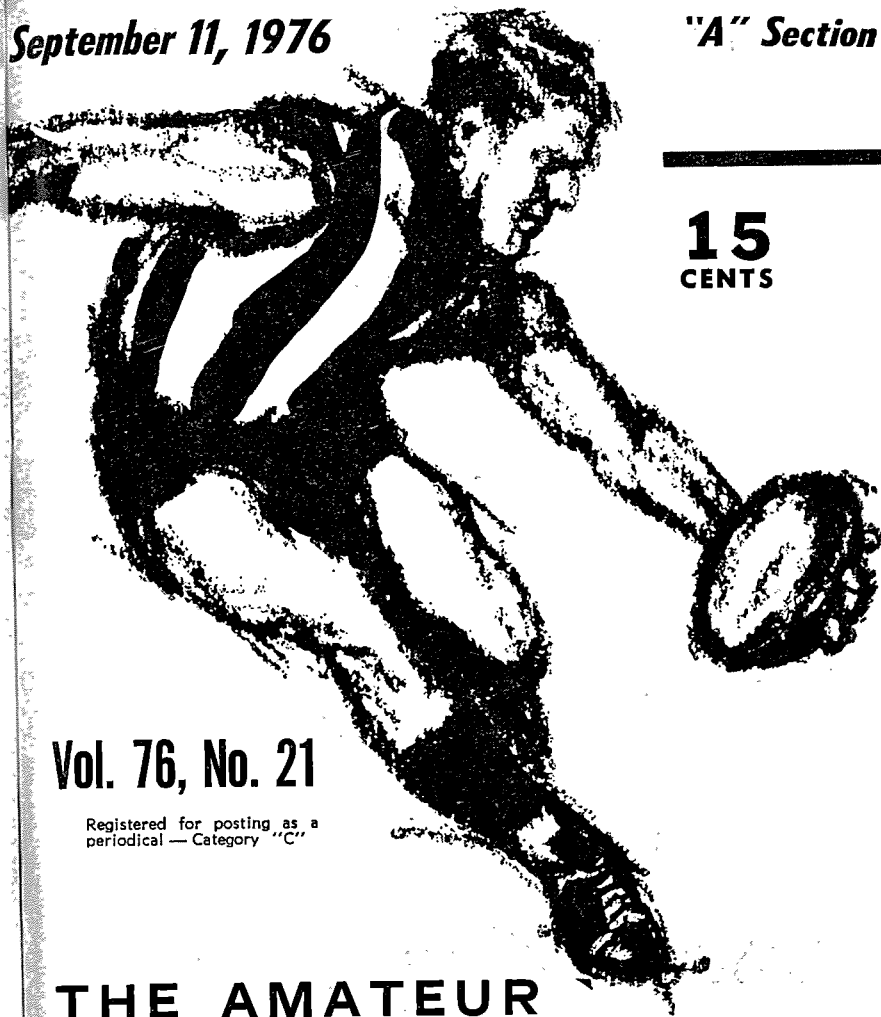

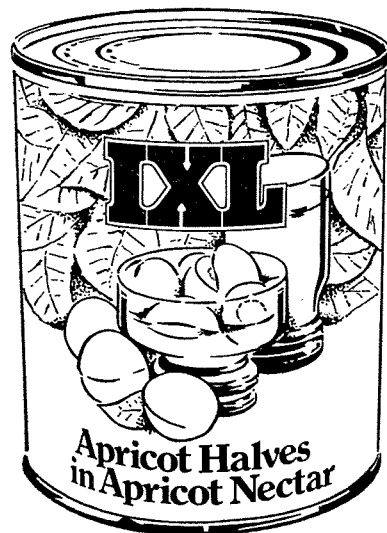

## North's Finish Too Much For "De La" CAULFIELD WIN OVER OLD SCOTCH — BACK TO TOP GRADE

North Old Boys finished all over De La Salle in the Second Semi-final last Saturday and go into their second successive Grand Final. Last year they were runners-up to St. Bernard's.

After a good start, Old Scotch faded against Caulfield Grammarians, who won comfortably and gained promotion back to the top section in 1977.

AJAX, LaTrobe Blacks, Monash University Juniors and Thomastown Juniors, who were beaten in their respective Second Semi-finals a fortnight ago, won their Finals and contest the Grand Finals today, but Parkside and St. Bede's were not so fortunate.

North showed much more purpose in attack than De La Salle, whose lack of co-ordination on the forward line and poorly directed handball cost them many scoring opportunities, especially with the strong wind.

De La Salle fumbled a lot more than their opponents and missed many uncontested chest marks.

North are usually slow beginners but such was not the case last week and they were only two goals behind at quarter-time.

"De La" did better against the wind and were still well in it when they trailed by only 10 points at the interval, but ruined their chances in the third quarter, which they finished a point down.

They held North well in the early part of the last term, but then North cut loose with a burst that gave them eight goals for the quarter and they ran out easy winners.

Old Scotch kicked six goals in the first quarter against Caulfield,

but Caulfield came back to lead by two points at half-time.

The third quarter was even with Caulfield eight points up at the last change but they finished too strongly and were winners by nearly six goals.

Old Haileybury had little difficulty in disposing of Parkside, who went down by nearly eight goals, and St. Bede's were no match for Beverley Hills.

AJAX fought back from a 21-point deficit at half-time to go on and beat Old Camberwell by 14 points and LaTrobe Blacks were too strong for ANZ Bank.

In the Junior games, Monash University beat University Blues by three goals and Thomastown overwhelmed Old Paradians.

The only really close game was that between Beverley Hills and West Brunswick Reserves, with Beverley Hills scoring by three points.

# UMPIRE'S CORNER

As each week the umpires are told by coaches — players and spectators how to umpire, today I am taking the liberty to air my own views on how to play football in some of the most important positions on the field.

The full forward's main purpose is to kick goals and to assist in the scoring of as many goals as possible.

He should be a safe strong mark and accurate kick, a good ball player and, as with all members of the team, should be totally unselfish.

An understanding with his other forwards and players afield is essential.

You should know the type of kick they are, whether they turn left or right — can they kick to position under pressure, etc.

Be on the move at all times. A forward who stands still is easy to mind.

Learn to read the play from further upfield. This is essential when leading, as you should be in the front position 90 per cent of the time.

When kicking for goal, aim to place the ball "through" not to the goals.

Be part of as many goals as possible.

Centre line players are two-way players — attacking one moment and defending the next — mainly over the area between the half-forward and half back lines.

Centre play is the pivot of action for the team. Centremen must be fast with the ability to turn both ways at top speed, and sure ball handlers, both in the air and on the ground.

They should practice all the skills at top pace, especially kicking, which must also be accurate.

When opposing defenders have the ball, play close to your opponent, but

when your own defender has the ball, break away to the open space.

Don't crowd your forwards, but if the run of the play does take you to the forward line, return to your position immediately you have disposed of the ball.

A golden rule for full-backs is to "cover your opponent at all times" — discipline yourself to this task.

A top full back must be a good mark and a long kick, and physically strong enough to win the ball from scrimmages and ground play.

Try to position yourself between the flight of the ball and your opponent.

Make the ball your objective — attack it with confidence.

When clearing the ball kick to the flank, and if you have made a dash down field return to your position immediately you have kicked.

Have an understanding with your back pocket players to "cover" for you if you are forced to follow your opponent up field. If unable to mark — punch the ball towards the flank.

# PREVIEWING TODAY'S GAMES

## A SECTION

Whilst neither side is blessed with a "big" ruckman, I cannot see "De La" coping with the spring and agility of St. Bernard's Gavin Mitchell at the centre bounce, as well as his marking around the ground.

Lyons, Groves and the Halasa brothers can be counted upon to battle their hearts out for De La Salle, well supported by fourteen other "desperates".

However, I believe that Wade, Rackham, Drennan, Thompson, Mahoney, Doolan and Aughton will enable St. Bernard's to outgun De La Salle in too many positions and set up a replay of last year's Grand Final. — ALF KEAM.

The big Monash ground plus windy conditions found Parkside wanting against Old Haileybury.

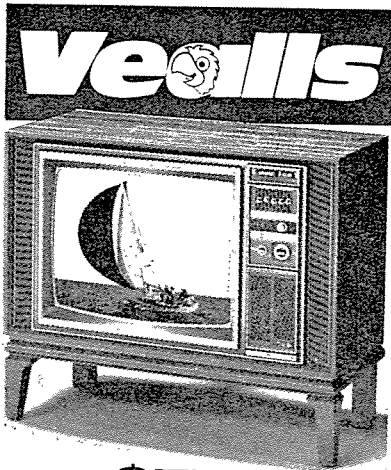
