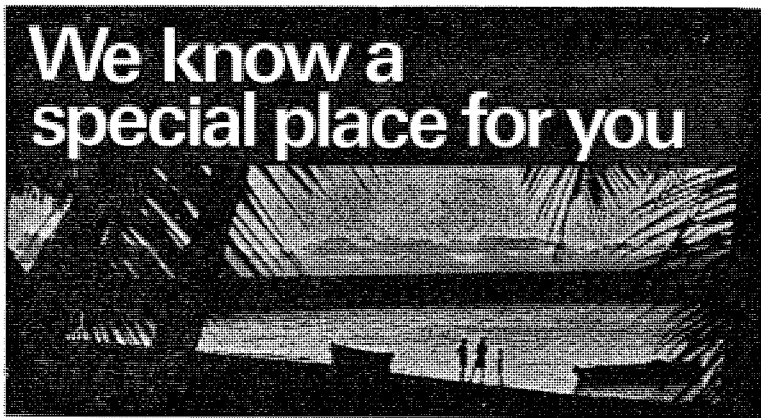

COBURG NEVER IN IT WITH ORMOND CAULFIELD TOO POWERFUL FOR NORTH Two Drawn Games

Ormond showed that their 1971 premiership win was no fluke when they completely outclassed a very disappointing Coburg to romp home easy winners by 98 points.

After a couple of narrow escapes, North Old Boys finally "bit the dust" when they went down by more than eight goals to Caulfield Grammarians. There were quite a number of close finishes — including two drawn games and nine matches decided by a margin of a goal or less.

Ormond's big win lifted them to top place on the list, level on points with Caulfield, but with a one-tenth per cent better percentage.

Ormond were off the target in the early stages, kicking 2-8 in the first quarter, but they slammed on 7 goals in the second term and left Coburg floundering, 44 points in arrears.

Ormond did practically what they liked in the second half, in which they added 15-6 (7 goals in the third quarter and 8 in the last). They were well on top in the air and their forward work was much more effective.

Coburg's usual play-on game was never allowed to develop, and they fumbled badly, with excessive use of handball being one of their major faults.

Caulfield began slowly against North but a burst of 8 goals in the second term took them to a 19-point lead, in a somewhat scrambly game.

They won well down their goal-to-goal line and went on to win convincingly, adding another 8 goals in the last quarter for good measure.

De La Salle opened well and held a 4-goal lead over Parade at quarter-time, but Parade kicked 7 goals in the second term to lead narrowly. It was all Parade after that however, as they ran right away to an easy win.

Monash Blues also crashed badly in the second half, after leading St. Bernard's by 28 points at the interval. St. Bernard's got into top gear after

that and put on 11-6 while Monash could manage only 2-2.

Melbourne High and University Blues were evenly matched for three quarters, with the Blues' straighter shooting keeping them just ahead, but High could not cope with the Blues' strong finish, in which they added 7 goals for a comfortable win.

Kew sneaked home from Ivanhoe by 5 points, and Old Trinity's more accurate kicking gave them an exciting 1-point win over University Blacks. They kicked 15-9 to the Blacks' 14-14.

Collegians scored by 15 points against Tooronga-Malvern, and Geelong beat Old Carey by 7 goals, while Old Scotch proved too strong for Uni. High.

Reservoir Old Boys got a bit of a fright from St. Kilda CBC, who did well for a lowly-placed team to run the leaders to 29 points in a high-scoring game. In another high-scorer, Fairfield pipped Old Xaverians by 4 points. Power House, Assumption and National Bank were clear-cut winners of the other games.

In three of the five C Section games, both sides reached the century. Alphington scored a decisive win over La Trobe Blacks, and Old Brighton, despite poor kicking, easily accounted for Hampton Rovers.

Marcellin had only 9 points to spare from ANZ Bank, who have not won a match, but Old Ivanhoe scored a resounding win over AJAX.

La Trobe Reds, who have not yet broken the ice, played a draw with St. Bede's, whose kicking let them down, and Elsternwick beat Monash Whites by 27 points.

In Junior Section games, Old Scotch scored a 3-point win over Power House, but Ormond, Monash and St. Bernard's all had comfortable wins. North Old Boys beat University Blues by 26 points in Section 2, slashing the Blues' percentage from 1074.7 to 489.5. Both had been unbeaten previously. Old Brighton beat Tooronga-Malvern by 5 points, and Beverley Hills did rather better, running National Bank to 29 points.

In the Reserves, Coburg beat Ormond by 10 points, North Old Boys beat Caulfield Grammar by 3 points, Tooronga-Malvern drew with Collegians, Blacks and Geelong easily beat Trinity and Carey respectively, Assumption beat Melburnians by a goal, Fairfield beat Xavier by 8 points, Alphonington beat La Trobe Blacks by 4 points, Marcellin beat ANZ Bank by 2, AJAX went down to Old Ivanhoe, and Monash Whites thrashed Elsternwick.

Immediately you get the ball throw it in. Do not wait for the rucks to get into position, that's their worry — yours is to put the ball into play.

After a goal has been scored, **rush** the ball back to the centre.

Never kick the ball — this is unforgivable.

B. Turner (Glenhuntly) was found guilty of misconduct towards M. Gurfinkel (AJAX) and suspended for four matches.

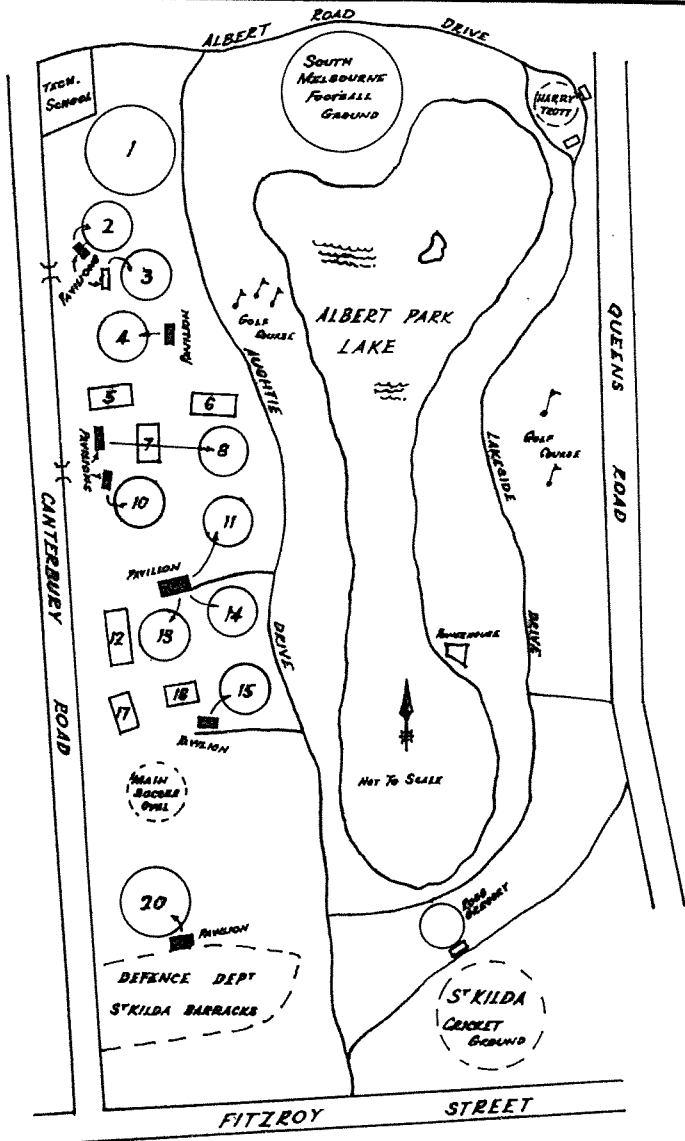
