



RealFruit Preserves Blues Crash — St. Bernard's Win Easily

CLOSE CALL FOR MARCELLIN PROMOTION FOR O.M.'s, XAV's, ST. KEVIN'S, WEST BRUNSWICK, ST. BERNARD'S JUNIORS

University Blues collapsed in the second half of the First Semi-final against St. Bernard's last Saturday, and were beaten by nine goals.

Marcellin did not have things all their own way against Old Paradians. who were 16 points in front during the third quarter, but tired in the

Old Melburnians, Old Xaverians, St. Kevin's and West Brunswick together with St. Bernard's Juniors, winners of their respective Second Semi-finals, gain promotion to a higher section next season.

The Blues started well against the light breeze and led an inaccurate St. Bernard's by two points at quarter-time, and although they had most of the play in the second term, they spoilt their efforts with ineffective handball and short-passing which caused them to break down on the forward

On their play, the Blues should have been goals ahead at the interval but instead they were 11

points down.

St. Bernard's took charge in the third quarter when their forwards were given far too much latitude by a loose Blues' defence and they raced away to a lead of 38 points, and were in a commanding position at the last change.

The Blues couldn't make any impression in the last term and ended a disappointing display with a

deficit of nine goals.

Old Paradians showed great improvement on recent form and worried Marcellin, but Parade tired in the last quarter and were beat-

en by 11 points.

Old Haileybury's slightly more accurate kicking gave them a 16-point win over Fawkner and Old Melburnians trounced Parkside to the tune of 104 points, kicking a mammoth 29-22 (196) to Parkside's 14-8 (92).

Old Camberwell continued their great form with a 16-goal win from Assumption, but Old Xaverians sneaked home by a point from AJAX.

ANZ Bank came from behind to score a surprise win over Old Mentonians and in another close one, St. Kevin's got up to beat LaTrobe Blacks by five points.

The more accurate Beverley Hills beat Footscray Tech. by two goals and West Brunswick continued their unbeaten run with a

There were a couple of form reversals in the Juniors — North Old Boys crushed Monash University, although Monash had beaten them by 14 points a fortnight pre-viously. But the biggest upset was St. Bernard's defeat of Thomastown. In the last home-and-home match Thomastown won by more than 13 goals, but kicked themselves out of it last week — 13-23 to St. Bernard's 16-9 - and were beaten by four points.

In the other Junior games, University Blues beat Ivanhoe and Old Paradians scored over Caulfield

Grammar.

There were some close games in the Reserves — North Brunswick beat ANZ Bank by seven points and Beverley Hills beat University Reds by three. Fawkner thrashed Old Haileybury, who had won both games during the season, and Elsternwick had a big win over Assumption.



However, **Old Scotch** would do well to reflect that this doubtful player situation may well inspire. Caulfield to win at all costs so as to gain a week's rest before the big one.

In previewing this game I am disregarding the last round performance by Caulfield as they had many out and very little incentive to win.

But what of the teams.

Scotch are very even but have one line of weakness that being the half back line, although I have been told that Nicholls will do his job.

Caulfield on the other hand, even without the possibility of injury are experiencing three areas of concern, the wings, the roving and the full back position.

The centre-line duel overall should go Scotch's way with King, Tallent and maybe Marx or Brown too talented for Caulfield's trio although the well deserved best and fairest Tony Lester will be a headache for Tallent.

Caulfield are happy with the form of John Long at Centre half back and Watson and Clark on the flanks and the fact that Boh MacDonald can be spared to fill another weakness.

Scotch rely on a changing forward pattern with Sherwen, Cox, Mason, Brown and Anderson and this should test Caulfield's defence.

At Caulfield's end, doubt exists about brilliant full forward Butcher but **Greg Tootell** as permanent forward pocket will take watching. If Butcher does not play don't be surprised if **Buchanan** (ex LaTrobe Uni) gets a bag of goals. He is talented.

If Scotch's half back line can hold **Atchison** and **Fletcher** then Scotch will surely win.

The rucks will be interesting. Griffiths and Morphet, if fit, will

give great drive — but are they fit? Because of this doubt I feel that **Kefford** and maybe **Clark** aided by more skilful rovers **Johnson**, **Marx** and **Melville**, could dictate play.

Having considered all factors Scotch appear to have more players going well where Caulfield have some positional worries plus the dreadful curtain of doubt about fitness. Therefore it must be Scotch.

Such will be the game that I have decided to stay off Alf Keam's vintage reds until after the game as I do not want to forget any of the great passages of play.

However, on the other hand plenty of rough red will be required if Old Scotch win to drown out the conviction by the "Afgan" that he is a man of destiny born to lead teams into A grade. But don't forget Lawrence, Frank Goode was recommended to Caulfield by

Barassi so watch out. Also Ray Walsh from Marcellin does not take kindly to "Men of Destiny".




