

LAST WEEKS A SECTION MATCHES

Ormond proved that "persistence pays" following their sensational effort in kicking 3 goals in time on to beat Old Paradians by 3 points in a highly entertaining game. Full marks to O.P's whose intelligent play into the wind in the final quarter caught Ormond out and it wasn't until they directed play or rather were allowed to direct play straight down the ground that they pulled off a quite remarkable victory. O.P's showed they're a fine marking side and I felt they might have been faster than Ormond but you cant deny those 'Monds who must have firmed as favourites for the flag. Brad Nash is one 'Mondsman who relishes playing at Elsternwick Park whilst Martin Tobin has been a great acquisition to the side. Frank Gleeson's two left foot snaps in the 3rd quarter and unbelievable angle goal into the wind in the last were great highlights whilst Dale McCann turned in a great game and his presence tomorrow will mean a lot to O.P's chances.

Uni Blues ensured their A Section spot for 1988 by beating North Old Boys by 16 points. North had the game wrapped up by half time but again went missing to let the Blues in. Ruckman Garry Carroll made a most successful return to A Section football and is bound to figure in his clubs best and fairest award. So too will Mauro Borcich and Steve O'Rourke who have had good years too.

The Blues only just hung on to its spot and can thank the form of youngsters like Eddie Banks, Chris Holmes and Richard Furphy who provided plenty of drive and enthusiasm and Mick Vandell, Bernie Angel and Simon McCauley were also useful contributors. Both Blues and North have some soul searching to do over the summer.

Bulleen Templestowe leave A Section after 4 years. They will have been heartened by a 5 point win over the Cardinals and the fine debut by two 16 year olds Brett Stokes and Tony Panoce. The Bullants need some stability after 4 coaches in those 4 seasons and will be hoping Graeme Jacobs lines up again. A fit Tony Keenan and the return of Ric Demarte, Mal Palmer and Shane Gilmore wouldn't go astray either.

Scotch showed on occasions that they were capable of better things but like previous seasons lost vital games. They certainly unearthed some talent especially **Duncan McCall** but will miss **Don Davenport** who has been forced to stand down due to business commitments in the U.S. Certainly **Scotch** should be one side looking to 1988 with enthusiasm and hope.

Caulfied Grammarians also say farewell but it wouldn't surprise if they returned to 'A' in 1989. They have some really fine players and I understand they'll be strengthened by the return of several stars from their final's sides of 1983 and 85. No matter who returns they would need to work on their commitment.

Old Xaverians finished with a well earned win over **Collegians** whose fall from grace was a mystery. Some blamed it on the loss of **Ian Herman** and **David Hayle** for the first half of the season. Some blamed it on the "Premiership Blues" some probably even blamed **Fergie!** I wonder how many blamed themselves? The **Lions** would need to pick up another rucman and a forward but has the basis of a side which is bound to be more competitive next season.

In form sides coming into finals generally do well and I've selected **De La** not on their past record of finals appearances and success but on their current form."

And Bruce's tips for the A Section best and fairest were Old Xavs Peter Curtain and O.P.'s Mick Skerritt.

He also believes that contrary to public (i.e. Amateur) opinion the standard in A Section has not dropped. The return of players who have had experience at the various levels at VFL clubs has been a great boost and cites **OId Xavs** who have benefitted greatly.

PETER FRENCH PREVIEWS THE SEMI FINALS

For one reason or another this has been the hardest preview to put on paper in the five years I have been attempting them. Indeed I was still at it as late as Wednesday morning much to the printer's horror. However after careful analysis I'm selecting **De La Salle.**

Looking at the game more closely lets commence with the vital on ball players. I overheard an Old Paradian supporters claim last week that Brian Grills was the best ruckman in A Section. Well he's entitled to his view but along with most A Section supporters in general and the umpires in particular he's not in the same street as Mick Greene whose ability to play with injury rivals if not surpasses the great Baldock of whom it is reported was never more than 90% fit! Surely that figure would be 75-80% for Greene who has won the admiration of so many De La players and fans and the respect of all opposition. His around the ground marking and inspirational play is vital to **De La** and they know it! Supporting **Greene** are **Gary Connolly** and **Mark Lowe** who is under a cloud, which could be quite a problem for them as **Old Paradians** possess the best rover in the competition in Frank Gleeson, a view shared not only by Bernie Sheehy and the state selectors but also the A Section umpires! Congratulations Frank - a most worthy winner of the J.N. Woodrow Medal. Frank's great value o.P.'s is his ability to kick goals and he is a real menace when resting or roving up forward. Here's a job for De La's Greg McHenry who has the pace to match it with Gleeson although De La may be forced to use McHenry as first rover if Lowe fails to come up. Q.P.'s may have the edge in the roving department as Martin Heffernan has also had a fine season and will win his share of possessions. Fahey and Connolly are well matched and both will figure in many attacking moves and probably negate one another on the day. Across the centre honours should be even. De La will win in the centre because Tim Cooke is in great touch, but Old Paradians will control the wings through Brendan Considine and Brian Davis. De La's other great strength its defence where Adrian O'Keefe, Pat Maher, Dick Williams, Mick Knuppel and Peter Barry have been playing with great consistency and have formed a tight and versatile combination. O.P.'s will need a big game from John Atta who lacks pace and must decide where to play both Michael Skerritt and Dale McCann. Isuspect McCann may be used up forward, as he outplayed Ormond's Russell Barnes when shifted there last week. He would prove a handful for De La where his marking strength and experience could create havoc. However Adrian O'Keefe may be just the man for him.

At the other end Matt Considine has a huge task if he's given it, of minding De La's major forward Peter Rennie. O.P.'s will be hoping that Tony Pritchard returns to full back where he will need to quickly recover his form, as full forward Peter Waldron has proven a surprising success. Lurking in the pocket will be Colin Lowe who showed glimpses of his great April May form by booting 4 goals last week. Tony Canavan will most likely pick up Brian Hanrahan in what will be an interesting duel especially if Hanrahan is given a run in the ruck and Canavan finds himself on Greene!

Although I'm mindful of **Old Paradian's** endeavour and that they'll be really keyed up for this semi final appearance I'm confident **De La** can win. They have been a model of consistency over the past month and carry a great finals record and tradition into the game. It has the more settled goal to goal line, plays the ground to perfection and has the stoppers to cover the **Old Paradian's** prime movers. Lets hope we get the great game all are anticipating.

In B Section Marcellin and Parkside meet in the do or die first semi final. Marcellin must start favourites as the Devils record in the last month shows 1 win an 3 losses, one of which was against today's opponent! True the club has been severely hit by a shocking run of injuries and the loss of key players such as Frank Sansonetti and maybe Mark Page are bitter blows to the club's hopes of promotion to A Section.

Marcellin will be nearly at full strength with the return of Chris Slattery after his little "holiday" and have Tony Paatsh and Matt Getson in sparkling form whereas Goran Yoksich has struggled for form this season. Dirk Ebert and Andy Cullinan the lion hearted Steve Psoras and youngster Paul Sheahan and Joly Amad are but five players who will worry Parkside who need a disciplined and big game from Chris Freeman. Eagles full back Mick Day has the big task of seeing Freeman is kept well down. Parkside will be looking to its champion Gary Williams (congratulations Gary) who was a clear winner of the season's B Section best and fairest award, to produce the form which won him six best afield votes and that Mark Sturgess can recapture his early season touch.

Marcellin must be wary of over confidence as Parkside has all to gain and nothing to lose. However under the guidance of coach Neil Le Lievre who has a fine record in the V.A.F.A., Marcellin is not likely to take Parkside lightly as they are a most respected opponent.

In C Section Old Melburnians will easily dispose of Monash Blues and return to B Section next season. Monash put in a pathetic effort last week against Kew whilst O.M.'s had to battle hard against a dogged Thomastown.

Monash do not have the burning desire to leave C Section as do the O.M.'s. Nor do they have players capable of holding the O.M.'s galaxy of stars. O.M.'s will be well supported and will use the game as preparation for the big clash with Kew next week.

D SECTION (First Semi Final)

D SECTION PRELIMINARY FINAL



100 UP TO FIELD UMPIRE


