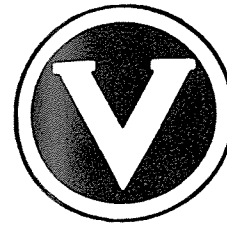

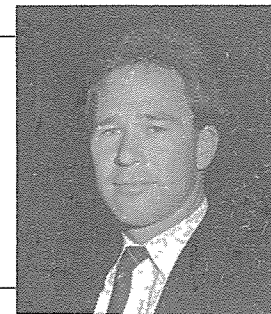

A Section Review by Ross Booth



Probably the most significant result last week was the 6 point loss by **Old Paradians** against **Old Scotch**. Not that their positions on the ladder change, **O.P.'s** remain in third spot and **Scotch** 5th but I think it effectively ruins **Parade's** chance of getting the double chance. And now **Scotch** have a very real chance of making the final four, perhaps today if they can beat **Da La Salle**.

Neither side played like a premiership threat. **Parade's** pace worried the **Cardinals** early in the game but it was the **Scotch** key position players who won them the match. Key position players **Peter Sherwen** (FB), **Dean Bevford** (CHB), **Brian Hodge** (C), **Duncan McCall** (CHF) and **John Moir** (ruck) all figured prominently.

However, don't write **Parade** off. This loss will give **Gerard Shelly** the needle he needs. **Old Xaverians** wrapped up their game against **Caulfield Grammarians** with 6 goals into the breeze in the first quarter and nearly an 11 goal lead at half time. But then the wheels fell off! **Caulfield** kicked 6 and kept the **Xavs** scoreless in the third term. We all trooped out to hear **Danny Corcoran** give it to the **Xavs**. But to our collective surprise there was no yelling. Just cool, calm and collected. He reminded them of the game against **Therry** last year — 54 points up and lost the game. Would this be the same. "You were physically intimidated by **Caulfield**. I have failed". And on he went. Quite a surprise but well worth listening to. **Caulfield** carried on in the last quarter with **Ray Berzins**, **Mark McClelland** and **Campbell Cooney** on top in defence and **Ian Kyte**, **John Kanis** and others trying to run the ball up to **David Matthews** (on one leg) in the goal square. The stumbling blocks were **Nick Wilton** and **Mark Summers** - they were superb and the **Xavs** held on to win by 22 points. I don't think **Danny** has failed. They haven't been beaten in 10 weeks or so and with the return of **Ralph O'Shaughnessy**, **Steve Curatin**, **Nick Burne** and **Phil Callil** they'll be a great chance for the flag. Morning would surprise me come September. Remember 1981?

Ormond beat **Collegians** by 45 points in a lacklustre game. **Collegians** got the first 2 goals with the breeze but did not score another till the 3rd term. The game featured the leading two goalkickers but both were well held - **Ormond's Paul Schuhkraft** by **Simon Williams** and **Collegian's Richard Herman** by **Brad Nash**.

I'm looking forward to the big clash between **Ormond** and **Old Xaverians** this afternoon.

Uni Blues blew their chance of a win over **De La Salle** with a bad first quarter and they lost by 21 points. **De la's** on-ball players **Mick Greene** (ruck), **Mark Lowe** (rover) and **Gary Connolly** (ruck-rover) were the difference.

North Old Boys scrambled in against **Bulleen-Templestowe** by 13 points. The Bullants were in touch all day, just a point down at each change. They hit the front in the last quarter but the report and send off of CHB **Greg Kazuoo** made the vital difference and North's **Paul Considine** ran amok and kicked two goals. Bullant **Andy Smythe** played his 250th and was their best player.

This is a very difficult week to select winners, even more so than usual but a great series of matches is assured.

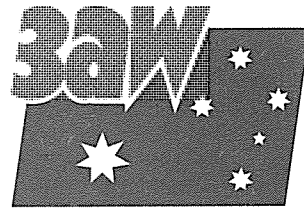

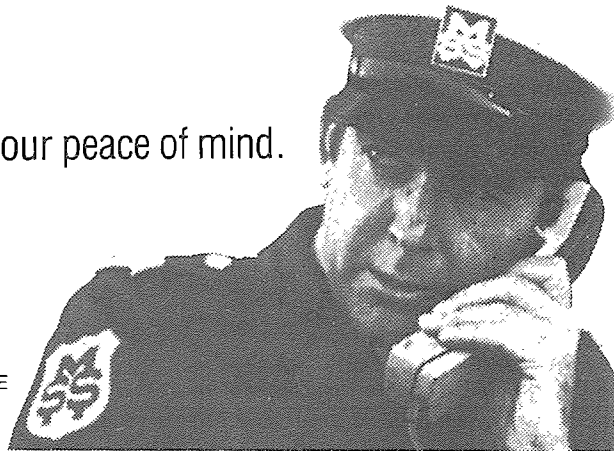

Peter French Previews today's matches



Thanks to **Ross Booth** for filling in last week. I'm sure he finds the reviews a far more attractive proposition following his indifferent performance, although his **Old Scotch** selection was certainly inspired! His reference to the "Whisper" was timely as his demise mid 1986 meant I was forced to take over the pen for this column. There were rumours aplenty doing the rounds at the time I recall, as to his identity which like "China and Snow" of yesteryear are still unfounded. Well the real news on the "Whisper" front is that he may be back for the finals, following a post card received at Elsternwick Park during the week which was postmarked Cooper Pedy! I remember he was forced out of town in a hurry, something to do with possible civil action but apparently its been resolved and he could well return around finals time. How's that **Fergus** and **Ross**?

- To more serious matters — today's games and we have two beauties in A Section that will certainly attract the crowds.

Ormond have been waiting eight weeks for a return bout with **Old Xaverians** the only side to have beaten the all conquering **Monds** to date. Readers may recall that **Xavs** blitzed **Ormond** in the final quarter and went onto win 15.14 to 13.12. As **Old Paradians** have shown some vulnerability lately the fight for second spot is over and so today's clash is a dress rehearsal of the second semi. **Ormond** does not have the injury worries that **Xavs** do although **Steve Curtain** and "Ralph" **O'Shaughnessy** may return today. Whats wrong with **Paul Curtain** and **Doug Atkinson**? Certainly **Nick Burne** is still a week or two away or is he? I wonder whether **Xavs** are planning to repeat their 1981 move of playing **Nick Burne** in a forward pocket and using **Steve Curtain** at centre half forward, a position they have been unable to adequately fill all season.

The big plus for the side is the return of **Nick Wilton** and his unique ability to find form almost immediately. His presence does wonders for the **Xav** defence and **Xavs** would also be looking for a quick return from **Doug Atkinson** whose cool head and determined approach are of immeasurable value.

A final word on **Xavs** concerning team placement. Why was **Mike Atkins** placed in a back pocket last week? It seems a little late in the season to be experimenting **Danny**, especially with a player who has proven his worth in the pivot all year. Another observation — where does **Peter Curtain** fit into the side so as to give best value. I've seen him full back, full forward, centre half forward, centre half back, ruck rover, half back and centre, which tells us all that he's as versatile and brilliant as any player in the Association. However I'm inclined to the view that his best football is more often produced as a half back flanker. But then where do you play **Varcoe** or **John Curtain**? Ah the problems of being successful.

After all that I'm selecting **Ormond** to win. **Xavs** have not been beaten since May 2nd when they went down to the Lions by 7 points and whilst they've had great wins over **Old Scotch** and **Old Paradians** in that long sequence they've not impressed as **Ormond** has. They're not as disciplined, and only play in bursts. Consistency has been the key to **Ormond's** top of the ladder position plus the performance of the **Ormond's** "unknowns" — **Paul Nankervis** whose clash with **Antony Callian** will as they say in the classics "be worth going a long way to see". Two young quick, skilfull players with a great future in the game pitted in the match of the day its mouthwatering. Some other **Ormond** quiet achievers — rover **Paul Cox**, centreman **Paul Sutherland**, ruckman **Paul McDonald**, forward **Paul Schukraft**, defender **defender Scott Taylor**, full back **Brad Nash**, all home grown products brought up in the **Ormond** way and not a reinstatement among them. **Ormond** to win and shorten as flag favourite.

Old Scotch's moment of truth arrives today. Victory over **De La Salle** will put the Cardinals in the top four for the first time since June 13th and with the slightly better draw they could hang on and make their first final's appearance since the B Section Grand Final of 1982. The odds favour **De La** who have won 24 of the 33 games played, although **Old Scotch's** win at Waverley Oval in July last year (8.11 to 7.10) was their first at that venue and may stand the Cardinals in good stead for today's all important game.

Scotch are obviously a harder side now than when they lost to **Ormond** at Elsternwick Park in Round 11. Since then they've beaten **Blues** by 10 points, come from behind to beat **North** by 3 points and then last week again got up off the floor to snatch a 6 point victory over **Old Paradians**. A reason for these close victories is certainly the **Don Davenport** approach and the good form of its defence led by **Andrew Smith**, **Rob Fuller**, **Peter Sherwen** and **Andrew MacMillan**, centreman **Brian Hodge**, ruckmen **Duncan McCall** and **John Moir**, on ball players **Steve Reddish**, **Ric Senior** and **Dean Burford**, and forward **Steve Spiers**.

As finals appearances have been few and far between for this current **Scotch** side they'll be really fired up for the game. However before **Scotch** start counting their chickens they would do well to remember the calibre of player who represents **De La**. They've proved time and again that they're never better than when written off and the return of skipper **Mick Greene** and recent good form of **Garry Connolly, Mark Lowe, Peter Waldron, Pat Maher** and **Dick Willimas** who are all steeped in the **De La** tradition poses problems for the Cardinals.

Despite their recent victories I'm going for the home side to win a cliff hanger and put paid to the **Scotch** charge for 1987.

In other A Section games **Uni Blues** have enough at stake to defeat a most disappointing **Collegians** as does **Caulfield** against **Bulleen-Templestowe**. In fact the 'Fields' second half last Saturday was quite impressive and I wonder if their last two performances can be attributed to my comments on July 18th?

The remaining game is vital for **North** who meet **Old Paradians** at Bundoora. **O.P.'s** will be still smarting after last week's 6 point loss. **North** has had chances to take over fourth spot and knowing it has **De La** next week will have planned well for today. However at Bundoora and despite the good form of **Garry Carroll, Mick Hedley, Paul Millett, Ben Curulli** and **Tony Cahill** to mention but five I'm afraid today will see the end of **North's** hopes for a hatrick of finals appearances.

In B Section **Marcellin** are at home to **Therry** in the match of the section. **Therry** won well in the first encounter (20.8 to 13.13) and with second spot at stake for both clubs there is certainly plenty for which to play. **Marcellin** at home are hard to beat and as both clubs play a similar style and have coaches who are keen students of the game the anticipated big crowd are in for great game. **Marcellin** are holding a reunion lunch to celebrate 20 years as a football club and president **Gavin White** is confident the old faces will inspire the side and urge them to victory. **Marcellin** must concentrate for the whole game and not have a quarter off if it is to win and with tough games against **Parkside** and **St. Bernards** still to come knows full well that **Uni Blacks** are still capable of a final challenge. For **Blacks** to make it they must win the remaining four games, the hardest of which is against **St. Bernards** today. I don't believe the students are capable of beating **St. Bernards** who have had a fine year after a slow start. They have made it to first place without the hooah and fanfare associated with other clubs and have the right mixture of youth and experience and a most astute coach in **Frank Melican** who is sure to have his side in the right frame of mind for today's game.

Parkside will be keen to avenge their shock Round 7 loss against **Old Trinity** who appear to be going through the motions. **Parkside** is bound to go for percentage and will appreciate the run on the big **Old Trinity** ground with the finals so close.

St. Kilda CBC has the form and spirit to beat **Fawkner** at Fawkner and will be hoping **Ivanhoe** account for **Banyule** as it fights to avoid relegation. **Ivanhoe** are more stable than **Banyule** who have not fared quite as well as anticipated and would need to pull out a big one to knock off the 'Hoe this afternoon. As **Ivanhoe** are not known for their on field generosity I'm afraid **Banyule** are in for a bleak day.

To C Section where **Hampton Rovers** are supremely confident of downing the **High School** following that splendid win over **Balaclava** whose finals hopes have nose dived in recent weeks. However such is Amateur Football, I've no hesitation in selecting **Balaclava** to beat **Monash** at Albert Park. The 'Ashes' are in a real slump having loss successive matches and as **Balaclava** "has the wood" on the students I'm afraid July will prove a very sad month for **Keith Freason** and company.

Kew are at home to **AJAX** and could start at half time and still win whilst **Thomastown** have far too much at stake to drop a game against **Old Haileybury** who will be heartened by last weeks effort. Going on last year from memory **Old Haileybury** struggled to field two sides although despite the trek awaiting the Springvale boys I'm sure they've learnt the lesson of playing "ring ins"

Elsternwick Park is the venue for the battle between close rivals **Old Brighton** and **Old Melburnians**. Two or three weeks ago I would have given **Brighton** a big show but **O.M.'s** have regrouped since then and the return of many of its injured stars has the side in the right frame of mind for the big months ahead. Despite the distraction of a supporters lunch **O.M.'s** will appreciate the chance to show their true ability and should win an entertaining game.

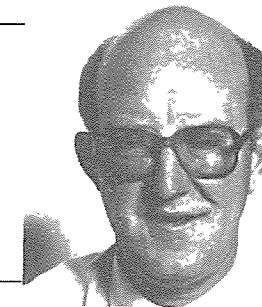

REVIEW OF GAMES PLAYED JULY 27, 1987

D SECTION (Round 15)

North Brunswick's greater accuracy enabled them to defeat **Old Mentonian's** by two points. This victory means that **North** are now safe from relegation which must be a big relief to their members. There was no need for **Old Camberwell** supporters to worry last week as their players carried the team to a forty nine point victory over **Coburg**. **Old Ivanhoe's** comfortable thirty eight point victory over **Preston** has stopped virtually all hope the **Preston** people had of reaching the finals. **St. Kevins** returned to the winning list when they defeated **Elsternwick** by thirty six points. **Bulleen United** experienced few difficulties in defeating **Heatherton** by forty one points.

E SECTION (Round 15)

The sectional results did little to sort out the scramble for positions with which all ten clubs are vitally involved. What a result between **Brunswick** and **Old Essendon!** Who would have forseen a tie! The result has kept the clubs in the top two places. As expected **State Bank** had a big credit score of ninety seven points against winless **Clayton**. **Old Geelong** won their long awaited sixth game when they defeated **Powerhouse** by thirty one points. The surprise result of the round was **University High School Old Boys** ten points win over **St Bedes**. This loss by **St. Bedes** coupled with **West Brunswick's** sixty one point victory over **Peninsula Old Boys** saw **West** move into fourth place.

F SECTION (Round 15)

Williamstown was untroubled to defeat **La Trobe University** by forty three points. I must apologize to my avid **La Trobe** readers because what else can I write about your side! **Whitefriars** had an overwhelming victory over **Commonwealth Bank** by one hundred and thirty five points. **A.N.Z. Bank** gave a commendable display against **Doveton** before going down by thirty four points. For the first time in the V.A.F.A. **St Leonards** won consecutive games when they finished seventy five points in front of **Footscray Institute**. The win lifted **St. Leonards** two places on the ladder from twelfth to tenth. The match of the day at **Elsternwick Park** turned into a nightmare for **Old Carey** who were overwhelmed by **St. Andrews** by one hundred and eighteen points. In the Sunday game leaders **Aquinas** received little opposition from **University Reds** before **Aquinas** won by one hundred and six points.

G SECTION (Round 15)

Monash Whites were too strong for **De La Salle** and won by twenty three points. **St. Bernards** and **Collegians** were not evenly matched in Round 15 because **St. Bernards** were able to win by sixty two points. Inaccuracy by **Old Scotch** saw the **Cardinals** go down by twenty two points to **Port Colts**. **Old Haileybury** recorded a comfortable thirty point victory over **G.T.V.9** while **Kew** were able to defeat **Marcellin** by fifteen points. Leaders **Bloods** experienced little difficulty defeating **Old Melburnians** by ninety five points. As these six results were as I predicted I tipped the G Section card.

H SECTION (Round 15)

Bulleen Templestowe had a day out against **Old Geelong** and as a result had a huge winning margin - one hundred and ninety seven points. Leaders **Eltham** had little trouble defeating **Therry** by seventy seven points in what was **Therry's** last appearance for the season. **St. Kevin's** did return to the winning list in a resounding fashion when they defeated **Richmond Central** by forty six points. **Old Brighton** received little opposition from **C.B.C. St. Kilda** before **Brighton** won by eighty points. **Old Xaverians** forfeited to **State Bank**. **Powerhouse/Balaclava** had the bye.

UNDER 19 SECTION 1 (Round 14)

Collegians with a clear cut victory over **De La Salle** by twenty eight points have vitually ended all chances that **De La** might sneak a final's berth. **University Blues** returned to the winning list when they had a sixty seven point victory over **Ormond**. **Old Paradians Green** overcame some spirited opposition from **Melbourne High School Old Boys** and led throughout the game when **Old Paradians** won by eighty five points. Leaders **Old Xaverians** defeated **Marcellin** by thirty six points after a hard fought game in which **Xavier's** direct play

contrasted with the haphazard **Marcellin** ball movement. The **North Old Boys** forfeited their game against **Bulleen Templestowe**.

UNDER SECTION 2 (Round 14)

University Blacks hit top form and annihilated **Old Melburnians** by one hundred and four points. The **Blacks** can still make the finals provided they can maintain momentum. **Banyule** indicated my selection when the confirmed their winning streak by defeating **St. Bernards** by thirty eight points. This win took **Banyule** to fourth place as **Thomastown** failed by thirty one points against **Old Haileybury** and thus slipped to **Old Brighton** by eleven points. **Old Scotch** showed the value of accurate kicking for goal when with less scoring shots the **Cardinals** defeated leaders **Therry** by nineteen points. **Therry's** inaccuracy over many weeks must be a source of concern to **Coach Pinner** as the final's approach.

UNDER 19 SECTION 3 (Round 14)

Ivanhoe recorded a massive victory over leaders **Whitefriars** when the **Maggies** won by sixty four points. **Monash Blues** also had a big win at the expense of **Old Paradian's Purple** who nevertheless proved competitive opponents. The **Blues** final margin was eighty six points. There is no result of the game between **Williamstown** and **Hampton Rovers** due to the match being abandoned. **Caulfield Grammarians** had the bye.

PREVIEW OF MATCHES TO BE PLAYED (August 1, 1987)

D SECTION (Round 16)

Bulleen United, will meet spirited opposition from **North Brunswick**. However **Bulleen** will take the points because of their superior talent to say nothing of the lure of the final four. **Old Mentonians** must defeat **Old Camberwell** to remain in the final's race. However **Old Camberwell** have the superior record and I can't forget last week's **Mentonian** stumble. **Old Camberwell** are my selection. **Old Ivanhoe** visit **Coburg** and should take the points in a convincing manner, as they need a win to insure the double chance and **Coburg** is now en route to E Section for the first time. **Preston** await **St. Kevin's** who must be favoured to win. Nevertheless **St. Kevins** will have to play out the full hundred minutes or they could lose as **Preston** is a formidable team. **Elsternwick** travel to **Heatherston** and must be favoured to win as the locals have the least active forward line in the section. An **Elsternwick** victory will keep the old club in the section and insure a **Heatherston** drop to E Section for 1988.

E SECTION (Round 16)

St. Bedes will gain no respite today as they strive to return to the top four. **Brunswick** their opponents today will be all out to comment on the double chance and I believe they will defeat **St. Bedes**. **Old Essendon** should inflict a huge defeat on the hapless **Clayton**. Percentage could be vital to **Old Essendon** after Round 18 and today is a golden opportunity for it to be built. **State Bank** must start warm favourites to defeat **Old Geelong** on Oval 4. Victory to the **Bankers** could earn the double chance so the incentive is there. I have no hesitation in selecting **State Bank**. **Powerhouse** play **Peninsula** on the **Ross Gregory Oval**. Victory to **Powerhouse** will insure the Club will play in D Section next season and this victory should ensure **Peninsula** drop to E next season. Victory to **Peninsula** could see the reverse scenario. The threat of relegation often makes sides play above themselves. (Who else at **Powerhouse** can recall their 1961 tie with **Coburg** which enabled the 'Burgers remain in B Section!) At home I select **Powerhouse**. Near neighbours **University High School Old Boys** and **West Brunswick** meet on the **Brens Oval**. The **University High** players proved giant killers last week. Can they prove so again! Victory by **West Brunswick** could insure a final four berth. Surely this will be sufficient incentive. I believe it will and that **West** will take the four points.

F SECTION (Round 16)

Old Carey are at home to **Williamstown** and must show marked improvement to take the points over **Williamstown**. Theoretically either side can still be a finalist to victory today will be vital. Who do I select! Out of for **Carey** or inconsistent **Williamstown**! I will take the plunge and select **Williamstown**. The intellectual match of the day will be play at **Bundoora** between **La Trobe** and **Melbourne University Reds**. **La Trobe** is the stronger side and should record a comfortable victory (Surely this will please the Mills and Reichelt Families who regularly read my prose.) **Whitefriars** should be able to have a very comfortable victory over **A.N.Z. MILESTONE AT COLLEGIANS

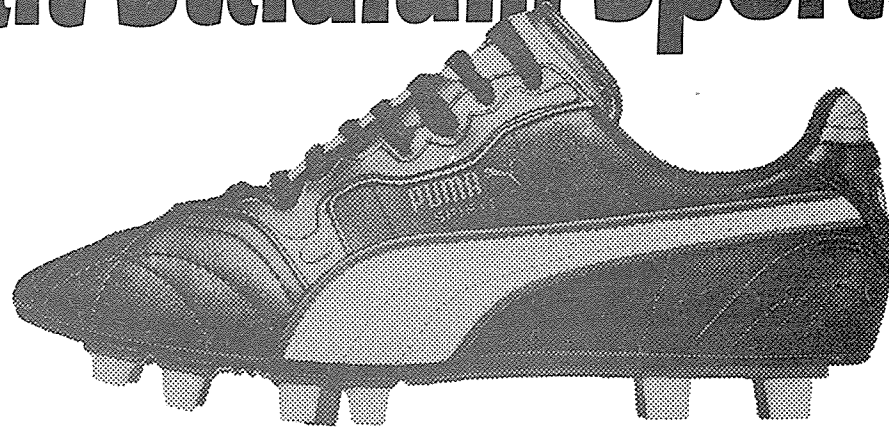

Have a good one today mate, hopefully your form and the teams form of last week will continue and this week we'll all go that "One;; step further and knock off a top side.

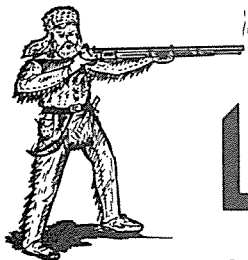
