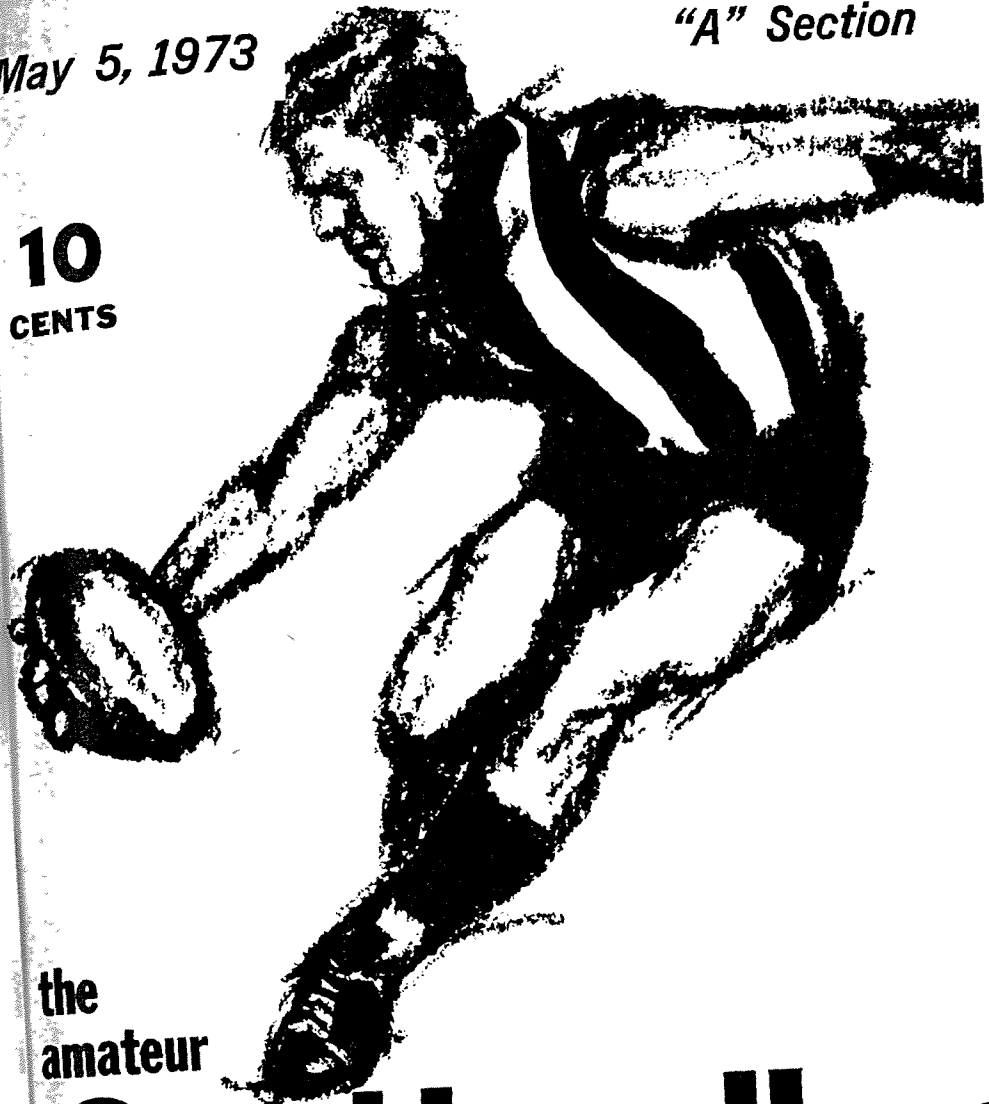

GEELONG, NORTH OLD BOY, BOTH DOWNED

NO UNBEATEN TEAMS IN A SECTION

Six sharing top place

Geelong and North Old Boys, who shared the lead as the only undefeated teams after two rounds, were both beaten last Saturday, and there are now six teams level for top place on the list.

Geelong couldn't hold Coburg in the last quarter and went down by 19 points, while North, after giving St. Bernard's a big start, nearly caught them in a great second half recovery, but failed by eight points.

North's defeat cost them their place in the four, and Geelong dropped from top spot to fourth.

Three other leading teams, St. Kilda CBOC, St. Bernard's Reserves and AMP Society Reserves, also suffered defeat. There are still 27 unbeaten sides in the 14 sections — not a great many after only three rounds.

Geelong were slowly away against Coburg, but when they got their teamwork functioning in the second quarter they rattled on eight goals straight and led by 13 points at half-time. But it was only their accuracy which gave them the lead as Coburg had had two more scoring shots.

Coburg gradually wore them down after the interval, adding five goals in each quarter, while Geelong's earlier accuracy deserted them and they kicked 4.10 in the second half to Coburg's 10.6.

Geelong failed to finish on and after leading by 4 points at three-quarter time, managed only one goal in the last term, to be beaten by 19 points.

St. Bernard's were much too strong for North Old Boys in the first half, gaining great drive from their rucks, and they held a commanding lead of 52 points at half-time (11.8 to 3.4).

But North were a much different combination in the second half, when they were able to develop their fast, play-on game, and they kicked 9.8 to

2.6 after the interval. They reduced their deficit to 22 points at the last change and crept up to within 2 points of St. Bernard's not long before the finish, but Saints steadied and held the Northerners off to score by 8 points.

Ormond's greater strength enabled them to dominate the first half of the game against University Blues and they led by 43 points at the halfway mark. The Blues improved in the second half, but could not make up any leeway, although they held Ormond to even scoring after the break.

The game at Elsternwick Park between Monash Blues and Ivanhoe was one of fluctuating fortunes. Monash had by far the better of things in the first term, but Ivanhoe came back well with a burst of five goals in the second and trailed by 11 points at the interval. Ivanhoe dominated play in the third quarter when they added 6.5 to 1.3 and were in an apparently strong position when they led by 21 points at three-quarter-time.

Monash had practically stopped to a walk, but it was a different story in the last quarter when Monash took complete control of the game and added 9.3 while Ivanhoe failed to score. Monash won by 6 goals.

Old Paradians put up a miserable performance against Caulfield Grammarians and were beaten by the huge margin of 25 goals. Caulfield were completely on top in a very one-sided game.

Reservoir Old Boys continued on their merry way with a decisive 46-point victory over Old Trinity, who suffered their first defeat. However Trinity retained their place in the four.

Old Scotch's accurate kicking (21.9) played a big part in their 5-goal win over Assumption in a high-scoring game. Assumption kicked 15.15. Old Carey were too strong for De La Salle and won by nearly 8 goals.

Collegians were too strong for Melbourne High and won comfortably by more than 7 goals. Kew surprised University Blacks by scoring an 11-point win, their accurate 15.7 contrasting with the Blacks' 12.14, and making all the difference to the result.

Parkside knocked St. Kilda CBC off the top of the list in C Section, when they won by 6 points. There were some other close games in this section, too — Old Melburnians beat Old Haileybury by 10 points and Old Xaverians beat Old Brighton by 13.

Fairfield had 4 goals to spare over Uni. High and Power House overwhelmed National Bank.

Hampton Rovers scored a 4-point win over Brunswick and Commonwealth Bank beat St. Kevin's Old Boys by 13 points. Alphington won by 22 points against LaTrobe Blacks and Marcellin beat Old Geelong by 26 points, but St. Pat's found State Savings Bank much too strong and were well beaten.

AJAX beat ANZ Bank by 15 points and AMP Society, Elsternwick Old Ivanhoe all had big wins at Glenhantly, West Brunswick Footscray Tech. respectively.

North Brunswick scored a big win over Old Mentonians and St. Bede were 22 points too good for University Reds. Thornbury scored by 15 points over Fawkner in a high-scoring affair and Monash Whites easily counted for Dookie and Longerenora.

In the Junior Section, Monash University inflicted a crushing defeat on University Blacks, who had scored a big win over last year's premiers, Bernard's, in the previous round.

University Blues had more than 20 goals to spare over North Old Brighton. Ormond beat Old Scotch by 19 points but it should have been more as Ormond kicked 10.22 to Scotch's 9.9.

St. Bernard's beat Ivanhoe by 15 goals and Power House overwhelmed Hampton Scouts.

In Section 2, all games were decided by big margins, AJAX's 32-point win over Caulfield Grammar being the closest. Parade kicked a colossal score of 46.31 (307 points) against National Bank, and Coburg, Beverley Hills and Old Brighton won the other games.

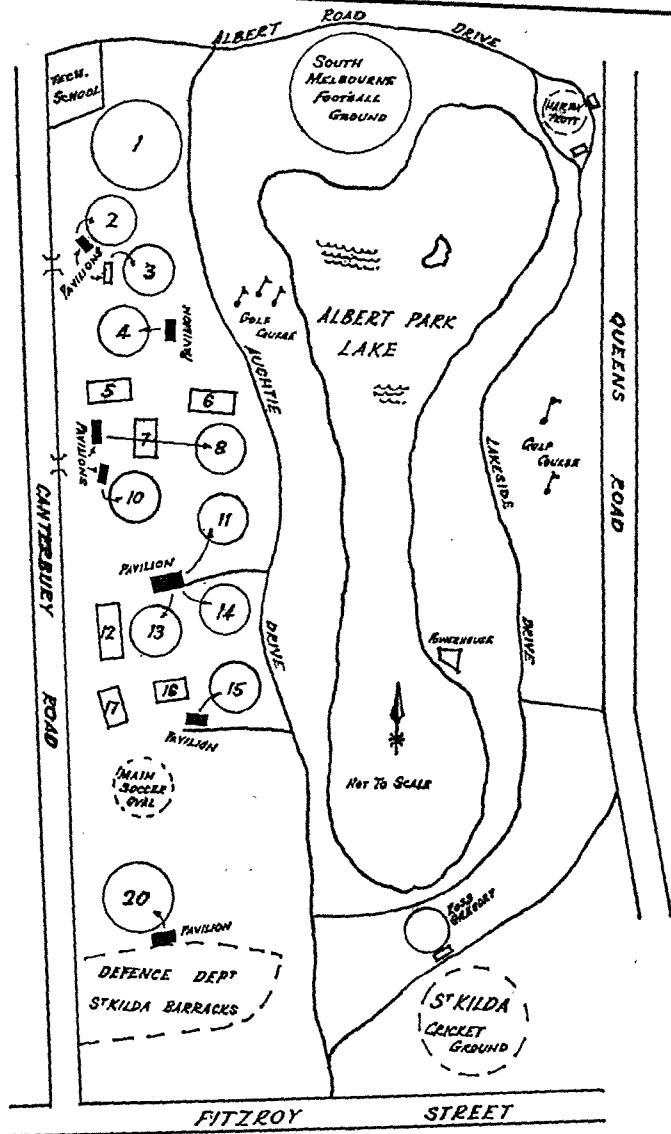

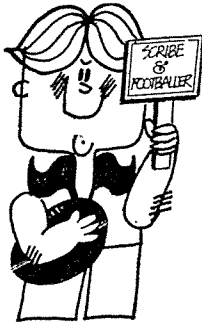

UMPIRE'S CORNER

VALE DARREN ADAMS

Umpires were shocked last week to learn of the death of a most popular member of our association — Darren Lee Adams.

Darren returned from London on Good Friday and passed away that same day, just three hours after his return to Australia.

Aged 28 years, he was a most popular umpire not only with his teammates, but also with players and officials who had the pleasure to know him.

The esteem in which Darren was held was evident by the vast number of his friends who followed the cortege to the Brighton Cemetery.

On behalf of the Umpires' Association, I extend to his parents our sincere sympathy in their sad loss.

DUTIES OF TIME-KEEPERS

Each club shall appoint a time-keeper whose duties shall be—

- A To keep the time of each quarter on time cards, complete same and sign and hand to the field umpire at completion of the game.
- B To sound a bell or such device at the start and finish of each quarter and to keep sounding it until the field umpire signifies to them that he has heard it.
- C To add time on to the playing time of the quarter whenever directed to do so by the field umpire, or when a goal or behind has been scored.

The time to be added on shall, in the case of a goal, be the time which elapses between the waving of the flags by the ball umpire and the bouncing of the ball in the centre by the field umpire, in the case of a behind, the time which elapses between the waving of the flag by the

goal umpire and the kick off from behind.

Time keepers should be in their position before the field umpire enters the playing area — this is most essential.

1. No. The decision is ball out of bounds on the full and a free kick awarded.
2. No. The ball is out of bounds and shall be thrown in by the boundary umpire.
3. No. Any player on the defending side may kick the ball into play.
4. No. In such case the field umpire would bounce the ball at the spot where the mark or free kick had been awarded.
5. No. If such player does not kick over his mark, the field umpire shall sound his whistle and signal the end of the quarter.

CLUB HISTORIES — No. 3

ORMOND — NOW IN THE “ROARING 40’s”

The Ormond Amateur Football Club was formed at a public meeting in July 1931, with Mr. Les Smith as President.

Vice Presidents were Messrs E. E. Gunn, L. A. Chisholm, and Cr. F. Bevers. Secretary was Mr. W. Coffey and Treasurer, Mr. J. F. Hogan. Messrs R. A. Stevens, S. Dart, C. Ellinson, W. Fancett, M. Scates and F. McNamara made up the rest of the committee.

The first committee decision was to make application to join the V.A.F.A. (then the Metropolitan Football Association), although some members preferred the Federal League. Along with 9 other clubs, Ormond became a Foundation Member of the new ‘D’ Section in 1932.

Another early decision was to use the President's World War I Corps colours. So the mighty BROWN AND BLUE was born.

Looking back over 42 years brings back memories of the depression to many members, and the Second World War to many more.

Memories of the players riding to ‘away’ games in “Porky” Godfredson's fruiterer's truck because nobody owned a car.

Memories of what is now the Ladies' Kiosk, but used to be the changing rooms for both sides.

Memories of the really good players who went on to make the ‘Big Time’ — players like Havel Rowe, Lawrie Mithen, Dick Fenton-Smith, Graeme Watson, Neil Crompton, Colin Wilson, Jeff Kitley, and many, many others.

Success came early to Ormond — ‘D’ Section Premiers in 1933, ‘C’ Section Premiers 1934, and ‘B’ Section Runners-up in 1936. Five years after our first game and Ormond were in ‘A’ Section.

1950 was the year the drought was broken and the ‘A’ Premiership won. A decade passed and Ormond spent four disastrous years back in ‘B’ Section. Now that memory is almost erased by two more ‘A’ Section Flags.

Ormond Reserves have always been a force to be reckoned with and have won seven Premierships in 12 years. The Juniors have also won seven Premierships since 1950.

The Under 17, Under 15, and Under 13 sides have not yet brought a Premiership Flag to Ormond, but have supplied many fine players to the ‘Seniors’.

While the number of players has grown from that first year of about 22 to a total now of about 150, the committee has also expanded from 12 to 33 hard-working men.

The club is also fortunate that the Ladies have always “pitched in” and helped. In the last five years alone the Ladies' Committee has raised \$6000 and kept the club on its feet financially.

Twenty Premierships and 16 times Runners-up, good coaches and great players, committeemen of the calibre of the Founder, the Late LES SMITH, and the tireless Doctor, the Late DR. J. R. PORTER, all part of a Tradition called Ormond Amateurs, a Tradition known throughout the Victorian football fraternity, and second to none.
