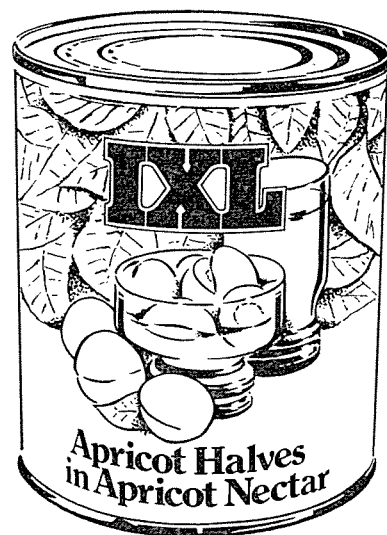

LAST WEEK'S HIGHLIGHTS NORTH STOP ORMOND'S RUN

SCOTCH DOWN TO CAULFIELD IN DESPERATE FINISH Fields Narrow for Finals Berths

Ormond's dramatic rise up the ladder with four wins in a row came to a halt last Saturday when they met their match at the hands of the leaders, North Old Boys.

Old Scotch made a desperate last-quarter bid for victory over top B Section team, Caulfield Grammarians, but failed by eight points.

Many of those in the running for the final four received setbacks and the list of contenders is narrowing down.

University Blues strengthened their claims for inclusion in the finals when they scored a 21-point win at Coburg.

The Blues kicked 6-7 to nothing in the first quarter to gain an early break and held Coburg to two points in the third term, but Coburg kicked seven goals in each of the other two quarters.

Ormond led North by 11 points at half-time but North's eight goals in the third quarter put them on the road to a comfortable win.

Old Trinity trailed St. Bernard's by 28 points at the interval, but added 6-5 to 1-1 in the third term to be six points in front. Then St. Bernard's finished on to score by three goals.

University Blacks improved their chances of avoiding relegation with a good win over their "hoodoo" side, Reservoir Old Boys.

Scotch opened well against Caulfield but the leaders broke away in the second quarter to lead by 27 points at the interval.

A burst by Scotch brought them 4 goals and to within 8 points in the third quarter but Caulfield came again to be 28 points in front at the last change.

In an exciting last term, Scotch added 3 quick goals to cut their deficit to 10 points but Caulfield kicked 3 in reply and looked safe. Scotch came again in a desperate effort but the closest they could get was 8 points.

It was a high-standard game, with the emphasis on kicking, and long kicking at that, and a minimum of handball which seems to be the craze with most teams—foolish, ineffective handball that more often than not lands them in trouble, instead, as handball is

intended, to get a player out of trouble.

Marcellin scraped home by only a point from St. Kilda CBC, whose inaccuracy in front of goal proved costly. Old Paradians easily beat Geelong and Ivanhoe shocked Collegians, winning by 21 points and dimming Collegians hopes of making the four.

Old Haileybury's slump continues—they suffered their third defeat in a row, at the hands of Parkside, by no less than 15 goals. And Old Melburnians went down to Fawkner by 19 points in a high-scoring game, to put Parkside on top on percentage.

LaTrobe scored comfortably over St. Kevin's, and ANZ Bank had 23

points to spare from Old Melburnians.

Footscray Tech. beat St. Bede's by 10 points in a scoring spree (21-18 to 19-20) and West Brunswick were much too strong for Beverley Hills.

In the Juniors, University Blues drew with Ormond (12-21 to 13-15) and Monash University beat Ivanhoe comfortably, while in the Reserves, Old Melburnians failed badly at Fawkner and AJAX went down by 2 goals to Assumption.

Once again the famous five—all home teams won in C Section (but not in the Reserves this time). All five home teams won in F Section, and the five visitors scored in B Section.

Another Captain in the News—Blacks' Simon Costello

Simon Costello joined University Blacks in 1972 after two years in Xavier College's first eighteen, and after being Vice-Captain in 1974 and 1975, he was appointed Captain this season.

Simon, now 22, started off as a centre half-back, but last year he was used as a ruck-rover, using his 6 feet and 14-3 to advantage.

He was in the Victorian squad in 1973 and 1974, without making the final side, but won a Victorian sweater last season when he played against Tasmania at Elsternwick Park.

He won the Blacks' Best and Fairest award in 1973, and is now approaching the 100 games mark, having missed only one through injury.

Simon was still in the squad for this year's Carnival when it was narrowed down to 36, but was not fortunate enough to be selected in the final 25.

300 UP FOR COMMONWEALTH BANK STALWART

Commonwealth Bank's evergreen Tony "Barney" Borrack last Saturday played his 300th senior game with the Bank. Tony started with the club's under 19's in 1959 and after playing a handful of games there quickly earned selection to the senior side (which incidentally he has never been out of through lack of form). Tony played as a forward in his first few years but by 1965 he had made a name for himself in "A" grade as an attacking long-kicking centreman and in that year represented Victoria as a centreman. He also earned another Victorian guernsey the following year. In his 18 years association with the club,

Tony has won four Best and Fairest awards, (1965, 1967, 1968 and 1973) and has held several executive positions in the Club. He captained the side from 1966 to 1970 (including the 1969 "C" grade premiership side) and was appointed captain-coach in 1972 till 1974 before ultimately becoming President in 1975. This year we see Tony playing on the forward flank and from there we hope he can add to the 150 goals he has already kicked. Tony has always been a fine clubman and has remained loyal to the club through the good and lean years. All at the Commonwealth Bank Football Club extend their congratulations and look forward to seeing him play in his 400th game in a few years time.

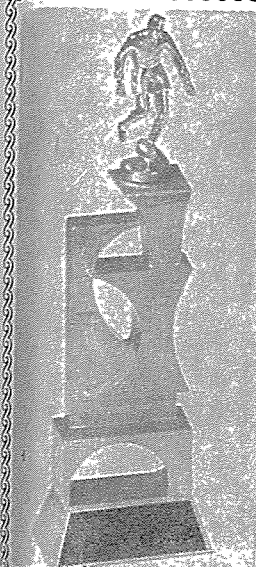

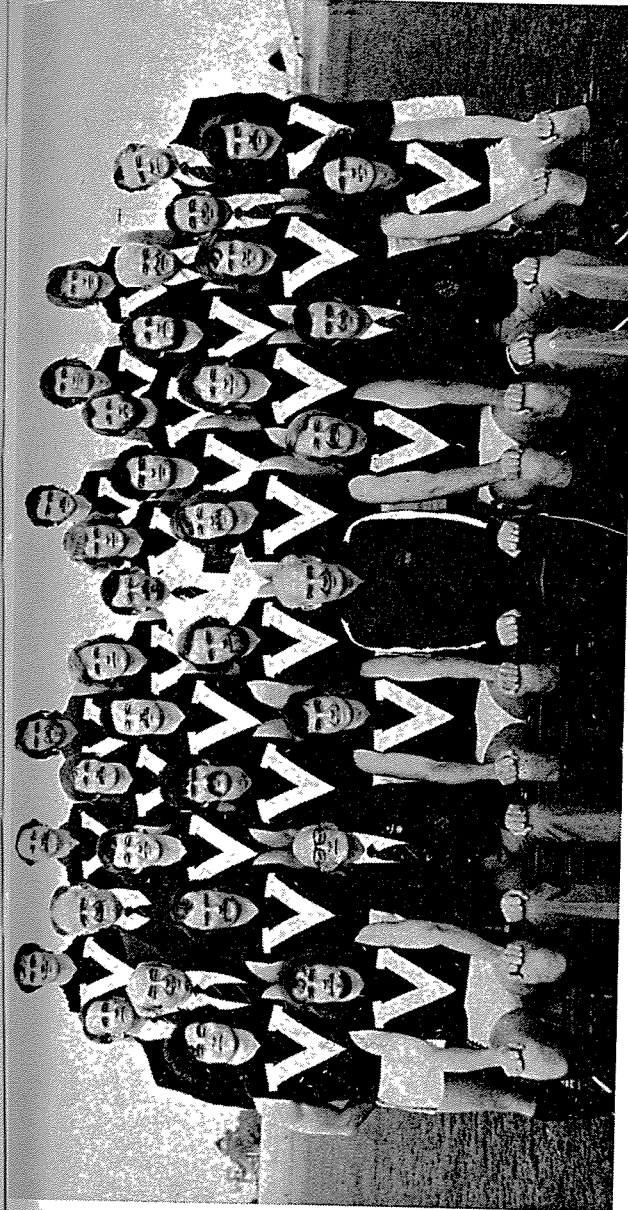

CLUB RUNNER DUTIES

The official club runner must be easily identified by wearing the V.A.F.A. arm band, and must take his message out to a player (or players) by the shortest route, and leave the playing area immediately after he has carried out his coach's instructions.

He must not stay on the arena "urging" his players to "go harder".

His name must also appear on the team sheet.

CENTRE CIRCLE

Some clubs are still marking three circles across the centre of the ground — this is incorrect as with the innovation of the centre square the umpire must bounce the ball in the centre and not move out to a firmer area no matter what the condition of the centre may be. Such circle must be 3 metres in diameter.

Today we call it scrummage, but in the original laws of 1874 it was scrummage and the definition read —

A scrummage commences when the ball is on the ground and all who have closed round on their respecting sides begin kicking at it.

Rule 11 of the same year read — the umpire's decision shall in every case be final and the club disputing the same shall lose the match.

John Byrne — Executive Committee Member

John Byrne, a Member of the Executive Committee of the V.A.F.A. since 1966, must be regarded as one of the unluckiest players in the game.

On four occasions he was selected in training squads for Interstate games and each time he was forced to withdraw on account of injury.

But he was not out of the "big time" altogether—he made the final 21 in the V.A.F.A. team for the Exhibition match at the 1956 Olympic Games in Melbourne.

John, now 43, played with Ormond as recently as 1964—a tribute to his fitness—and in all, put together 140 games with his club.

He started with Ormond Juniors in 1951 (a premiers year for them) and after two seasons, graduated to the seniors in 1953. He played till the end of the 1959 season, captaining the side from 1958 to 1960, and then went back in 1964.

In 1961, John was working in Tasmania, and turned out with Old Launcestonians, in the Northern Division of the Tasmanian Amateur Football League.

Here he was selected in the Tasmanian team, but once again missed out on playing because of injury.

John's 6'2" and 13 stone made him a burly full-forward or ruckman.

In the summer, he played cricket with Glenhuntingly in the V.J.C.A. competition.

On the administrative side, John was a member of the Committee at Ormond from 1965 to 1971, and has been Manager or Assistant Manager of a number of Victorian teams.

He lists his most memorable football experiences in this order:—

1. The 1955 Final between Ormond and Old Melbourneians—often described as the best exhibition of Australian Football witnessed (certainly in Amateur circles).

What about the 1974 Second Semi-Final between Ormond and Coburg?—Ed.

2. Playing in front of the great Duncan

Anderson (one of the greatest full-forwards to play Amateur football—Ed.) in Olympic Games pre-selection matches. It did not matter how or where you kicked the ball to him—he marked it.

3. Playing in the Ormond Juniors team in 1951—undefeated Premiers and Champions.

John also writes the Previews for B Section in The Amateur Footballer and was doing quite well until last week, when Old Scotch, Old Carey and Collegians let him down.

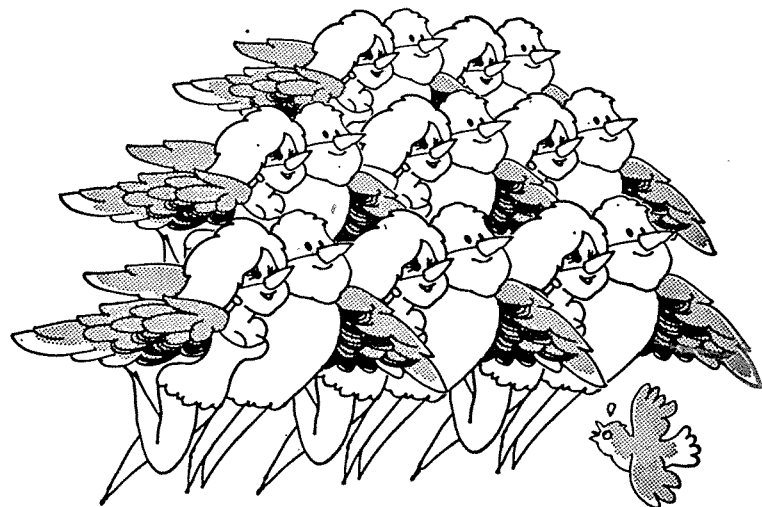

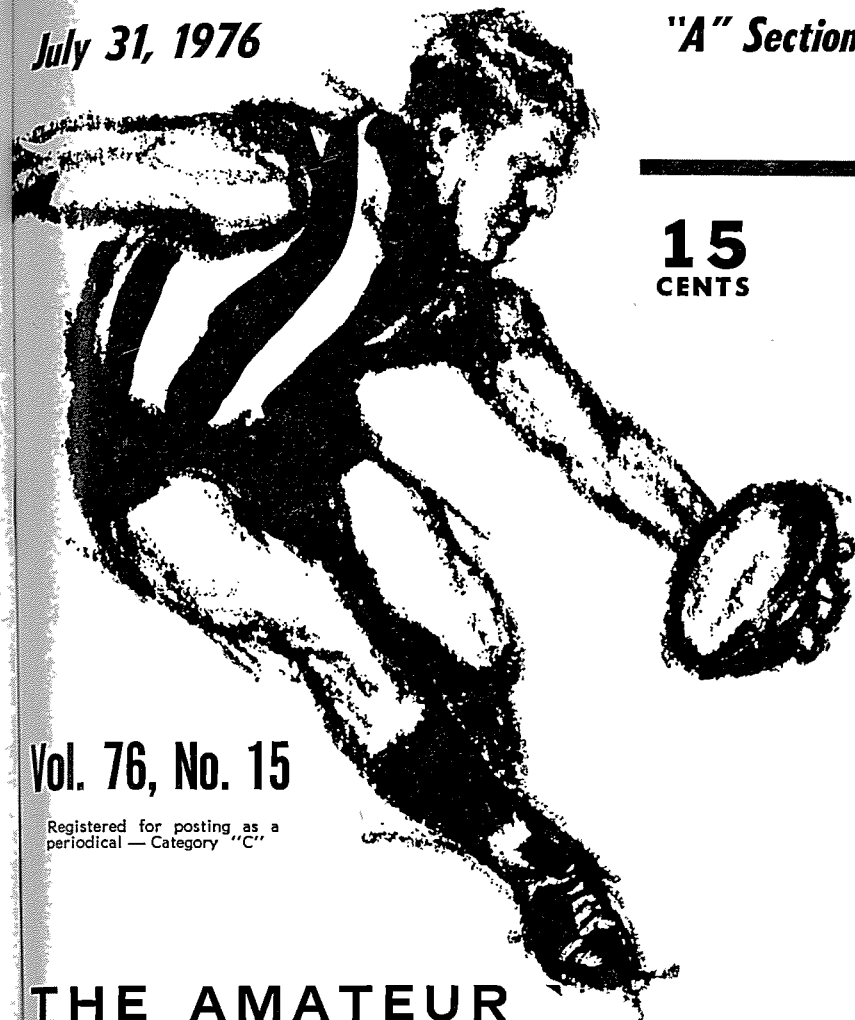
