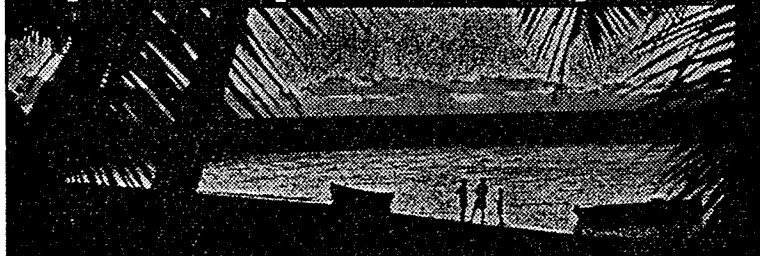

CARNIVAL TIME COMES AROUND AGAIN

THE SQUARE IS "IN"

The Final Four Stays

Once again it is Carnival Year in Amateur football, and the twelfth Australian Amateur Football Carnival will be staged at the Melbourne Cricket Ground in July.

The "Square", that somewhat controversial figure in football circles, has been adopted, and will operate immediately.

There has been no change to the Final Four, and the same system of playing the finals that has operated since the introduction of the Page system many years ago, will continue to be used.

Victoria will be out to avenge the defeat suffered in the last Carnival at Perth in 1970, when South Australia took the honours.

It was perhaps a lucky Carnival for the South Australians, who scraped home by only three points from West Australia on the opening day.

Then they held off Victoria in a desperate finish to win by eight points. Victoria paid the penalty for allowing South Australia to build up a big lead in the early part of the game.

That was three years ago — but we must not forget that South Australia proved much too good in the Interstate game at Adelaide last season, when Victoria went down by 31 points.

The advantage of playing at home could be a help to Victoria, but the players chosen to represent this State must remember that a big improvement will be necessary to keep the West Australian Trotting Association trophy in Melbourne for the next three years.

Victoria has won nine of the eleven Carnivals already played, the only other loss also being to South Australia, in 1948, and also in Perth.

And while talking about the Carnival — it cannot be stressed too strongly, even at this early stage, that it is

absolutely imperative that we have a large attendance, especially on the Saturday — July 14th.

Make a note of the date now, make a firm resolution to attend the Carnival matches at the Melbourne Cricket Ground, and make a resolution to take your friends along.

You, and they, will see the cream of Amateur footballers from the four Amateur bodies — South Australia, Tasmania, West Australia and Victoria — in action.

And if you can manage to go along to the weekday matches on Tuesday, July 10th, and Thursday, July 12th, so much the better. We'll be very pleased to see you there.

THE SQUARE

The Rule relating to the square is fully explained by Kevin McKay, in Umpires' Corner this week. It is suggested that you read it carefully to familiarise yourself with its provisions.

The square, by the way, is different from that suggested and tried in previous years.

The diagonal corners are at approximately centre half-forward and centre half-back positions and the other corners are on the wings, level with the centre circle.

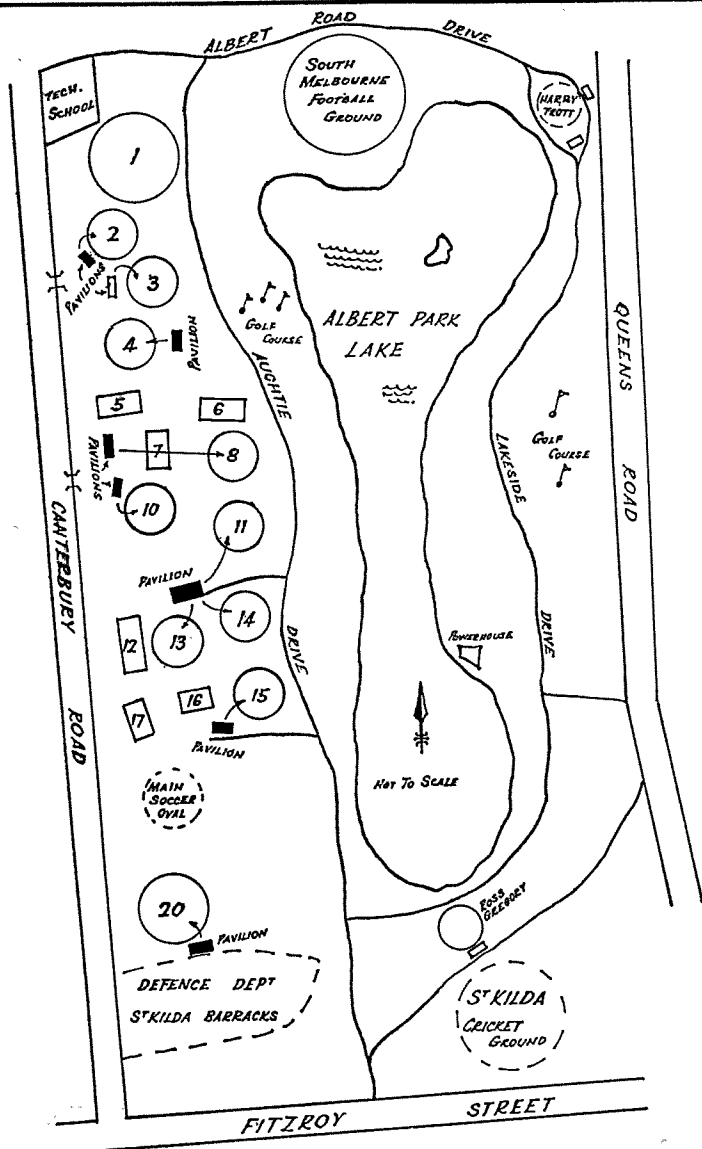

IMPORTANT NOTES

CONCERNING PERMITS AND RE-REGISTRATIONS

Club Secretaries are reminded that all applicants for permits who have played with League or Association first or second XVIIIIs and certain Country Leagues must appear before the Permit Committee.

The Club Secretary should ring the Chairman of the Permit Committee, Mr. F. H. Coldrey, at 92-4797, to ascertain the date and place of Permit Committee meetings.

While on the subject of permits, it might be as well to remind club officials that they should check all permit forms before lodging them with the V.A.F.A., to ensure that they are fully completed and in order.

Any form which is not complete will be returned to the club concerned. Similarly, any form marked X indicating where the player should sign will also be returned.

If an applicant for a permit has not played with any club previously, he should write NIL in the space provided.

All applications for permits must be submitted on forms which provide for the applicant to complete a statutory declaration as to his amateur status.

Applications for permits must be in the hands of the Records Secretary of the Association, by WEDNESDAY, otherwise they will not be dealt with until the following week.

Clubs with Junior teams are advised to register players who are eligible for the Juniors on a Junior permit form. These players will then be automatically registered and eligible to play with the Seniors and Reserves.

RE-REGISTRATIONS

Re-registration of players should be made on the appropriate form duly completed and signed by the player, or alternatively, lists of players to be re-registered may be submitted on DUPLICATE and in alphabetical order of players' names. Addresses of players must also be included, together with telephone numbers if available.

Lists must be on club letterheads and signed by the Club Secretary.

Any list not complying with this requirement will be returned for correction or completion.

Re-registration of players in the Junior Section must be on the appropriate form, duly completed and signed by the player.

The slip at the foot of permit forms and re-registration forms, which is detached and returned to the club Secretary on granting of the permit (or re-registration) must be completed before the form is lodged.

Permit forms and re-registration forms must be completed and signed in INK; forms filled out in pencil are not acceptable.

ALL NEW PERMITS AND RE-REGISTRATIONS are to be forwarded to the RECORDS SECRETARY,

Mr. Bruce DeLacy, 67 Charman Road, Mentone, 3194 (phone 93-3977). All enquiries regarding the granting of permits or re-registrations must be made to Mr. DeLacy. Enquiries on Saturday mornings should be made not later than 10 a.m.

TEAM LISTS REQUIRED

Clubs which have not yet submitted Team Lists for publication in "The Amateur Footballer" are required to furnish the necessary information immediately so that all lists may be included in the next issue.

CAPTAINS, VICE-CAPTAINS

Clubs whose Team Lists do not show the Captain and Vice-Captain should furnish this information, so that the next issue will be complete.

LITTLE THINGS ALL SHOULD KNOW

1. The lines in front of goal posts are known as the kick-off lines, not the goal square.
2. Time added, is time on, not time off.
3. All clear is the signal, given to the goal umpire — by the field umpire — indicating that the goal umpire is at liberty to decide whether a goal or behind should be recorded.
4. Goal umpires are the sole judges of scores.
5. The ball must be completely over the scoring or boundary line, before a goal or behind is scored, or the ball is out of bounds.
6. When the ball is kicked out of bounds on the full — the player receiving the free kick may bring the ball into play — either by kicking or by hand ball.

RESULTS OF MATCHES

Results of amateur matches are broadcast in the Sporting Sessions of Radio Stations 3LO, (commencing at 6.20 p.m.), 3DB and 3KZ (included in 7 p.m. News) each Saturday evening and from Television Channels ABV-2 and HSV-7. Repeat on 3KZ, 9.30 a.m. Sunday.

Channel 2 also provides quarter-by-quarter scores of A Section matches each Saturday afternoon.

Important Notes (cont.)

TIMEKEEPERS' INSTRUCTIONS

REGARDING "TIME-ON"

"Time-on" must be added (1) when signalled by the Field Umpire and (2) when a goal or behind has been scored. In the case of a goal, take the time from the waving of the flags by the Goal Umpire to the bouncing of the ball in the centre by the Field Umpire and, in the case of a behind, take the time from the waving of the flag to the kick-off.

CORRECT SCORES ESSENTIAL

Clubs are reminded that correct scores must be phoned to the Herald office, otherwise a fine (one dollar) will be incurred.

And remember, too, that scores are incomplete without the points — offending clubs will be fined.

SECTION — PLEASE

Press Correspondents are requested to comply with ALL INSTRUCTIONS in the Notes to Press Correspondents issued to all clubs prior to the Season — including — CLUB NAME and SECTION on every envelope forwarded to The Amateur Footballer.

REPORTS ON UMPIRES GO TO SECRETARY

Club secretaries and team managers are advised that the REPORT ON UMPIRE must be forwarded to the secretary of the V.A.F.A. each week, and NOT to the Editor of The Amateur Footballer.

UMPIRE'S CORNER

"THE CENTRE SQUARE"

A square 45.720 metres shall be marked in white in the centre of the ground; and not more than four players of either side shall enter the square until the ball touches the ground in the act of bouncing the ball by the field umpire.

In the event of a breach of this law, the field umpire shall award a free kick to a player of the opposing side at the centre circle.

The free kick shall be awarded to the player nearest to the field umpire.

The field umpire is the sole judge as to the player nearest to him.

At the start of the match and after each goal has been kicked the boundary umpires shall station themselves at the diagonal corners of the centre square, and if any player, other than the number permitted under the provision of this law, encroaches within the centre square, either or both of the boundary umpires shall indicate such infringement by blowing his whistle and indicating to the field umpire the player who so infringed.

If a player steps on or over the white line he shall be deemed to have infringed.

The boundary umpire shall indicate such infringement to the field umpire

by blowing his whistle and calling the name of the club whose player has infringed.

The field umpire will not bounce the ball until BOTH boundary umpires are in position.

In the event of both boundary umpires sounding their whistles simultaneously, if the offenders are from the same team, the free kick shall be given to an opponent. However, if the offenders are from opposing teams, the field umpire shall then proceed to bounce the ball after allowing players time to take up their positions out of the square, in accordance with the provisions of the centre square.

If the ball is thrown in the air due to heavy conditions, the time the ball leaves the hands of the field umpire is the time players can move into the square.

The CENTRE CIRCLE is the only circle TO BE USED, no matter what the condition of the ground may be.

The spirit of this law is to enable the game to be free of congestion at the centre bounces, thus allowing for the skills of Australian football to be further exemplified.

Boundary umpires must make themselves conversant with their duties in regard to the centre square rule.

Blues), **Maurie Considine** (Old Paradians), **Geoff Paul** (M.H.S.O.B.), **Clive Laidlaw** (Ormond), **Lex Hibbins** (Collegians), **Frank Dunin** (Univ. Blacks), **Peter Rhoden** (Old Xaverians), **Graeme Peck** (Old Melburnians) and **Des Quinn** (Ivanhoe). **Who coached Alphington?**

25 YEARS AGO—1948

The season opened on 24 April — "A" section (10 teams), "B" (10 teams), "C" (8 teams), "D" (7 teams) and "Junior" (9 teams).

University Blacks played Collegians and unfurled their 1947 "A" section pennant.

Hampton Rovers made their first appearance in "A" section. Old Scotch and Melbourne High drew — the Cardinals kicking 9.23, their opponents 11.11.

CLUB HISTORIES — No. 1

Geelong — "A" Section Again After 23 Years

By Jim Fidge — President of Geelong, and Member V.A.F.A. Executive.

Back in 1925 three school masters, all renowned sportsmen, met at Geelong College, and in casual conversation plotted a theory to cater for amateur footballers in Geelong by fielding a football team. This team became known as the **GEELONG AMATEUR FOOTBALL CLUB**.

Those three men, **P. L. Williams**, **K. W. Nicolson** and **V. H. Profitt**, all played vital inaugural roles. Williams advocated affiliation with the then Metropolitan Amateur Football Association; Nicolson's lot was to negotiate this Association's acceptance of the new club, whilst Profitt, a first-class footballer and coach, was to feature prominently as first captain and coach.

On 25th March, 1926, first notice of the Club's formation appeared in the "Geelong Advertiser."

Training will commence on the **Kardinia Oval** on Monday, 29th March, at 4 p.m. All members and those desirous of becoming members are invited to attend. It is necessary that players should get into form as soon as possible as the first fixture is on 1st May, and also as the team has been allocated to "A" Section of the Association . . . "

Ken Nicolson must have spoken well! Another district club had been born. The teams Geelong confronted that year were the University "A," University "B," Old Scotch, Old Melbourne, Old Caulfield Grammarians, Hampton (now Hampton Rovers), Elsternwick, Sandringham, Teachers' College and Murrumbeena.

It took time for the new club to settle down. "B" Section, which has always shadowed its make-up, found

it amid the ranks by 1928, but by 1931 the club had begun to climb — "B" Section Premiers 1931, back in "B" Section from "A" to be champions in 1933, 1933-1936 may still rank as the club's best years, although the vastness of the present-day association may show a parallel with the 1970s.

"A" Section finalists 1934-1936 were prolific years — but no flag. Captain in 1935 and 1936 was **Lindsay Hassett**, later Australia's Test Cricket captain. Hassett was a fine footballer and won the "A" Section best and fairest in both years. The "thirties" was an indelible era, during which the club was inspiringly led by **A. N. (Archie) Shannon**. Mr. Shannon's home was the stately "Kirrewur Court," now an exclusive Reception House. It would appear that Mr. Shannon's magnificent home would ideally be suited for club functions—

The Second World War upset the club, forcing it to abandon. Reforming in 1946, it was back in full swing by 1947. **Bruce Wemyss** (President 1947-1956) was at the helm and it was during these years the **Lamb** family became a household word in club affairs. **Jack Lamb** was to become a legend in his forthrightness and dedication to the club's destiny. Having swapped parks with Geelong (V.F.L.) and now at Corio Oval, the club fought back to take the "C"

Section premiership honours (1948) and "B" Section in 1949. 1950 was, until now, the last "A" Section year.

In 1957 the club made its most significant move from Corio Oval to the scenic Queen's Park Oval, which is its heritage today. With Dr. JOHN MCPHEE'S (President 1957-1966) excellent leadership, and DAVID SHAW an energetic Secretary, the club saw new horizons. The late ROSS QUICK'S foresight is paramount in the club holding its position today.

By the 1960's the club had three senior and at least two (occasionally four) junior teams. Junior success was more abundant but the "B" Section finals were reached in 1963 and then after slipping down, the "C"

Section pennant in 1966, a tribute to the coaching endeavours of **John Maunsell**. Finest individual footballer of the 1960's was another cricketer, present-day Test opener **Ian Redpath**, who captained the club in 1962-63 and spliced together four successive best and fairests.

Milton Poulston (President 1966-1969) guided the club as both coach and President, followed by **Jim Fidge**, who became President in 1970. The successful coaching ability of **John Vautier** took the club first to the finals in 1970 and "B" Section premiers last year — a year in which the Reserves were runners-up and the Under 18 (Geelong and District) team were also premiers.

1973 is another year!
