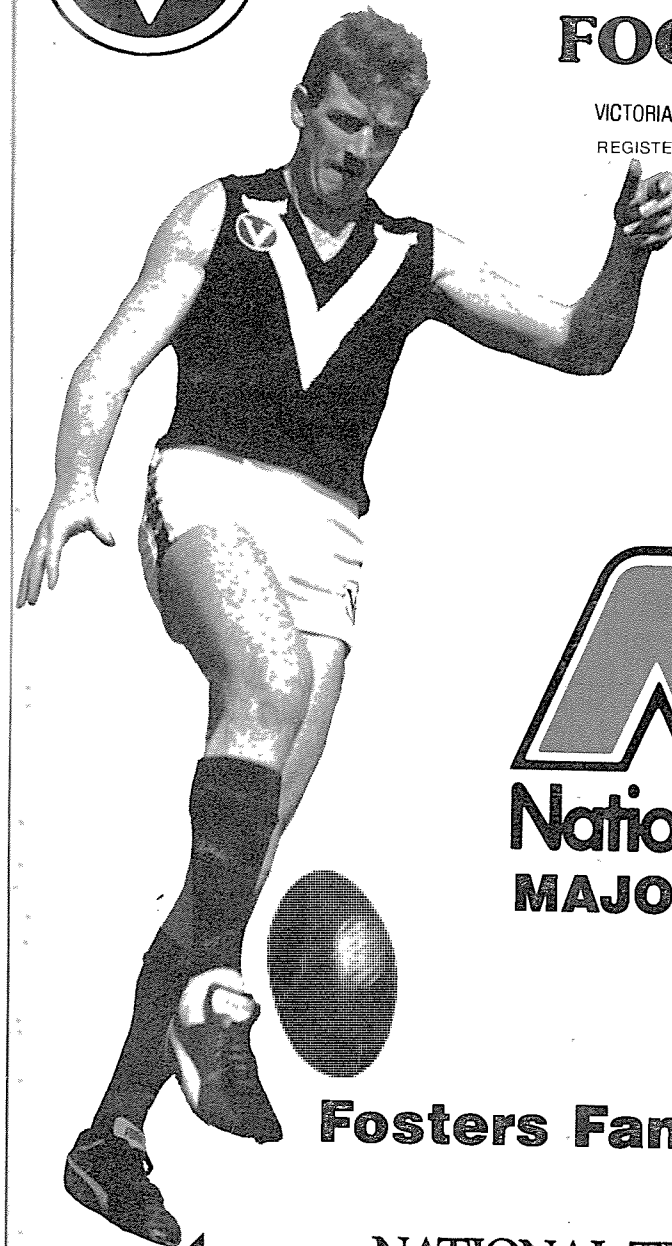
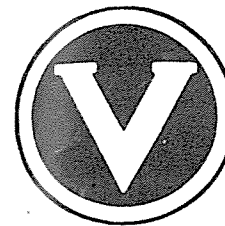

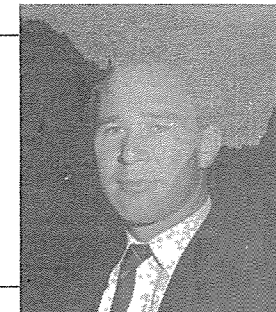

Just like the teams in the finals, I am refreshed after a one week break and looking forward to the start of the B Section and A Section finals.

Thanks to **Peter French** for filling in for me last week. I was able to tune in to **Peter** on 3LO on Saturday night so I was well informed but I must admit I didn't rise early enough to listen to **Peter** and **Harry** on 3AW Sunday morning!

Even though it's the B Section 1st semi at Elsternwick between **Marcellin** and **Parkside** I feel I might be tempted to travel out to Northcote to see which team — **Monash Blues** or **O.M.'s** — can make it to B Section in 1988. Professor **Keith Frewson** will be extolling **Monash** to "kick long with the wind" but no matter how much he does I think the **O.M.'s** might just have a bit too much class for **Monash**. They've beaten them twice this year so I think they could consider themselves favourites.

On recent form the **Marcellin—Parkside** clash might be a walkover. But finals are different and let us hope **Parkside** can find some of their early season form. PETER FRENCH REVIEW

LAST WEEKS A SECTION MATCHES



Ormond proved that "persistence pays" following their sensational effort in kicking 3 goals in time on to beat **Old Paradians** by 3 points in a highly entertaining game. Full marks to **O.P.'s** whose intelligent play into the wind in the final quarter caught **Ormond** out and it wasn't until they directed play or rather were allowed to direct play straight down the ground that they pulled off a quite remarkable victory. **O.P.'s** showed they're a fine marking side and I felt they might have been faster than **Ormond** but you can't deny those **'Monds** who must have firmed as favourites for the flag. **Brad Nash** is one **'Mondsman** who relishes playing at Elsternwick Park whilst **Martin Tobin** has been a great acquisition to the side. **Frank Gleeson's** two left foot snaps in the 3rd quarter and unbelievable angle goal into the wind in the last were great highlights whilst **Dale McCann** turned in a great game and his presence tomorrow will mean a lot to **O.P.'s** chances.

Uni Blues ensured their A Section spot for 1988 by beating **North Old Boys** by 16 points. **North** had the game wrapped up by half time but again went missing to let the **Blues** in. Ruckman **Garry Carroll** made a most successful return to A Section football and is bound to figure in his club's best and fairest award. So too will **Mauro Borcich** and **Steve O'Rourke** who have had good years too.

The **Blues** only just hung on to its spot and can thank the form of youngsters like **Eddie Banks**, **Chris Holmes** and **Richard Furphy** who provided plenty of drive and enthusiasm and **Mick Vandell**, **Bernie Angel** and **Simon McCauley** were also useful contributors. Both **Blues** and **North** have some soul searching to do over the summer.

Bulleen Templestowe leave A Section after 4 years. They will have been heartened by a 5 point win over the Cardinals and the fine debut by two 16 year olds **Brett Stokes** and **Tony Panoca**. The **Bullants** need some stability after 4 coaches in those 4 seasons and will be hoping **Graeme Jacobs** lines up again. A fit **Tony Keenan** and the return of **Ric Demarie**, **Mal Palmer** and **Shane Gilmore** wouldn't go astray either.

Scotch showed on occasions that they were capable of better things but like previous seasons lost vital games. They certainly unearthed some talent especially **Duncan McCall** but will miss **Don Davenport** who has been forced to stand down due to business commitments in the U.S. Certainly **Scotch** should be one side looking to 1988 with enthusiasm and hope.

Caulfied Grammarians also say farewell but it wouldn't surprise if they returned to 'A' in 1989. They have some really fine players and I understand they'll be strengthened by the return of several stars from their final's sides of 1983 and 85. No matter who returns they would need to work on their commitment.

Old Xaverians finished with a well earned win over **Collegians** whose fall from grace was a mystery. Some blamed it on the loss of **Ian Herman** and **David Hayle** for the first half of the season. Some blamed it on the "Premiership Blues" some probably even blamed **Fergie**! I wonder how many blamed themselves? The **Lions** would need to pick up another ruckman and a forward but has the basis of a side which is bound to be more competitive next season.

Well **Ross** its back to you for the remainder of the season's reviews.

BRUCE FERGUSON WRITES FOR US! (Well for another month)

Reigning A Section premiership coach, **Collegians Bruce Ferguson** will be a guest tipster during the final series. **Bruce** has selected **De La** tomorrow and says "De La will win. Over the last few weeks they've been scoring 15-20 goals a match and are obviously in form, although **O.P.'s** must have put up a good effort against **Ormond** last week. In form sides coming into finals generally do well and I've selected **De La** not on their past record of finals appearances and success but on their current form."

And **Bruce's** tips for the A Section best and fairest were **Old Xavs Peter Curtain** and **O.P.'s Mick Skerriitt**.

He also believes that contrary to public (i.e. Amateur) opinion the standard in A Section has not dropped. The return of players who have had experience at the various levels at VFL clubs has been a great boost and cites **Old Xavs** who have benefitted greatly.

PETER FRENCH PREVIEW THE SEMI FINALS

For one reason or another this has been the hardest preview to put on paper in the five years I have been attempting them. Indeed I was still at it as late as Wednesday morning much to the printer's horror. However after careful analysis I'm selecting **De La Salle**.

Looking at the game more closely lets commence with the vital on ball players. I overheard an **Old Paradian** supporters claim last week that **Brian Grills** was the best ruckman in A Section. Well he's entitled to his view but along with most A Section supporters in general and the umpires in particular he's not in the same street as **Mick Greene** whose ability to play with injury rivals if not surpasses the great **Baldock** of whom it is reported was never more than 90% fit! Surely that figure would be 75-80% for **Greene** who has won the admiration of so many **De La** players and fans and the respect of all opposition. His around the ground marking and inspirational play is vital to **De La** and they know it! Supporting **Greene** are **Gary Connolly** and **Mark Lowe** who is under a cloud, which could be quite a problem for them as **Old Paradians** possess the best rover in the competition in **Frank Gleeson**, a view shared not only by **Bernie Sheehy** and the state selectors but also the A Section umpires! Congratulations **Frank** — a most worthy winner of the J.N. Woodrow Medal. **Frank's** great value to **O.P.'s** is his ability to kick goals and he is a real menace when resting or roving up forward. Here's a job for **De La's Greg McHenry** who has the pace to match it with **Gleeson** although **De La** may be forced to use **McHenry** as first rover if **Lowe** fails to come up. **O.P.'s** may have the edge in the roving department as **Martin Heffernan** has also had a fine season and will win his share of possessions. **Fahey** and **Connolly** are well matched and both will figure in many attacking moves and probably negate one another on the day. Across the centre honours should be even. **De La** will win in the centre because **Tim Cooke** is in great touch, but **Old Paradians** will control the wings through **Brendan Considine** and **Brian Davis**. **De La's** other great strength is its defence where **Adrian O'Keefe**, **Pat Maher**, **Dick Williams**, **Mick Knuppel** and **Peter Barry** have been playing with great consistency and have formed a tight and versatile combination. **O.P.'s** will need a big game from **John Atta** who lacks pace and must decide where to play both **Michael Skerriitt** and **Dale McCann**. I suspect **McCann** may be used up forward, as he outplayed **Ormond's Russell Barnes** when shifted there last week. He would prove a handful for **De La** where his marking strength and experience could create havoc. However **Adrian O'Keefe** may be just the man for him.

At the other end **Matt Considine** has a huge task if he's given it, of minding **De La's** major forward **Peter Rennie**. **O.P.'s** will be hoping that **Tony Pritchard** returns to full back where he will need to quickly recover his form, as full forward **Peter Waldron** has proven a surprising success. Lurking in the pocket will be **Colin Lowe** who showed glimpses of his great April May form by booting 4 goals last week. **Tony Canavan** will most likely pick up **Brian Hanrahan** in what will be an interesting duel especially if **Hanrahan** is given a run in the ruck and **Canavan** finds himself on **Greene**!

Although I'm mindful of **Old Paradian's** endeavour and that they'll be really keyed up for this semi final appearance I'm confident **De La** can win. They have been a model of consistency over the past month and carry a great finals record and tradition into the game. It has the more settled goal to goal line, plays the ground to perfection and has the stoppers to cover the **Old Paradian's** prime movers. Lets hope we get the great game all are anticipating.

In B Section **Marcellin** and **Parkside** meet in the do or die first semi final. **Marcellin** must start favourites as the **Devils** record in the last month shows 1 win in 3 losses, one of which was against today's opponent! True the club has been severely hit by a shocking run of injuries and the loss of key players such as **Frank Sansonetti** and maybe **Mark Page** are bitter blows to the club's hopes of promotion to A Section.

Marcellin will be nearly at full strength with the return of **Chris Slattery** after his little "holiday" and have **Tony Paatsh** and **Matt Getson** in sparkling form whereas **Goran Yoksich** has struggled for form this season. **Dirk Ebert** and **Andy Cullinan** the lion hearted **Steve Psoras** and youngster **Paul Sheahan** and **Joly Amad** are but five players who will worry **Parkside** who need a disciplined and big game from **Chris Freeman**. **Eagles** full back **Mick Day** has the big task of seeing **Freeman** is kept well down. **Parkside** will be looking to its champion **Gary Williams** (congratulations Gary) who was a clear winner of the season's B Section best and fairest award, to produce the form which won him six best afield votes and that **Mark Sturgess** can recapture his early season touch.

Marcellin must be wary of over confidence as **Parkside** has all to gain and nothing to lose. However under the guidance of coach **Neil Le Lievre** who has a fine record in the V.A.F.A., **Marcellin** is not likely to take **Parkside** lightly as they are a most respected opponent.

In C Section **Old Melbourne** will easily dispose of **Monash Blues** and return to B Section next season. **Monash** put in a pathetic effort last week against **Kew** whilst **O.M.'s** had to battle hard against a dogged **Thomastown**.

Monash do not have the burning desire to leave C Section as do the **O.M.'s**. Nor do they have players capable of holding the **O.M.'s** galaxy of stars. **O.M.'s** will be well supported and will use the game as preparation for the big clash with **Kew** next week.

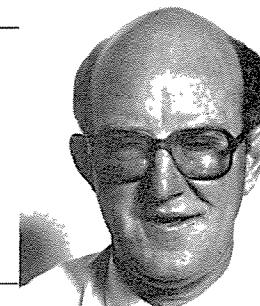

REVIEW OF GAMES PLAYED AUGUST 22—23.

D SECTION (First Semi Final)

Old Mentonians continued their fine August form when they defeated **Bulleen United** by the wide margin of seventy three points. This result was in marked contrast to the home and away results when each side had a victory by fifteen (**Bulleen**) and eighteen (**Mentone**) respectively.

Second Semi Final

Old Ivanhoe justified my selection when they defeated **St. Kevins** by nine points. But for inaccuracy in front of goal **Old Ivanhoe's** winning margin would have been greater. Congratulations go to the **Old Ivanhoe Club** on their promotion to C Section.

E SECTION First Semi Final

After an evenly contested game at **Ormond West Brunswick** emerged victorious over **St. Bedes** by fifteen points. **St. Bedes** inaccuracy contributed to their loss as both sides had to play in the same conditions.

Second Semi Final

On the big **Latrobe University** ground **State Bank** had a clear cut win against **Old Essendon Grammarians** by thirty three points. Congratulations to **State Bank** who thus qualified to return to D Section after two seasons in E Section.

F SECTION First Semi Final

Old Melburnians for the second successive season forfeited their last round game. Last week leaders **Therry** received the forfeit. **St. Bernards** with a thirty two point victory over **Thomastown** failed by a mere 1.5% to qualify for the first semi final. Whitefriars won the rehearsal for today's second semi final when they defeated **Caulfield Grammarians** by fourteen points. **Williamstown** showed great form when they defeated **Monash Blues** by the big margin of one hundred and nine points. This loss does not inspire confidence in the **Blues** in today's semi final. **Ivanhoe** showed fine form in their defeat of **Hampton Rovers** by fifty six points. **Old Paradian's Purple** had the bye.

PREVIEW OF MATCHES TO BE PLAYED 29/8/87

D SECTION PRELIMINARY FINAL

St. Kevins and **Old Mentonians** meet at **Bentleigh** to decide who will challenge **Old Ivanhoe** and who will win promotion to C Section from whence **St. Kevins** came this season and where **Old Mentonians** have never been. Each side defeated the other at home during the season — **St. Kevins** won by forty three points on June 13 while **Old Mentonians** won by sixty one points on August 15. **Mentonian** defenders have had difficulty quelling **Steve Kerr** in each game. He has received good support from **Watkins, Whelan and Waters** — the three W's reminiscent of an earlier generation of West Indian Cricketers. For **Old Mentonians** **ACREMAN, W. BEY. NON the BARRETTs** and that evergreen veteran star **Gary Norton** will give their best to lift their side to C SECTION. **St. Kevins** have shown little recent form due mainly to injury as well as close checking of their star players by opposition teams. Today I forecast an **Old Mentonians** victory as they are the form side. This victory will record another chapter in their twenty season club history.

E SECTION PRELIMINARY FINAL

Old Essendon Gramamrians and **West Brunswick** meet at **Monash University** for the right to win promotion to D Section as well as to challenge **State Bank** for the premierhip next week. Each side has won on the other's ground — **Old Essendon** won on Anzac Day by thirty four points while **West Brunswick** scored a twenty seven point victory on July 4. There is little in common among goalkickers and best players in these games so today's tactics should not involve defence and taking opponents out of the game. Judged on their 1987 performances **Old Essendon** forwards lost their accuracy when they were pressured by the opposition. Conversely **Old Essendon** has proven that free of pressure their forwards can goal with ease. The question that will be answered today is can the **West Brunswick** defenders and followers place sufficient pressure on **Old Essendon** to hold them to a losing score? The conditions at Monash will be different from those experienced normally by the two northern based sides so the side which settles down the quicker could well take a winning lead from the first quarter. After a lot of thought I am going for **West Brunswick** to win and thus move back to D Section after a one season sojourn this time round in E Section.

F SECTION PRELIMINARY FINAL

Aquinas & St. Andrews meet on the wide spaces of the Harry Trott Oval for the right to qualify for E Section in 1988 and to play **Whitefriars** in next Saturday's Grand Final. The teams have met only once in Round 1 this season when **Aquinas** recorded a convincing sixty point victory. For **St. Andrews** to win **Terry Wilson** will have to kick a bag of goals and players such as **Phelan and Shearer** will have to play well again. Danger players for **St. Andrews** to watch will include the **Wright Brothers, Whelan** and big forward **John Ryan** whose loping left foot has steered through many goals in recent matches. Both sides have played well enough to take the game and really the result could go either way. I have to make a choice so I will go for **Aquinas**.

UNDER 19 SECTION 1 FIRST SEMI FINAL

Old Paradians Green & Bulleen Templestowe meet on the **Brens Oval** after having won at each other's ground during the season — The **Paradians** won at **Bulleen Templestowe** on May 30 by thirty three points while the **Combine** won at **Bundoora** on August 8 by seventeen points in very heavy conditions after the scores were even at half time. Good players for **Bulleen Templestowe** in each game have been **Shepherd, Wilson & Pulse** while for **Paradians** **Jowett & Philp** were on their best on each occasion. The **Paradians** do not have a tall ruckman and consequently they rely on their talented goal to goal line and rover **Regan** to move the ball forward to **Philp & Freeman**. The **Old Paradians** are a talented side who do not always move the ball straight forward. This plan could mean their undoing against the determination and close checking of the **Bulleen Tem-**

plestowe team. Statistically the **Old Paradians** are the better performed side over the season but when judged on performances against **De La Salle** in rounds 17 and 18 the **Combine** are a hundred and four point better side. Surely this statistic won't be made factual today! I have to make a selection and after due analytical appraisal I select **Bulleen Templestowe**.

UNDER 19 SECTION 2 FIRST SEMI FINAL

Old Haileybury & University Blacks meet in this vital game on the **Ross Gregory Oval**. In their two meetings this season each club has recorded an impressive victory over the other — On A.N.Z.A.C. Day the **Blacks** won by fifty five points while on July 4 the uncanny **Haileybury** accuracy led them to a ninety eight point victory. The **Blacks** defenders must guard **Lassock** closely to prevent him kicking a big goal tally again. Other players who have troubled the Blacks in both games include **Parton, Jones & Bennett** to each of whom **Max Lyon** will look for a big effort today. For the **Blacks**, **Bromell** could worry his opponent while the nippy **Nandlal** will be another whose movements must be watched. The fact the **Blacks** faltered last Saturday must be a concern and because of this plus the superior **Old Haileybury** season record I select them to win today.

SECOND SEMI FINAL

Therry & Old Scotch clearly the two best sides in the competition meet at Kew. Each team has scored a victory over the other this season. **Therry** won the first game by twenty points while great accuracy enabled **Scotch** to win by twenty one points on July 25 after a game in which **Therry** had four more scoring shots. **Therry** are a talented side who move the ball well and with speed. Their stars have included **Shine, Brundell & Reddick** around the ground and in front of goal. A question which will be answered today is will **Therry** play **Eastmure** who has been promoted to B Section after starring in this section earlier in the season. The game will be a good contest and in **Whiteside Scotch** have the leading section goalkicker. Given **Old Scotch's** slip of form last week and **Therry's** better overall 1987 results I select **Therry** to win the game.

UNDER 19 SECTION 3. FIRST SEMI FINAL

Ivanhoe & Monash Blues meet on the **Brighton Beach Oval** where both sides must be mindful of prevailing conditions which can effect the result of the game. Each club has had a victory over the other during the season as **Ivanhoe** won by fourteen points on June 27 while at **Monash** on July 18 the students won by twenty nine points. **Ivanhoe** forwards led by **Lengacher** with assistance from **Blain & Louie Cenagdija** should keep the **Monash** defenders busy. For **Monash** active forwards **O'Brien & Savage** must be on their game to kick a winning score. Having seen both sides play during the season I believe **Ivanhoe** will prove to be the more talented combination and that the **Magpies** will win the game.

SECOND SEMI FINAL

The two strongest sides in the section **Whitefriars & Caulfield Grammarians** meet at **Bulleen Templestowe**. **Whitefriars** must start favourites as they have won the three encounters against **Caulfield**. 100 UP TO FIELD UMPIRE

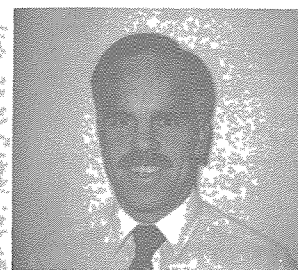
