

11 SECTIONS STILL NOT DECIDED OLD TRINITY IN, BUT CAN THEY HOLD IT? ORMOND THRASH ST. BERNARD'S

The last round of home-and-home matches will be played today and in only three of the 14 Sections is the final four settled — B, D and F Sections. In many cases there are still six teams in the running, including the top grade.

win at Geelong, but kicked shockingly.


They finished with 10-29, but





Lowest scoring team for the round was A.N.Z. Bank's 2.1.(13) against O.G.G.'s 14.14(98) in D Section.




"Stick" started with our Juniors when they re-formed in 1963. He was Vice-Captain of the Juniors in that year, but also had his first taste of senior football


