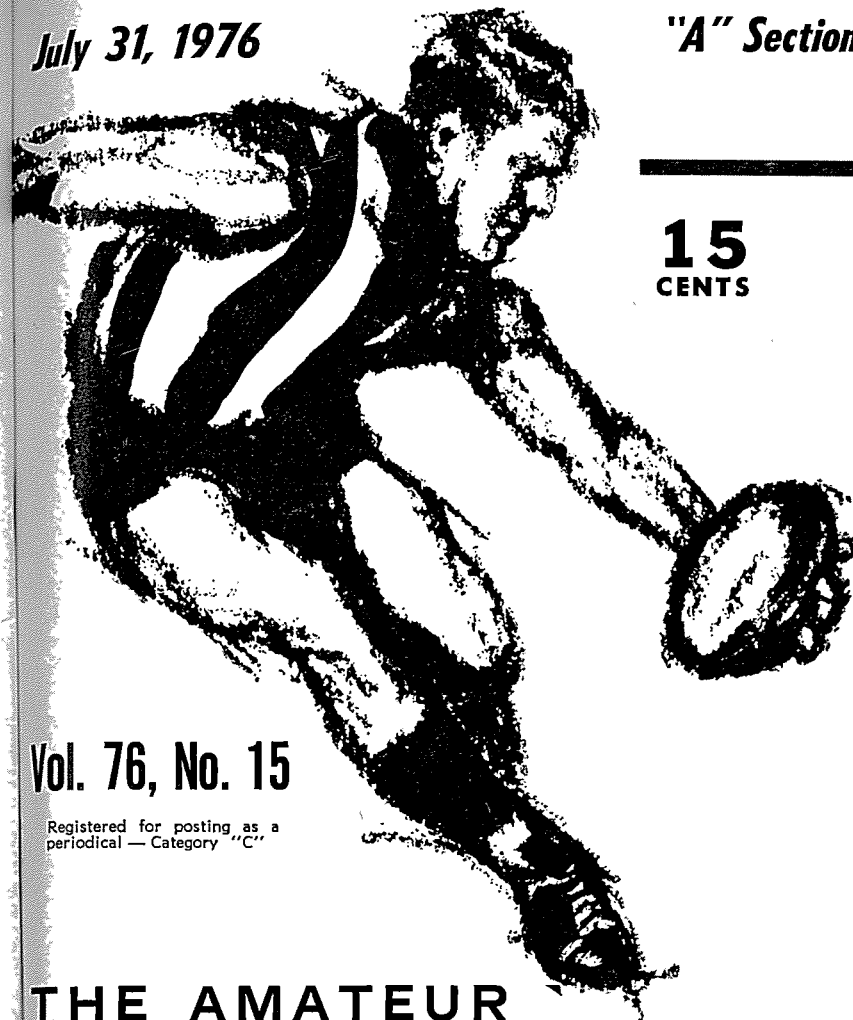

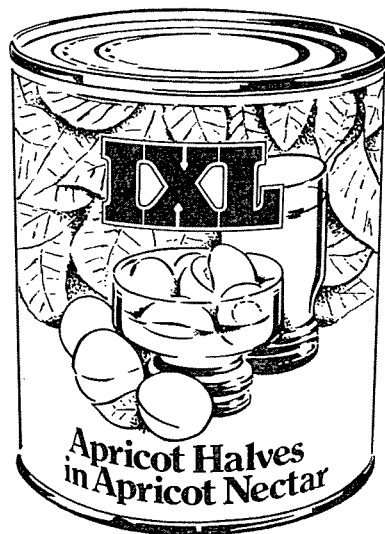

LAST WEEK'S HIGHLIGHTS

Leaders Crash in Day of Surprises

FIVE FIGHT FOR FOURTH PLACE

FIRST DEFEAT FOR AJAX

Six leading teams suffered defeat in last Saturday's round which produced a crop of upsets, one of the leaders, AJAX, being beaten for the first time this season.

The others to go down were North Old Boys, Caulfield Grammarians, and three Reserve teams — Hampton Rovers, Old Brighton and West Brunswick.

And 14 other teams in the fours were beaten, many of them by teams outside the top bracket in each case.

With four rounds to be played the fight for the four is on in real earnest, with five teams fighting for fourth place in the top grade.

North Old Boys' inaccuracy in front of goals was the prime cause of their three-goal defeat by Coburg, whose tactics of crowding and packing their backline paid dividends.

At the other end, their own forwards were well on the target, kicking 13-6 to North's 8.18.

Old Trinity repeated their first round win over De La Salle (this time by 21 points) and drew level with University Blues in fourth place, but well back on percentage.

The Blues failed by two goals against St. Bernard's, but had the chance to win it in the last few minutes, when three shots from

close in managed only points.

Ormond didn't look like a final four prospect when they failed badly against bottom side, Reservoir Old Boys.

Ormond wasted the wind advantage in the first quarter and although they put in a good third term, they led by only 19 points at the last change, and Reservoir swamped them in the final quarter when they rattled on eight goals to win by 27 points.

University Blacks scraped home by seven points from Monash Blues, with a lucky break in the dying minutes of the game.

On paper, the Blacks are only

a game out of the four, but it would be more correct to say that this win has made them a little safer from relegation.

Caulfield went down by five points to Old Paradians, who doubly improved their chances of competing in the finals thanks to Melbourne High's 29-point win over Collegians.

High lifted their hopes of staying in the Section a little, but their chances of avoiding relegation are far from bright.

Hampton Rovers pipped Fawkner by three points to knock them out of the four, and it's a toss-up which of these two will occupy fourth place at the end of the home-and-home series.

Caulfield Grammarians would like to congratulate Andrew Goold on playing his 100th game against Old Paradians last Saturday. Andrew has just returned to the club after an absence of a season and a half. Again, congratulations and best wishes in all future games.

BOB SINCLAIR — A VETERAN OF THE EXECUTIVE

Bob Sinclair joined Coburg when the club entered the V.A.F.A. in 1935. Although he played, he was not a regular member of the team, and it has been on the administrative side of amateur football that he has made his biggest contribution.

Bob was first elected to the Coburg Committee in 1942 and became Club Delegate in 1948. He was elected to the Permit Committee in 1956 and became a member of the Executive Committee in 1959, a position he has held ever since.

He was Secretary of Coburg for over 20 years and has also held the position of President and Chairman.

Bob has been associated with many Victorian teams in an official capacity.

He was Manager of the team which played South Australia at Melbourne in 1965, Manager of the team which played at Hobart in 1969 and of the team which played in the same city in 1974.

He was Assistant Manager at Devonport in 1962, Launceston in 1963, Adelaide in 1966 and Launceston again in 1972.

He was also Assistant Manager of the Victorian party at the Perth Carnival in 1970, and a member of the Official Party of the Australian Amateurs visit to Brisbane in 1971.

Bob continues his story in his own words — "As I am retiring this year, I may not be standing for any official position within the V.A.F.A. next year, and I would like, with the consent of the Editor, to thank my club for electing me Club Delegate, making it possible for me to become a member of the V.A.F.A. and the opportunity of becoming an official of the Association — which has enabled me to meet so many friends within the Association and also players and friends from Interstate.

"After 40 years of association with the V.A.F.A., may I voice a PERSONAL opinion that I feel concerned about the future, with the decline in club administration (including my own club), and the unsporting attitude of many players and supporters over the past few years, that I urge all clubs not to let the standards of the V.A.F.A. be lowered, but to strive to uphold the standard that we are all proud of, which has made the V.A.F.A. so well respected for so many years."

Bob says that he has little football prowess to boast about, but he can certainly be proud of his efforts "off the field" and "behind the scenes".

We wish Bob all the very best in his retirement and hope that he will continue to enjoy, and take some part in, amateur football for many years to come.

He was in the early squad for this year's Carnival but would have been unavailable for final selection as he had the misfortune to suffer a broken ankle early in the second round.

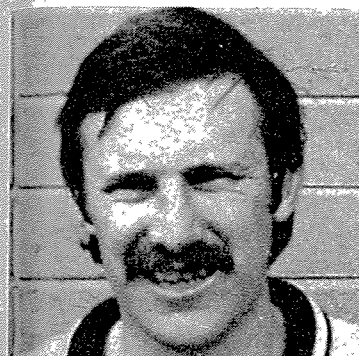
He has played over 100 games with

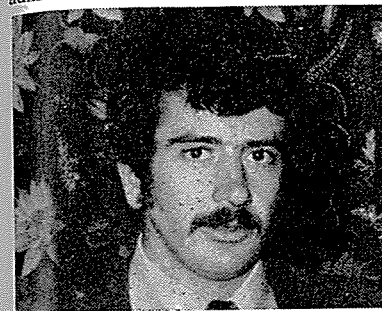

ELIGIBILITY OF PLAYERS FOR RESERVE AND JUNIOR SECTION FINALS

The attention of clubs is drawn to the restrictions which apply concerning players eligible to take part in Final matches in the Reserve and Junior Sections.

The Rule relating to eligibility of players in Reserve Section Finals reads:—
A player who has been a member of a senior team of any club in nine or more matches during the home-and-home matches in any season shall not be eligible for inclusion in the reserve team of a club taking part in a final match in the same season unless both the senior and reserve teams are participating in a final match on the same day. Provided that no player shall be elig-

ible for inclusion in a reserve team taking part in a final match in any season unless such player has been a member of such reserve team in at least TWO home-and-home matches during the said season.

JUNIORS

A player who has been a member of a senior or reserve team in more than five matches during any season shall be ineligible for inclusion in a junior team taking part in a semi-final, final or grand-final match in the SAME SEASON UNLESS he has been a member of the junior team for more than five matches in the same season.

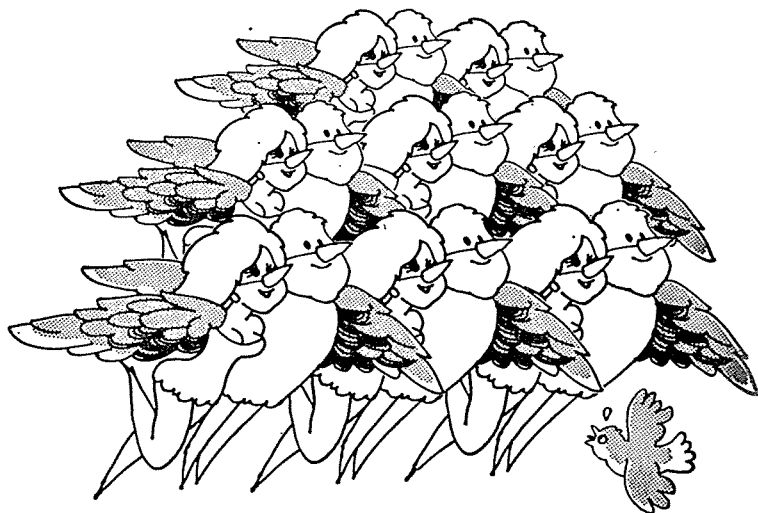

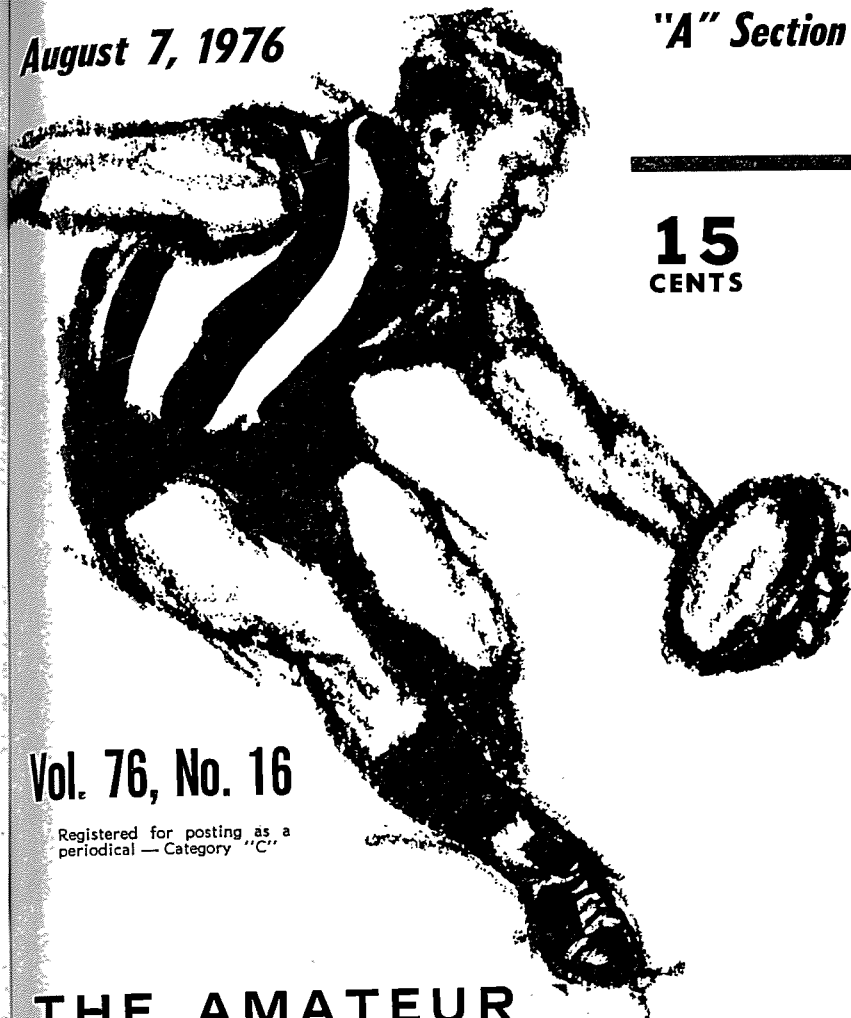
