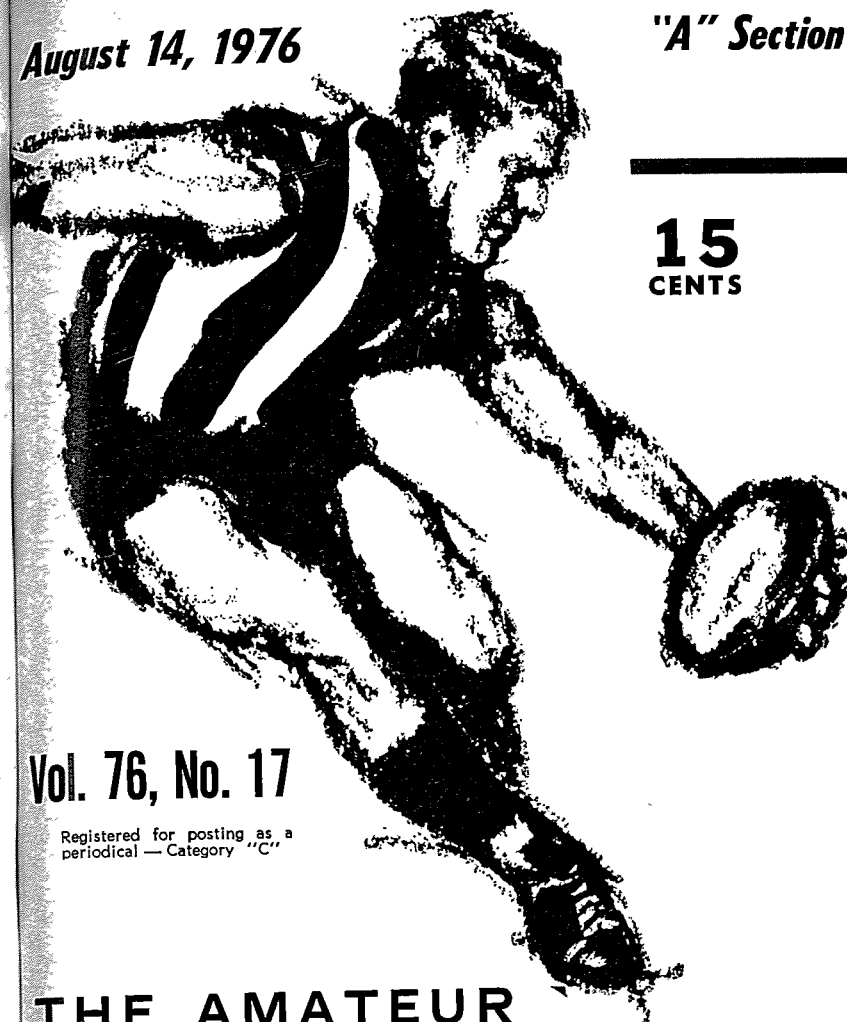

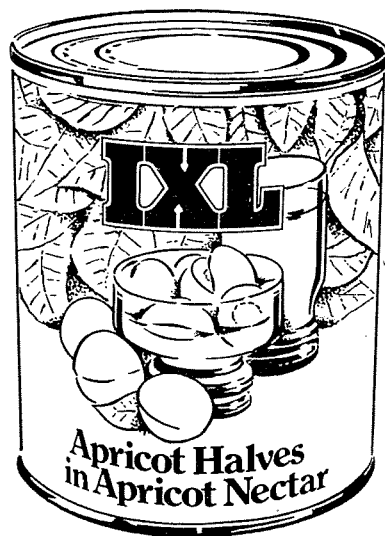

DE LA SALLE TOPPLE NORTH BLUES, TRINITY, ORMOND STILL FIGHT FOR 4th PARADE BEATEN AT IVANHOE

De La Salle staged a reversal of form to topple the leaders, North Old Boys, in another day of upsets last Saturday.

Or was it North who staged a reversal of form, for they never really looked like winning? But "De La" had been badly beaten in their two previous games.

North were only one of five leading teams to be beaten — the others were Parkside, La Trobe Blacks, De La Salle Reserves and Elsternwick Reserves.

With only two rounds to be played before the finals, very few "fours" are settled. In A Section, University Blues, Old Trinity and Ormond are still battling it out for fourth place.

De La Salle outplayed North in the first half to establish a lead of almost 8 goals at the interval and left North trailing by more than 12 goals at the last change.

North finished strongly, but the gap was much too big and they went down by 8 goals.

Old Trinity were slow to get going against Reservoir Old Boys, who led by 20 points at half-time, but they didn't get much say in the proceedings after that and Trinity won by 20 points.

Ormond's 9-goal burst in the second quarter ended any hopes Monash may have had of avoiding relegation, and University Blues kicked 9 goals in the third term to be easy winners over the Blacks,

while Coburg put up a poor showing against St. Bernard's.

After beating two leading teams, Caulfield and Marcellin, in successive weeks, Old Paradians went down by 6 goals against Ivanhoe, and Caulfield held on to beat Marcellin by 8 points.

Parkside crashed at Fawkner, who won by more than 7 goals, and poor kicking by Old Haileybury enabled Uni. High to beat them by 7 points.

National Bank scored their first win, beating Brunswick by 20 points, and State Bank beat Assumption by 7, in a low-scoring game.

Old Mentonians beat La Trobe Blacks by 2 points, and North Brunswick surprised with a 16-

point win over ANZ Bank. The top four in F Section all won, the only section to do so, but La Trobe Reds blunted Bulleen United's hopes when they won by a point.

There was another 1-pointer, the Reserves — Power House counting for Old Ivanhoe by the margin.

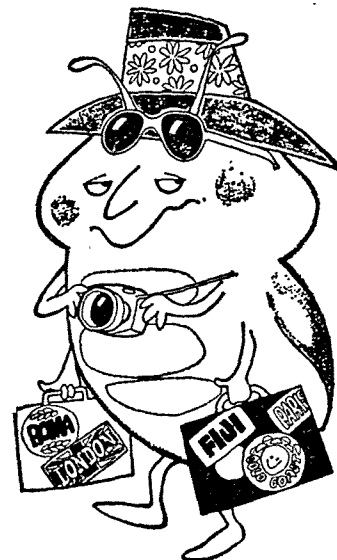

Ron says "Jocka" is the best ruckman he has seen in V.A.F.A. ranks — who would disagree?

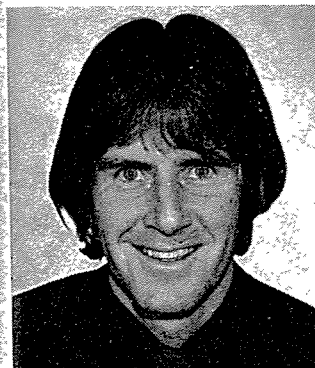

ATTENTION ALL COACHES AND TIMEKEEPERS

As from last Saturday the following instructions have been given to all umpires.

It is the DUTY of the team coach and timekeepers to assist umpires in this matter.

(a) An interval of not more than three minutes shall be allowed between the finish of the first quarter and the start of the second quarter. During this time the coach shall be allowed to address his players.

Such address to be given close to the boundary. Drinks are not to be taken during this break.

(b) The time between the end of the second quarter and the start of the third quarter shall not be more than 15 minutes.

(c) The break at threequarter time shall not be more than five minutes.

(d) The only persons allowed on the playing area during any break will be the coach, the team manager, the drink steward (at threequarter time).

(e) If a doctor, medical man or trainer is required to attend a player during any break in play he may be called by the coach.

It is up to the coach and timekeepers to assist the umpire in this matter.

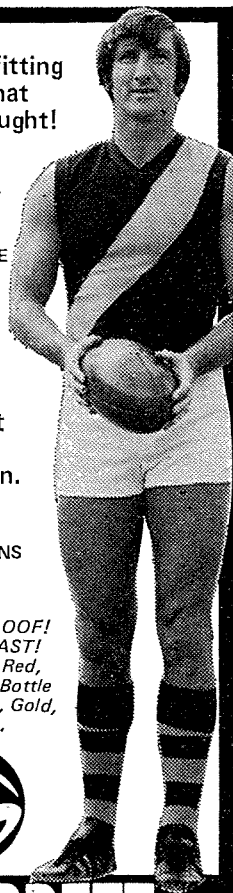

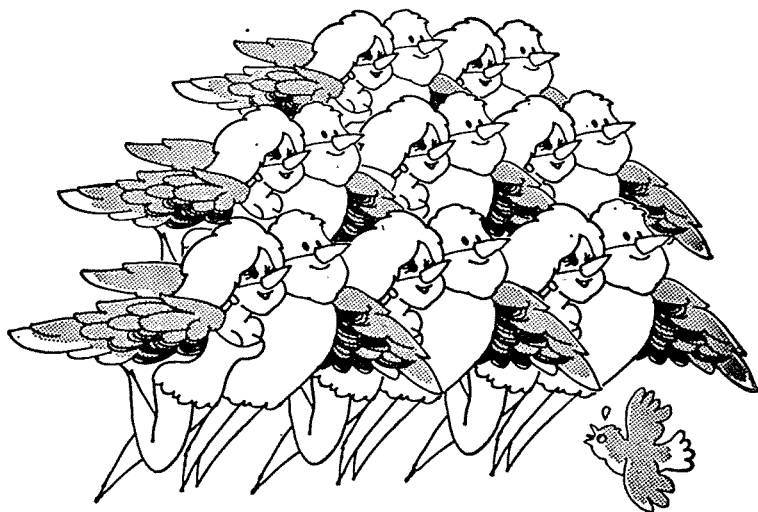

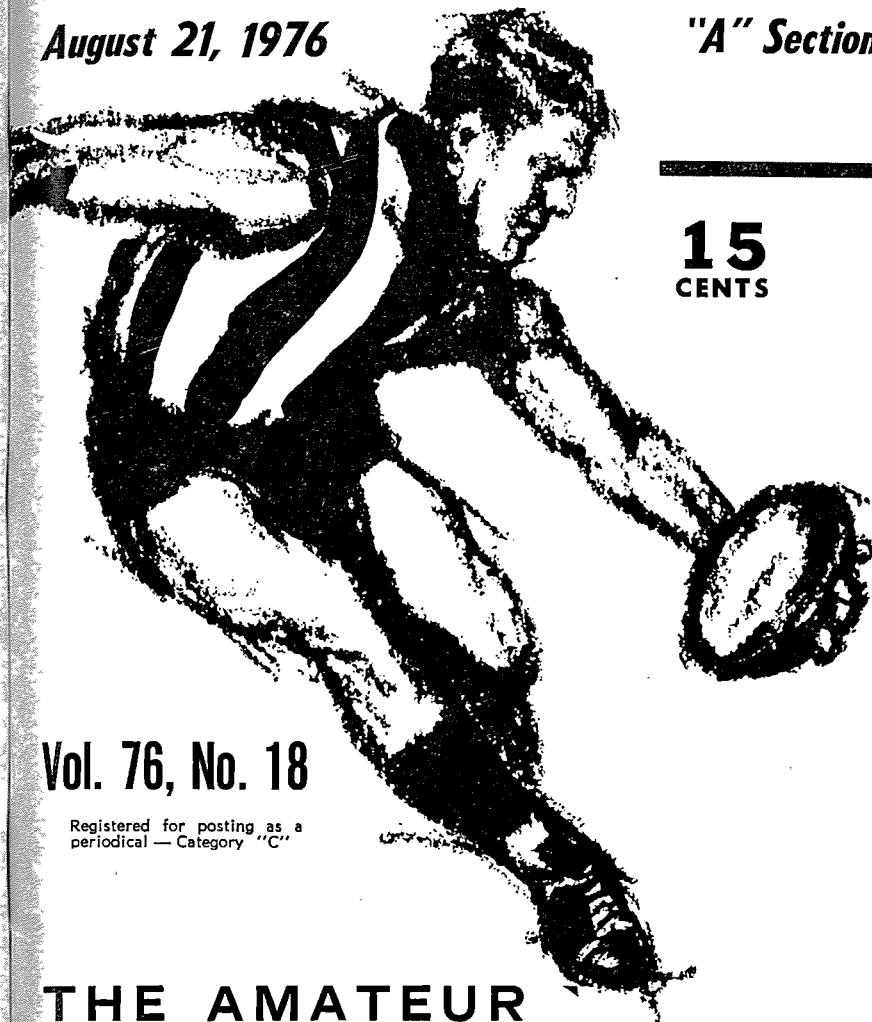
