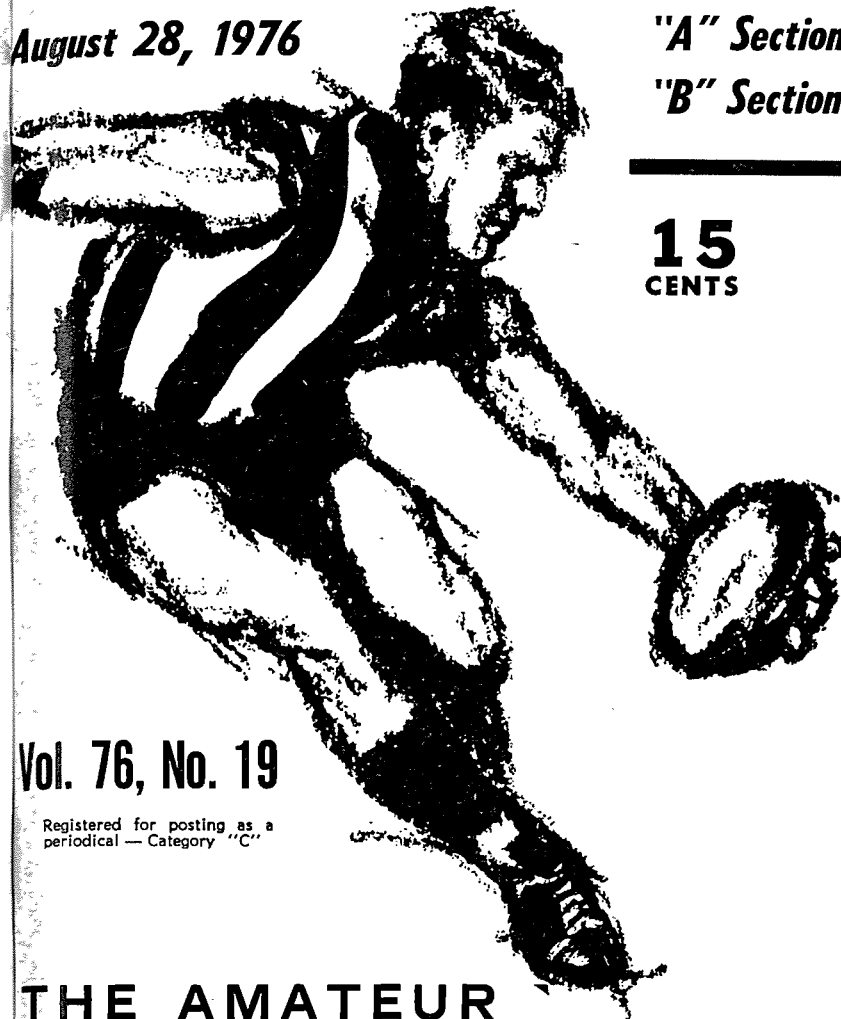

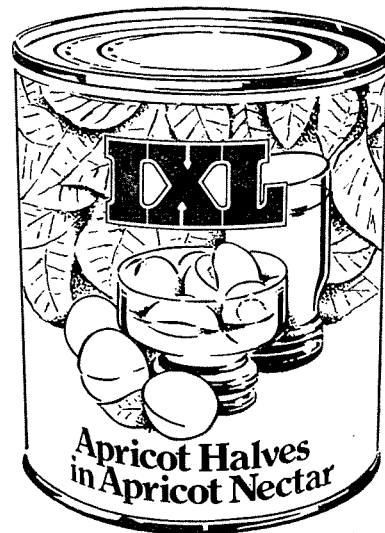

Blues Back in Four, "De La" Second

CAULFIELD FAIL AGAINST IVANHOE

FIVE EQUAL TOP IN C SECTION

University Blues regained their place in the final four, thanks to Ormond's big win over Old Trinity, who had displaced the Blues the week before.

De La Salle beat St. Bernard's by 22 points at Elsternwick and held on to second place, with the possible double chance.

Caulfield Grammarians put up a dismal showing at Ivanhoe where the home side beat them by more than 14 goals. This defeat cost Caulfield top place, which went to Old Scotch on percentage.

The situation in C Section must be unique — five teams finished level at the top of the list — with Hampton Rovers still the "odd man out". Fancy finishing the season equal first and not playing in the finals!

St. Bernard's started well, kicking 9 goals with the wind in the first quarter, but De La Salle gradually wore them down. It was "De La's" fine defensive football in the third term, when they held their opponents to one goal, that won it for them, coupled with the fact that St. Bernard's failed to score in the second quarter.

This was St. Bernard's third defeat in four matches.

Ormond gained a winning lead over Old Trinity in the first half and went on to score easily.

Old Paradians lost their third in a row when they went down by 8 goals to Old Scotch.

Old Ivanhoe "pipped" Old Haileybury by a point to send them tumbling from first to fourth, and Assumption beat Old Xaverians by a similar margin.

ANZ Bank's big win over AMP Society enabled them to chop

Heatherton out of fourth place on percentage, and Old Mentonians, badly beaten by St. Kevin's, gave up second place to them.

Footscray Tech. were overwhelmed by West Brunswick but retained their place in the four.

Coburg's hopes of making the Junior Section four crumbled when they crashed badly against North Old Boys. In any case, Ivanhoe won easily to hold their place.

Caulfield Grammar easily beat Geelong to remain in the Section 2 four.

Defeats to Melbourne High, Old Xaverians and AMP Society cost them their places in the respective Reserve Sections.

And so 84 of the 140 teams have packed up until next season, and the 14 losers of today's First Semi-Finals will join them in the "moth-ball fleet".

UMPIRE'S CORNER

The turnover of umpires over the past few seasons has indeed been very high, no longer do we get the men prepared to stay in the business for 15 or 20 years.

From our complete list of 1972, only 21 umpires are still with us which means of course that the majority of our men, are still really inexperienced.

It takes at least three seasons for an umpire to become experienced enough to handle top class games — in most cases the apprenticeship is closer to five years — (you can't put an old head on young shoulders).

Reasons for this turnover are many and varied — work pressure, family commitments and studies, appear to be the main reasons, although a few "recruits" are not really dedicated and find the training and Saturday afternoon something they just can't accept.

Football umpiring is not an easy life and one must have plenty of "grit" to survive.

Although it is a tough aspect of our game it is still most rewarding — it is a side of football which is involved for the entire length of the game.

The umpire is completely involved — whereas the player is really only "in the game" for a small part of it.

The football umpire probably suffers more disappointments than any other sportsman, yet, I am quite sure these are more than compensated for by the "good things" — the days when you go well — the many friendships made with fellow umpires, players and officials — friendships that last a lifetime.

Yes, being an umpire in the V.A.F.A. is really worth it!

With the finals series now being played it is worth a reminder to all players that field, boundary and goal umpires are supplied from our own

body and so have the power to report any misdemeanors. (This of course does not apply in the odd case where a club umpire is officiating.)

With the finals in view, training over the past few weeks has been increased, with the accent on speed — a couple of weeks ago John and myself clocked most of the umpires over a dash of 100 metres; some of the times were exceptionally fast, and all of them being quicker than we had really expected.

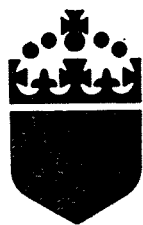

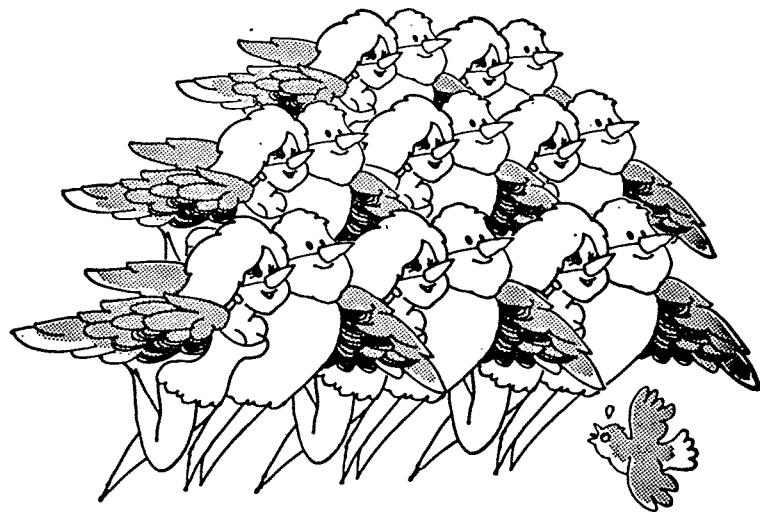

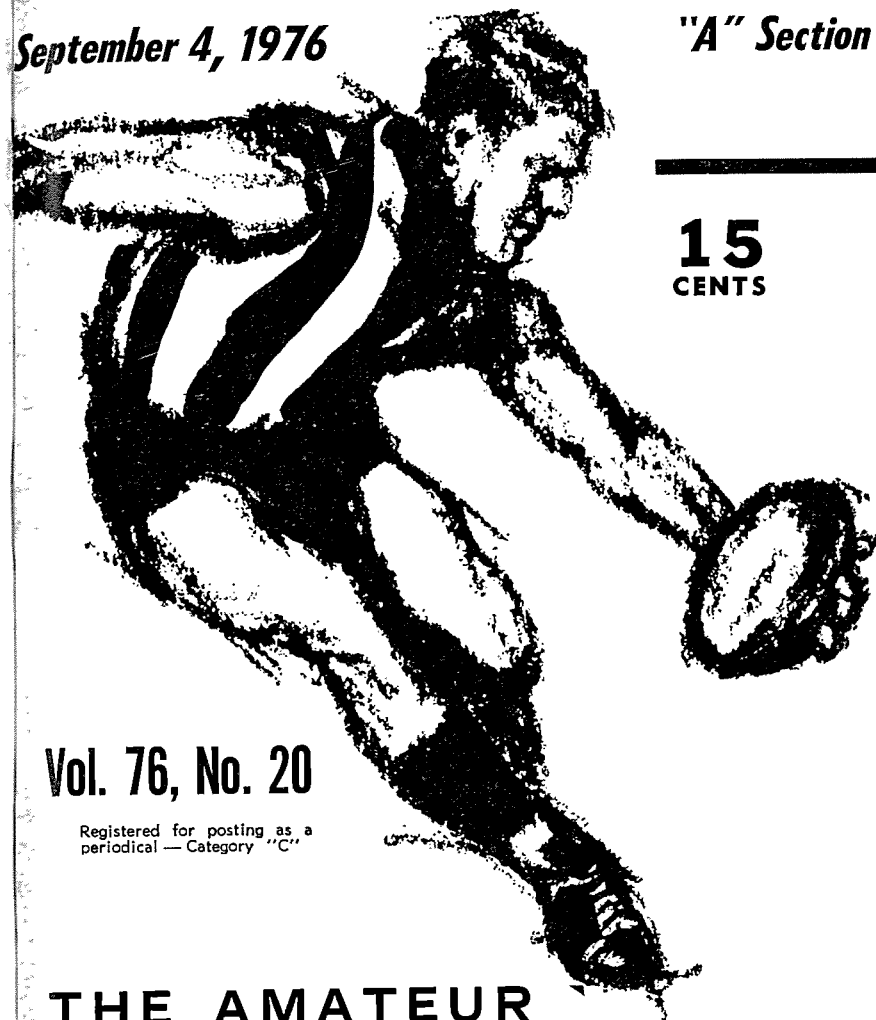
