ORMOND'S CHANCE FOR THIRD FLAG IN ROW

Third term burst takes them into grand final Blacks end Kew's winning run

Ormond fought their way back into premiership calculations when they defeated Caulfield Grammarians in last week's Final.

A great third quarter burst, which yielded seven goals, was the big factor in giving them the chance for their third successive premiership, as they took the honours in 1971 and 1972.

They also have the chance of collecting three premierships this season, as their Reserves are also playing in the Grand Final and the Juniors won the title in Section 1 last week.

Kew's winning run of seven games in a row came to an end when they went down to University Blacks by nine points in the B Section Final, and so are denied promotion.

The Blacks, and Reservoir Old Boys, who contest the Grand Final in this section today, will play in the top grade next season.

Ormond gave a much more workmanlike performance in beating Caulfield Grammarians by 22 points, but

they started off very shakily.
Caulfield did well against the strong wind in the first quarter, and kicked 4 goals to trail Ormond by 7 points at quarter-time.

But Caulfield failed to capitalise on their good start, and wasted many opportunities to gain a winning lead

in the second quarter.

All the same, Ormond were playing much better football and defended strongly, to be only 9 points in

arrears at the interval.

A goal to Caulfield early in the third term improved their prospects, but Ormond quickly replied, and then bombarded the goal for the rest of the quarter to finish with 7-10 to Caulfield's 1-1, and Ormond looked to be in a fairly safe position at the final change, when they led by 6 goals.

Caulfield had the chance to pull the game out of the fire, but poor shooting for goal nullified their efforts, and they managed only 2-8 for the quarter to a goal by Ormond, and went down by 22 points.

University Blacks forged ahead of Kew in the second term to gain a 15point lead at half-time, and increased their lead to 21 points in a low-

scoring third quarter.

Kew rallied in the last quarter to add 3 goals but they were unable to bridge the gap, and failed by 9 points.

Alphington finished much too strongly for Marcellin and ran out

easy winners by 45 points.

Marcellin led by 13 points at quarter-time, and trailed by only 4 points at the interval, due mainly to Alph-

ington's inaccuracy (5-16 to 6-6).

Alphington were 9 points in front at three-quarter-time, but kicked 7-3 to 1-3 in the last term to win well.

Old Ivanhoe also kicked 7 goals in the last quarter to score a 22-point win over Old Camberwell.

Camberwell led by 20 points at the first break but were a goal down at the halfway mark. They were 7 points in front at three-quarter-time but managed only 3-2 to Old Ivanhoe's 7-7 in the last term.

St. Bede's matched Fawkner in the first half and led by 8 points at the interval, but Fawkner broke away in the third quarter to add 10 goals and went on to win by a big margin.

Like their seniors, Ormond Juniors also won with a strong third quarter. In this term they kicked 4-9 to Monash University's 4 points, and converted a 4-point deficit into a 26-point lead.

This was more than Monash could handle, and Ormond won by 25 points.

Beverley Hills matched Coburg for the first half, too, but Coburg went to a 21-point lead at three-quartertime and finally won by 28 points.

A 5-goal burst by St. Bernard's in the second quarter of the Reserves game, gave them a half-time lead of 15 points over North Old Boys, but North kicked 3 goals against the wind in the last term to snatch a 5-point win.

Old Scotch always had the measure of Reservoir Old Boys and won by 15 points, while Old Haileybury led Parkside all day and romped home by nearly 7 goals.

Marcellin kicked 8 goals in the second term and led Hampton Rovers by 6 goals at half-time but went to pieces after the interval and were beaten by 11 points, the Rovers kicking 8-8 to 1-3 in this period.

Old Ivanhoe beat ANZ Bank by 21 points and Fawkner had the same winning margin over Monash Whites.

Old Ivanhoe and Fawkner collected double premierships, (Seniors and Reserves) — a particularly good effort on the part of Fawkner in their first season in the V.A.F.A. PREMIERSHIP LISTS (at end of Homeand-Home Round)



ELIGIBILITY OF PLAYERS FOR RESERVE SECTION FINALS

The attention of clubs is drawn to the restrictions which apply concerning players eligible to take part in Final matches in the Reserve and Junior Sections

The Rule relating to eligibility of players in Reserve Section Finals now reads:—

A player who has been a member of a senior team of any club in nine or more matches during the home-and-home matches in any season shall not be eligible for inclusion in the reserve team of a club taking part-in a final match in the same season unless both the senior and reserve teams are participating in a final match on the same day.

Provided that no player shall be eligible for inclusion in a reserve team taking part in a final match in any season unless such player has been a member of such reserve team in at least TWO home-and-home
