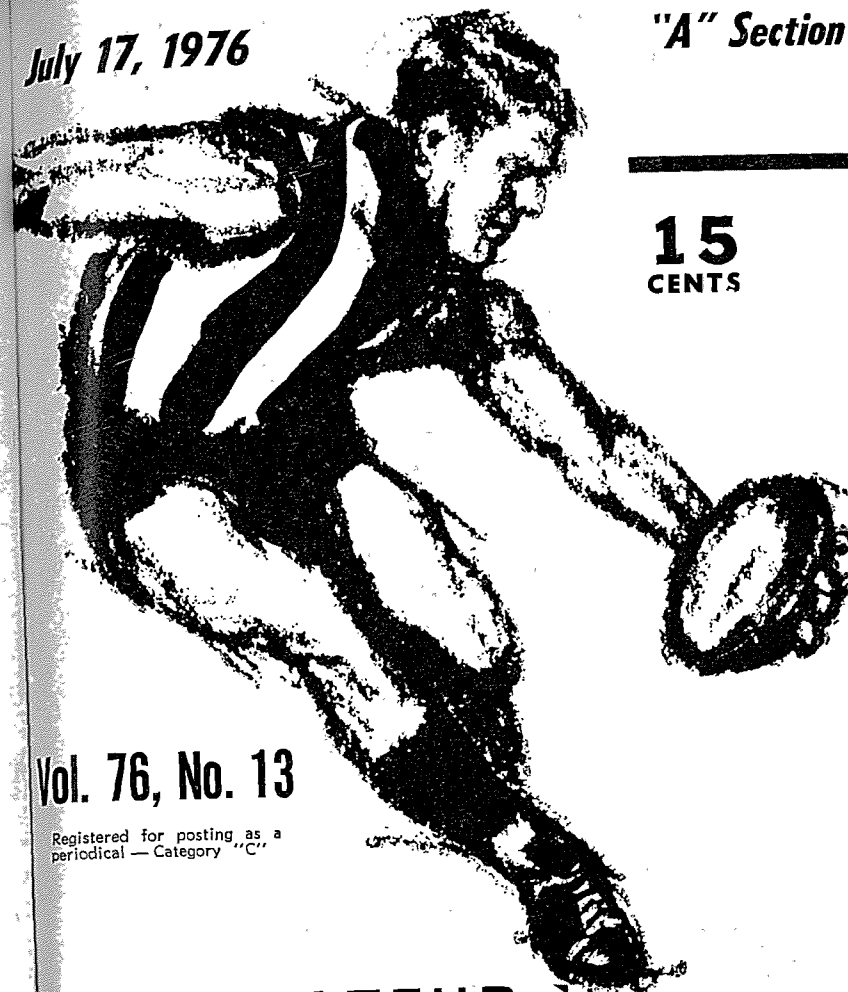

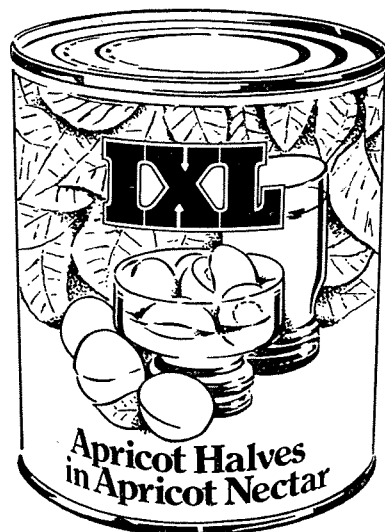

Carnival Hat-trick to South Australia VICTORIA DOWN IN FINAL GAME

Surprises at Home, Too — Six Leaders Beaten

South Australia won their third successive Australian Amateur Football Carnival when they beat Victoria the hot favourites, by 34 points in the final match at Thebarton Oval, Adelaide, last Sunday.

It was a distinct reversal of form by the South Australians who were extremely lucky to beat West Australia in the opening match and were not convincing in their win over Tasmania.

But the shocks were not confined to the Carnival — six leading teams were beaten in last Saturday's round here in Melbourne, two of them (Thomastown Juniors and West Brunswick Reserves) suffering their first defeat for the season.

Old Trinity kept themselves in the running for the four with an easy win over Coburg, who showed little of their former power football. The fast, play-on style for which they have long been renowned was just not there.

Monash Blues, conquerors of leaders North Old Boys a couple of weeks previously, sprang another surprise — this time they beat St. Bernard's, by a point. St. Bernard's obviously missed their five players in the Carnival side.

North Old Boys had a real tussle with University Blues, who ran North to 14 points in a high standard, high-scoring game. The scores were level at three-quarter-time.

Ormond continued their upward trend with a big win over University Blacks, who have stumbled into the "hot seat".

Collegians were well beaten by Marcellin and lost their place in the four, which is once again occupied by Old Paradians, and Caulfield Grammar jolted Geelong's final four hopes.

Old Haileybury failed again — going down this time to Fawkner, who won by 33 points, while Old Melburnians swamped Hampton Rovers to let Fawkner into the four, at the same time helping themselves to Haileybury's top spot.

St. Kevin's like St. Bernard's, were also beaten by a point, also by a down-the-line team, North Brunswick, but ANZ Bank found Heatherton a long way further in front at the final siren.

In the Juniors, Hampton Rovers worried Ivanhoe, running them to

Another carnival is over — South Aust. take the honours again

Their Fourth Carnival Victory — Third in a Row

South Australia's Carnival win in Melbourne three years ago created history — and last Sunday their win in Adelaide created even more history for the home state.

It was the fourth Carnival staged in Adelaide and it was South Australia's first Carnival win in their home city, their fourth Carnival win and their third in succession.

Victoria have won the other nine Carnivals, but it now seems a long time since our last success — at Launceston, in 1967.

But South Australia will remember that it was an even longer wait from their first win, at Perth in 1948, until they started their present run in the same city in 1970.

What will be the outcome of the next Carnival, presumably at Hobart in 1979?

South Australia started off very shakily with a lucky 7-point win over West Australia in a thrilling finish to the opening match of the Carnival.

Their burst of six goals in the second term was a big factor in their win.

South had the better of things generally in the first half and led by 20 points at the interval. West Australia got to within five points in the third term only to see South break away and lead by three goals at three-quarter-time.

It was a ding-dong struggle in the last quarter with West creeping up to as close as a point, but couldn't get the goal to put them in front.

Inexperience (none of the West Australian players took part in the Carnival at Melbourne) and a lack of steadiness in front of goal in the vital last quarter robbed the West of victory and prevented them from causing a major upset.

They were really unlucky in hitting the post twice and kicked 4-7 for the quarter to South's 3-2.

Victoria had no trouble in scoring an overwhelming win over Tasmania, their overall strength, pace and determination being too much for the Tasmanians, who however must be given credit for fighting the game right out to the finish.

Victoria opened with 5 goals in the first quarter, but poor shooting for goal in the second term spoilt much of the good work. Victoria added 6-12 in this quarter to lead by more than 10 goals at the interval.

Tasmania showed their best form in the last quarter when they added 3 goals but they were no match for the powerful Victorian combination.

Tasmania put up a better showing against South Australia who were not impressive in winning by 50 points, their inaccurate kicking (15-25) pointing to haphazard forward work.

West Australia opened in a lively manner against Victoria who were struggling in the first quarter and trailed by 11 points at the first change.

But it was a different story in the second term as the Victorians got into

top gear and slammed on 8-1 to 1-1, and went in at the interval with a lead of 31 points.

Victoria went further ahead in the third quarter and had it well won at three-quarter-time. West Australia again lapsed into inaccuracy in the last quarter when they added 1-7 to be 52 points down at the finish.

But West proceeded to annihilate Tasmania in the early match on the final day and led by almost 10 goals at half-time.

And this time they kicked straight in the last quarter, adding 10-2 to win by nearly 24 goals. Simon Beasley, winner of the Carnival Best and Fairest award, kicking 12 goals.

Then came the final game!

Each side opened with a quick goal, and the scores were levelled again at 2-1 each but then Victoria forged ahead with 3 goals only to see South score their third just before quarter-time.

Victoria looked to be getting on top when they added 2 goals and it appeared as if it could be a repetition of the Vic-W.A. game.

Suddenly South Australia cut loose and with their big men giving them great drive and their forwards gaining the upper hand, they rushed on 3 goals in quick time to take a 1-point lead at the interval.

The home side raced away to a 5-goal lead halfway through the third term, as the Victorian defenders could do little to stem the flood of goals.

At three-quarter-time, South Australia were in a very strong position when they led by 39 points, and the Victorians were playing well below the form they showed against West Australia.

South stormed forward early in the last quarter and ran to a lead of more than 8 goals but Victoria fought back well and gained a little of their lost prestige as they added 4 goals.

But Victoria were unable to go on with what was an almost impossible task and South Australia ran out winners by 34 points.

UMPIRE'S CORNER

By KEVIN MCKAY

Reply to "F" section club 19-6-76 —
1. You are quite correct, the coach of a team is NOT permitted to act as a runner.

2. Again you are right, any player taking part in the game must have his name and correct number on the team sheet.

Reply to "B" section coach 3-7-76

1. Re centre square — If a player pushes his opponent over the line of the centre square at a centre bounce, the boundary umpire does not blow his whistle — He tells the offending player to "cut it out" and he must also tell the field umpire when he gets the opportunity — there is no penalty against the player pushed over the line.

2. No — an umpire cannot report an offence he does not see — it is similar to the awarding of a free kick — he must see the infringement — so also he must see the reportable incident — he must not report what he thinks may have occurred.

An interesting rule 18 which reads

No free kick shall be given against a player who, in legitimately going for a mark, interferes with an opponent from behind.

Notice the words "Legitimately going for a mark." If a player is not "legitimately going for a mark" he is open to penalty if he interferes with the player trying to mark the ball.

Therefore the opponent flying into the air with a clenched fist takes the risk of a penalty.

He surely can't be "legitimately trying to mark" with a clenched fist. The spoiler takes all the chances of being free kicked.

Holding the man — means a player with the ball must be held firmly enough to stop him or retard his progress —

Retarding does not mean completely

stopping, to check or ease down a man's progress is sufficient.

Take the instance of a 10 stone man trying to stop a man of some 15 stone. He could "retard" him but the odds are he would not stop him.

Do you know?

That the free kick for deliberately forcing the ball "out of bounds" was introduced as far back as 1922?

That in 1930 the Football Council adopted the principle of allowing a substitute for an injured player.

In 1921 the Williamstown v Footscray (V.F.A.) final match was abandoned during the third quarter on account of a terrific hailstorm.

He also played against South Australia at Elsternwick Park last season.

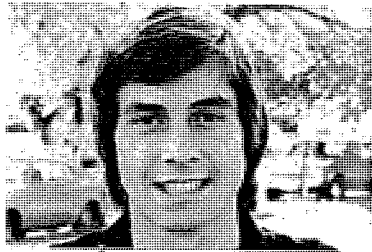
John, whose "vital statistics" are 26, 5'11" and 12 stone, plays in the centre or on the wing, or on the half-forward line.
