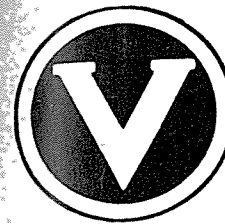

We're at the half way mark of the home and away matches, and suddenly it doesn't look so clear cut.

Ormond is a good side, but the **Old Xaverians** were wilting ("wilton") at the end of last week. **Old Paradians** have got the wobbles but **De La Salle & North Old Boys** have begun to find their feet. **Scotch** were reasonably impressive last week; they're better than I thought and are still a chance for the four.

Bulleen-Templestowe look certain to be relegated but it is hard to predict the other. Will it be **Caulfield**, **Uni Blues** or even **Collegians**, the 1986 Premiers?

I saw a great game at Swan Stree. Parking is well nigh impossible there but there was still quite a good crowd and they witnessed a pretty close and hard-tackling game. The **Old Xaverians** victory by 3 points over a depleted **Old Scotch** through centreman **Michael Atkins**. I was standing with **Scotch Captain Rob Fuller** (out with concussion) as the Cardinals came from 15 points down at three-quarter time. Two **Adam Ryan** marks and goals and a free in front to **Duncan McCall** put **Scotch** in front at the 20 minute mark.

Then came **Atkins** in time-on. He grabbed the ball in a pack at CHF and screwed it over his shoulder from 50 metres out for a miraculous goal — easily the play of the year. Fuller and I looked at each other in disbelief. Mind you Xavs would have been unlucky to lose having led all day.

But the Xavs can't have been very happy with their performance. Coach **Danny Corcoran** berated some of his players on the ground immediately after the game for not manning up and not chasing in the last vital minutes. He certainly is entertaining! **Scotch** were without **Bill & Ed Allen** (shoulder), **John Moir** (leg), **Steve Reddish & Fuller**.

I thought best-on-ground was **Old Xavs** ruckman **Mark Summers** who jumped high, marked strongly and fed the ball out well. He dominated the match.

De La Salle's win over **Old Paradians** was a surprive — not just the result but the margin, 75 points. **Peter Rennie** almost did as he liked in the forward pocket and kicked 7 goals. **Mick Greene, Matt Beddoe & Pater Barry** gave lots of drive to the De's from the centre square.

North Old Boys beat **Collegians** by 16 points in a closely fought match. **Steve O'Rourke** (centre) and **Gary Carroll** (ruck) were again North's best. What great seasons both are having! North's recent form must be starting to worry some of the to sides. **Collegians** is not the side of last year and presently are clear of the relegation zone only on percentage. Nice to see **David Hoyle** back and in the best for the **Lions**! Also **Jeremy Schmidt**, both no doubt welcome additions.

Ormond whipped **Bulleen-Templestowe** by 96 points, kicking 6 goals in each quarter. Evidence of Ormond's dominance was that they had twelve goalkickers — the best of them full forward **Paul Schuhkraft** with 7 goals. **Bulleen-Templestowe** never beaten **Ormond** in A Section.

Uni Blues led **Caulfield Grammarians** at three-quarter time but were over-run and lost by 16 points. It wasn't a high standard game. The highlight was possibly **David Matthews** of **Caulfield** who kicked 9 goals from the forward pocket.

The VAFA meets the VCFL for the third time tomorrow at the Lavington Sports Ground. Honours between these two vital and expanding football bodies are even, although the VCFL had success against the Australian Amateurs back in 1983. The VAFA won well in Bendigo in 1984 and the VCFL tasted success with a big win at Mildura in 1985.

The Country will start favourites following the success of its Winfield Championships and the Amateurs disappointing performance in Adelaide. However pride is an important factor in football and the 22 amateur selections all have the honour of representing the 10,000 registered players and their Association in what has always been a very high standard game. Coach **Bernie Sheehy** and his selectors have made many changes to the South Australian squad. Some have been necessary due to injury others have been discarded due to poor form or lack of commitment.

A feature of this team is the greater use of the lower sections although at time of writing it is hard to say who will pass fitness tests and win final selection.

The game is a most important one for the VAFA. Its credibility as an Association capable of producing teams as good as the other senior bodies is at stake, a fact that Bernie Sheehy is most acutely aware, especially as he had also landed the job of AAFC Coach for the NFL Bi Centenary Carnival in Adelaide next March.

There is no doubt our Association's ability to produce top players, 7 Brownlow Medalists and a host of VFL and Amateur champions confirm that. However despite the Carnival win in 1986 our recent representative history suggests that we're either not as good as we were in the early 80's or maybe the other competitions — South Australia, VFA and VCFL have caught up and passed us by in producing top quality combined teams.

Tomorrow 22 Amateur footballers have a great opportunity to restore the position.

REVIEW OF MATCHES PLAYED 13/6/87 — ROUND 9

D SECTION

Inaccuracy in the second half by **North Brunswick** limited their margin over **Elsternwick** to fourteen points. E SECTION

F SECTION

Williamstown defeated **St. Leonards** by thirteen goals while **Old Carey** defeated **Commonwealth Bank** by ten goals. **A.N.Z. Bank** finished five goals in deficit against **La Trobe University** whereas in the clash of the eastern neighbours **Aquinas** inflicted **Whitefriars** first defeat when they finished twenty five points in front. **Doveton** built an already impressive percentage with a nineteen goal margin over **Footscray Institute**. **St. Andrews** held fourth place when they finished seventeen points in front of **University Reds**, after trailing the "Reds" for most of the game.

G SECTION

My prediction of a comfortable **De La Salle** victory over **Old Haileybury** was not borne out by fact as **De La** fell in by two points after greater accuracy in scoring. Another poor prediction was that of a **Kew** victory where in reality **St. Bernards** proved too strong. **Monash Whites** with a twelve goal victory over **Old Scotch** was yet another side to make mockery of my prediction. The fourth incorrect tip I made was for **Marcellin** to defeat **Old Melburnians**. Really saw the **O.M.'s** win by two goals. Thank you **Bloods** for giving credence to my tips when you defeated **Collegians** by seventy four points. In the Sunday game **Port Colts** confirmed my selection when they defeated **GTV9** by fourteen goals.

H SECTION

My tipping in this section was much better as **Old Brighton** easily accounted for **Old Geelong**: **Old Eltham** recorded a fourteen goal win over the **Old Xaverians "Crocodiles"**. **Bulleen-Templestowe** did build their percentage by easily defeating **North Old Boys**. **Richmond Central** proved my prediction trends when they defeated **Therry** by four points. The result was markedly different from my prediction was that which saw **State Bank** defeat **St. Kevins** by over eleven goals. **CBC ST. Kilda** celebrated against **Powerhouse/Balaclava** and won by one hundred and four points.

UNDER 19 SECTION 1

Round 9 results meant I selected three winners in this section. **De La Salle** proved me wrong when they defeated **Bulleen Templestowe** by forty six points. **Marcellin** also proved me wrong when they had a forty seven point victory over **University Blues**. In the other game **Caulfield Grammarians** moved to second place as a result of beating **Ianhoe** by eleven goals. **Williamstown** had the bye.

D SECTION

On the **Barnard Reserve** I select **Old Camberwell** to take the points. **Old Ivanhoe** should return to the winning list today against **Heatherton** whose 1987 form does not inspire confidence. In the main game of the round **St. Kevins** play **Bulleen United** in what could be a preview of this season's finals. **St. Kevins** have earned the right to be considered the section leader while **United's** recent form has been very good. After a closely contested game I favour **St. Kevins** to take the four points. **Preston**, who have faltered badly this season await **Old Mentonians** who faltered badly last Sunday. At home I select **Preston**. **Coburg** await **Elsternwick** who make their first visit to the **De Chene Oval** for many seasons (when was their last visit?) **Coburg** is always a threat at home and as I was not greatly impressed with the 'Wicks' form last week I select **Coburg** to cause today's boil over.

E SECTION

Brunswick should be able to record a comfortable victory over **Clayton** who have struggled all season. **Old Geelong** has hit a patch of poor form lately after some good displays. UNDER 19 SECTION 1

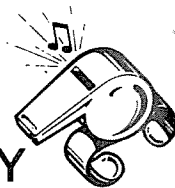

Wayne Simmonds today finally plays his 100th game for ANZ Bank against Williamstown.

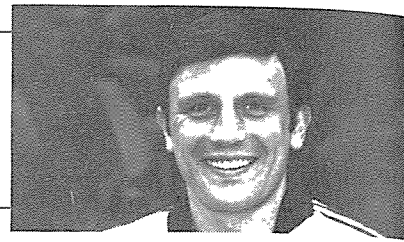

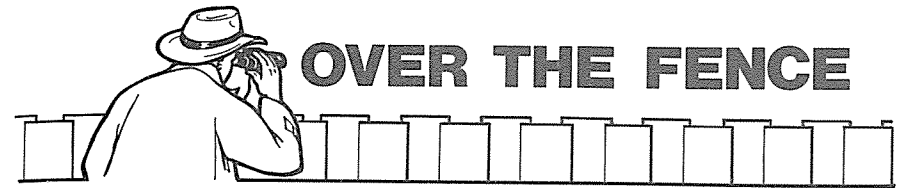

OTF reports that the following amendments to Rules were approved by Members at the meeting held 15th June

RULE 35:

"Extra time shall be played in any drawn match of the reserve grade or G or H Section. When the final siren sounds the players will remain on the field, change ends and in the meantime the goal umpires will meet and confirm that the scores are in fact level. Once confirmation is notified to the field umpire, 5 minutes plus time on will be played after which the siren will be sounded. The teams will cross straight over (without an address from coach) and play another 5 minutes plus time on. In the event that the scores are still level the match will be declared a draw and replayed the following week."

RULE 43 (XV):

The home club in each first round premierships match shall be responsible to provide appropriate and suitable seating for the coach, interchange players and his support staff. Such support staff not to exceed four (4) in number.

Further to our report in last weeks column that clubs may use approved yellow Sherrin footballs on wet weather days, OTF draws all clubs' attention to Rule 43 (IV)

RULE 43 (IV):

The home club in each first round premierships match shall be responsible to provide two balls in a suitable condition, both of which shall be of a make approved by the Executive Committee, to be submitted for the choice of the visiting team provided that at the discretion of the field umpire and both captains if the chosen ball is likely to be unduly affected by the ground or weather conditions a fresh ball in a suitable condition may be used in each subsequent quarter to the first, or, alternatively, the chosen ball in the first and third quarter and another used ball in suitable condition in the second and fourth quarters and further provided that:

(a) New balls shall be submitted for choice at the Senior Grade matches, and,

(b) Used balls may be submitted for choice at Under 19 and Reserve Grade matches provided they are in suitable condition.

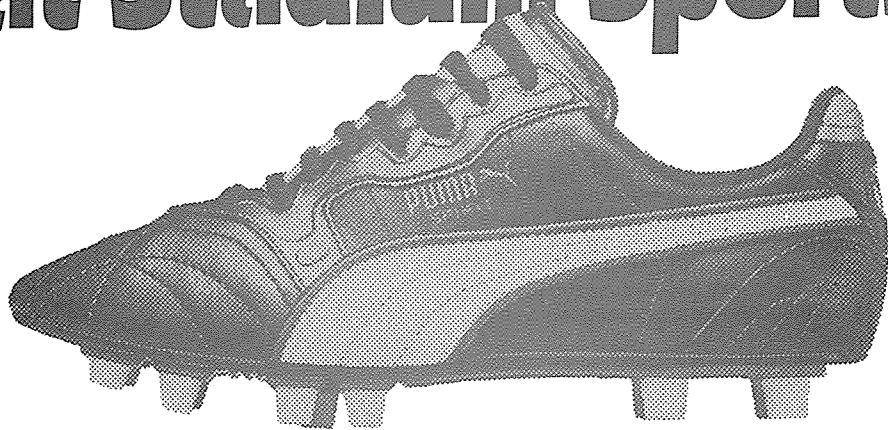

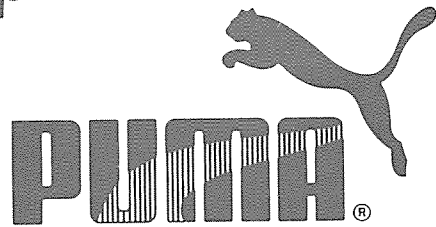

50 TO NIGHTMARE

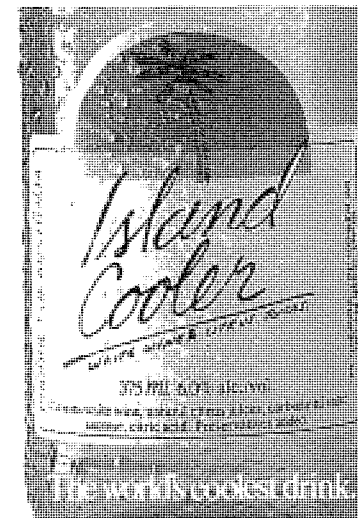

35 YEARS AGO — 1952

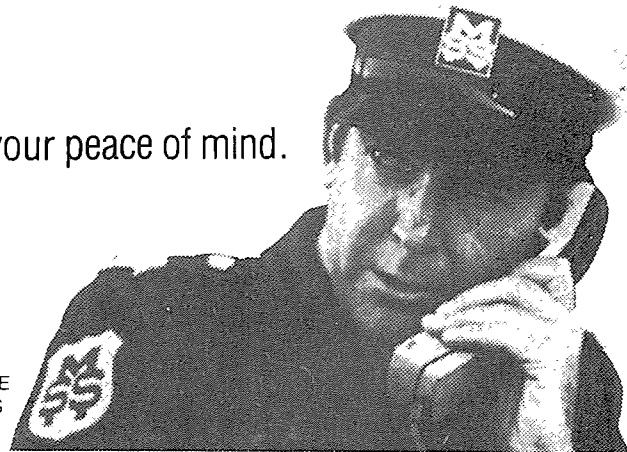
