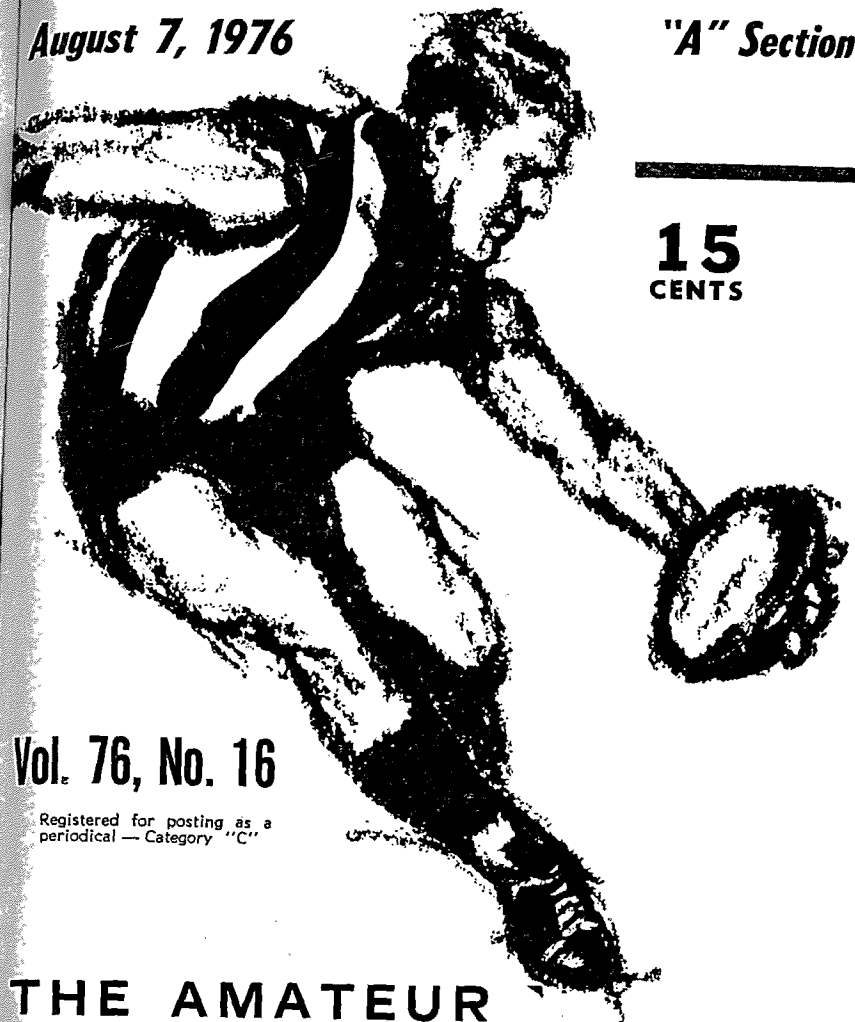

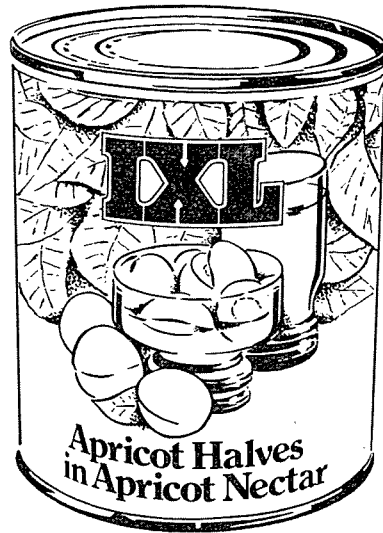

LAST WEEK'S HIGHLIGHTS

North Swamp St. Bernard's at Finish BLUES' ALL-THE-WAY WIN OVER "DE LA" "GIANT-KILLERS" PARADE DOWN MARCELLIN

North Old Boys established themselves as clear leaders when they finished all over St. Bernard's last Saturday and won by more than eight goals.

University Blues' pace and teamwork and marking ability proved too much for De La Salle, who were never in it all day and went down by 68 points.

St. Bernard's and De La Salle both suffered a big drop in percentage — St. Bernard's going down by 7.7% and "De La" by 8%.

Old Paradians continued in their newly-acquired role of "giant-killers", toppling the leaders, Marcellin, by 16 points. The previous week they knocked Caulfield Grammar off the top rung, when they scored by five points.

Their win over Marcellin, and Ivanhoe's defeat at Geelong, has settled the four in B Section.

St. Bernard's led North by 2 goals after a tight first half, but North's greater determination and improved teamwork enabled them to take charge after the interval and they kicked 9-11 to nothing in the last quarter.

University Blacks surprised Old Trinity in the first half and led by 6 goals at the interval, but Trinity's

sound third term of 7-5 to a scoreless Blacks, carried them to a 20-point win.

Ormond's overall strength, particularly in key forward positions, was too much for Coburg, who never recovered from Ormond's 8-goal burst in the second quarter.

Reservoir Old Boys also kicked 8 goals in the second term to lead Monash Blues by 15 points at half-time. Then Reservoir kicked 4-1 against the wind to Monash's 2-5.

Monash hit back in the last quarter as Reservoir tired and added 5 goals, but Reservoir held on to score by 15 points.

Kew caused an upset when they beat Old Melburnians by 20 points and Parkside overwhelmed Hamp-

FROM THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

In the Amateur Footballer, issue No. 23 Dec./Jan. issue, the 1976 behavioural pattern for the V.A.F.A. was spelt out loud and clear, by the Secretary of the Association, and repeated in the first regular issue on the 24th April 1976.

The Presidents and Secretaries were clearly advised of the policy at their Annual pre-season Dinner. The members were given the same message at both pre-season meetings of the Association, yet it can be safely said that the behavioural pattern for 1976 in a large number of clubs, has been the worst on record.

Well, the result is now being felt by clubs who obviously believed that they were immune from the normal and accepted behavioural requirements of their Association, and as such have found themselves with large fines to be paid for the misdemeanours that members, either playing or non-playing, have involved their clubs in, since the start of the season.

The following are the results of investigations, carried out by the Investigation Sub-Committee, and ratified in full by the Executive Committee.

Bulleen-United. Fined the sum of \$150, for unacceptable behaviour.

Charges were heard against Coburg Club of conduct unbecoming a member.

Finding. Charges against Club proved. (See below). Penalties imposed:— player Sim suspended for 6 matches.

The offence proved against Coburg Club in that they were satisfied that Coburg players were at visitors' changing rooms, that a Coburg player did push S. Balderstone (Monash Juniors Team Manager) in the chest and threatened him and imposed a fine of \$200 to be paid by 14th August, 1976.

Report of brawl at half time of game between Hampton Rovers and Alphington on 12th June, 1976. C Section.

Both members found guilty of conduct unbecoming a member.

Alphington fined \$250.00 — to be paid by 31 August, 1976.

Hampton Rovers fined \$300.00 — to be paid by 31st August, 1976.

Player: G. Gale of Alphington suspended for 2 weeks.

Report of AJAX officials by Umpire Cunneen during match on 19th June against Brunswick.

Finding:— Guilty on both charges.

pipped St. Kevin's by a point, the same margin by which Footscray Tech beat Thornbury.

There were only three sections in which all of the top four teams won their matches — F Section, Junior Section 2 and E Reserve Section.

AJAX Club fine of \$100 on each count, with amount of \$200 to be paid by 31st July.

Report of Old Xaverians runner, J. Rush for misconduct at three-quarter time interval in match against AJAX on 12th June, and also in last quarter of match.

Finding:— Guilty on both charges. Old Xaverians fined \$50 on first charge, \$100 on second charge, with total of \$150.00 to be paid by 31st July.

Report from game Old Carey v St. Kilda C.B.O.C. on 12th June, 1976.

(i) Boundary umpire T. Dankert of St. Kilda C.B.O.C. for striking an Old Carey player.

(ii) replacement runner, V. Laccaro for disputing decision.

Finding:— Guilty on both charges. Fined \$100 on each charge, total of \$200 to be paid by 31st July, and both Dankert and Laccaro disqualified from holding an official position for balance of season 1976.

There are several matters being investigated by the sub-committee set up for this purpose, and heavier penalties can confidently be expected when these matters are finalized.

Despite the pre-season shortage of umpires, the "great concern" and letters of real, (and yet not followed), advice handed out to the Executive Committee by numerous clubs, who have since proven to be amongst the problem clubs, had to be read to be believed, in the light of their subsequent behaviour. Umpires have had to "put up" with conditions completely foreign to that required and demanded in the V.A.F.A. and which will NOT be tolerated.

Incidents behind the play, the unacceptable behaviour of spectators, the lack of interest of officials in these matters, (for nothing, in numerous instances is done to either curb or prevent situations that arise or could be prevented,) has to be seen to be believed.

Dirty and foul language is quite audible from players, and spectators alike, at any and certainly most matches that are played.

The swilling of intoxicating liquor by spectators and reserve section players during the playing of senior section games, has gone far beyond what will be tolerated, and in the light of instruction on this matter in particular, clubs who fail to control this behaviour alone, can expect harsh treatment, if found

PREVIEWING TODAY'S GAMES

A SECTION

Yet another poor tally of winners — thanks to a couple of unreliable teams who shall retain their anonymity.

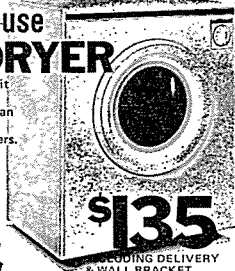

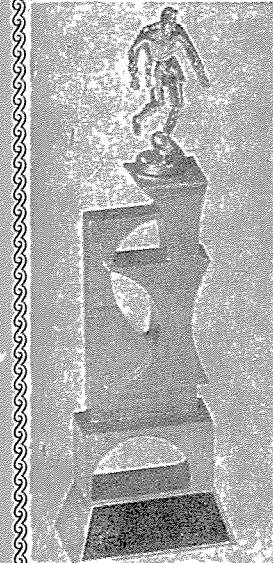

NO "INVASION" AT ¾ - TIME

At the meeting of the Australian Amateur Football Council held in Adelaide during the Carnival last month, the following Rules were adopted:—

(1) The Coach may address players at the Quarter-time interval for a period not exceeding three minutes.

No other persons are permitted to enter the playing arena except the 19th and 20th men, and one Trainer or Medical Officer if called for by the Coach.

(2) The same procedure will apply at Three-quarter-time except that the time may be extended to not more than five minutes and one extra person may take drinks and/or oranges etc. on to the playing arena for the players.

These Rules will apply immediately.

Leading goalkickers in "A" Section was Duncan Anderson (Univ. Blues) 78, followed by Sam Birtles (Hampton Rovers) 38, Easton (B'wick) 35, Evan Macgregor (Ormond) 31, and Manson Rusel (Old Scotch) 25.

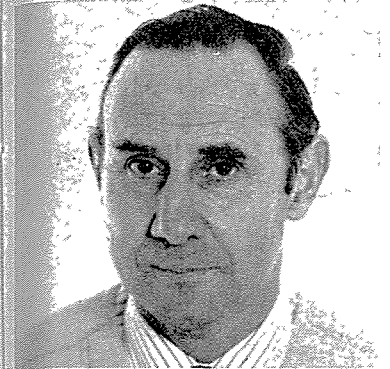
UMPIRE'S CORNER

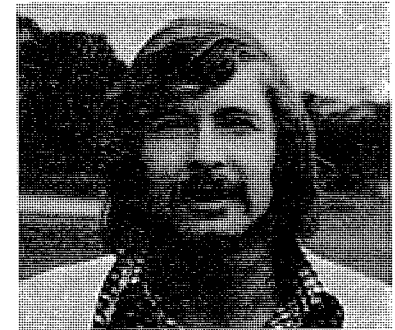

ELIGIBILITY OF PLAYERS FOR RESERVE AND JUNIOR SECTION FINALS

The attention of clubs is drawn to the restrictions which apply concerning players eligible to take part in Final matches in the Reserve and Junior Sections.

The Rule relating to eligibility of players in Reserve Section Finals reads:—

A player who has been a member of a senior team of any club in nine or more matches during the home-and-home matches in any season shall not be eligible for inclusion in the reserve team of a club taking part in a final match in the same season unless both the senior and reserve teams are participating in a final match on the same day. Provided that no player shall be elig-

ible for inclusion in a reserve team taking part in a final match in any season unless such player has been a member of such reserve team in at least TWO home-and-home matches during the said season.

JUNIORS

A player who has been a member of a senior or reserve team in more than five matches during any season shall be ineligible for inclusion in a junior team taking part in a semi-final, final or grand-final match in the SAME SEASON UNLESS he has been a member of the junior team for more than five matches in the same season.

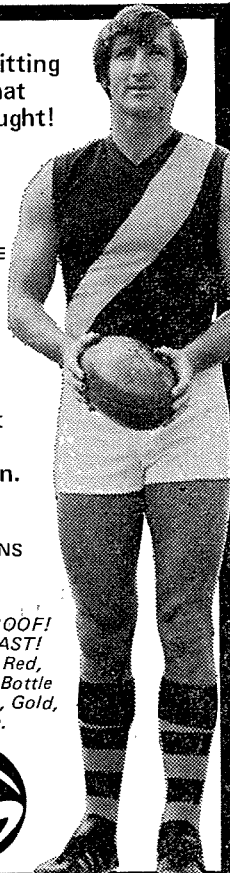

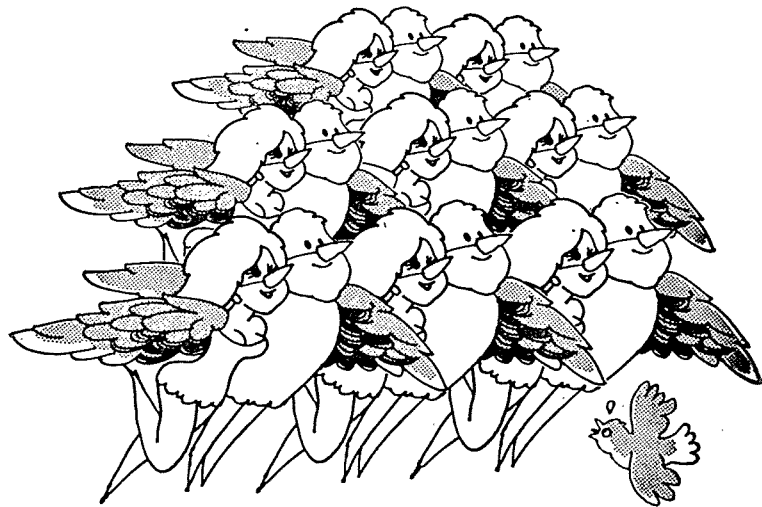

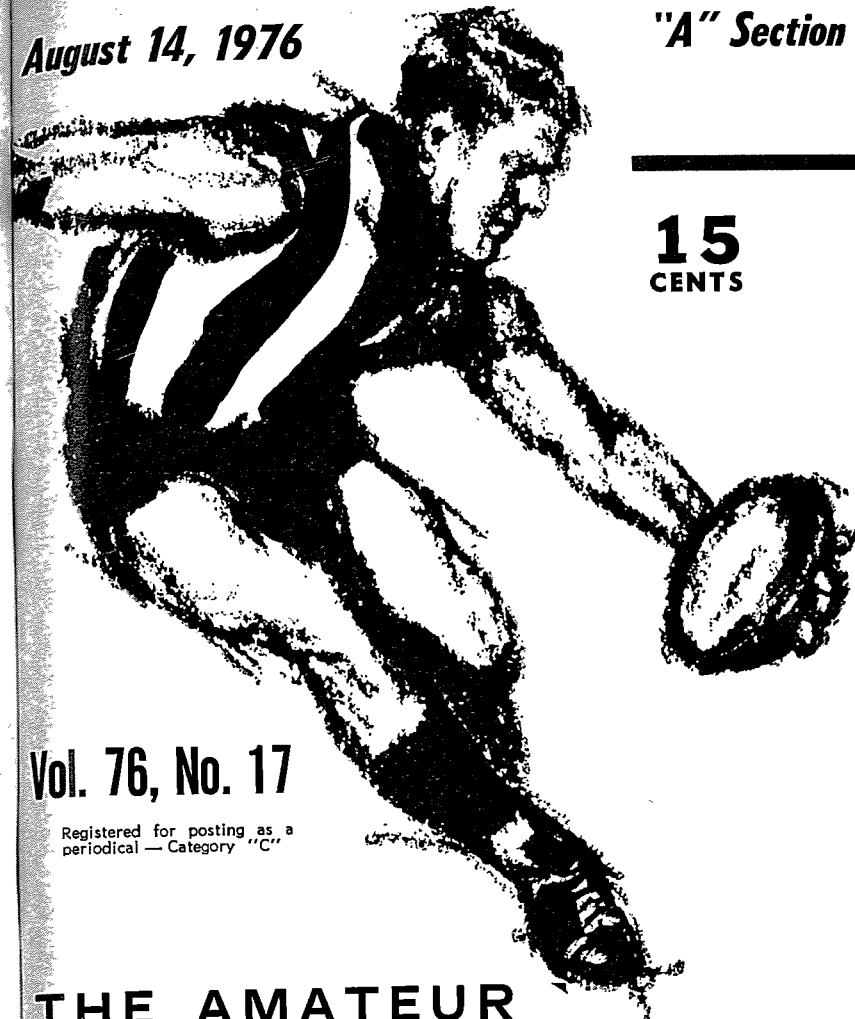
