



Marcellin charged its way to the Grand Final in B Section with a 93 point victory over Therry. **The Eagles** looked very fresh compared with a dispirited Therry combination which was never able to get its running game going.

Therry won the toss and kicked with the breeze but as luck would have it the cold front went through 5 minutes later and it was Marcellin who had the advantage of a very stiff breeze. They made full use of it too with an eight goal quarter to lead by 40 points at quarter time. Rover **Peter Sheehan** snapped two lovely goals a minute apart early in the quarter, one with the left foot and one with the right and this set the tone of the match.

Therry had ruckman **Steve Reidy** as a forward target in their quarter with the breeze but they just couldn't get the ball forward enough times to score heavily.

Marcellin fiddled about in the third quarter but still managed 5 goals to one and then in a humiliating last quarter for Therry the Eagles managed 7 goals into the breeze to Therry's 2 goals to run out easy winners.

Gary Petroff took some very fine grabs throughout the afternoon, **Luke Getson** showed a ton of pace and flair, **Joe Amad** displayed his usual vigour and **Dirk Ebert** was creative as usual.

Therry's better players were pivot **Greg Nyman**, defender **Paul Matton** and half back **Tim Taylor**.

Therry were very disappointed with their showing, none more so than coach **Bernie Dunn**, but I think it became clear that Marcellin deserved the right to challenge St. Bernards for the Premiership.

Last week's record has me tipping Marcellin for the flag. I'd better stick with that but what I really meant was Marcellin to win the Preliminary. But **Neil Le Lievre**, you ought to be worried, given my awful record!

I thought last Sunday's A Section Grand Final was one of the best days of Amateur Football I have seen. Certainly, the crowd was a very good one — perhaps the best I have seen at Elterwick. We are thankful to Amateur stalwarts for supporting the VAFA.

The weather certainly helped. For a change, there was very little breeze and the sun shone!

The Marketing Committee's idea to promote Family Football seemed to work. The Children's rides were full all day, the marquee was very well patronised, the jazz band set the scene and there were hundred of people kicking the footy on the ground.

There were lots of well-known faces but two that stood out to me were **Russell Green** and **Simon Eishold**, combatants the day before but relaxing and enjoying our great day.

The game itself was made interesting by the closeness of the scores but I am sure **Old Xaverians** supporters would be disappointed with the performances of some of their stars. Too many had just ordinary days.

By contrast, **Ormond** had some great players, none more so than rovers **Paul Cox & Joe Young** who were instrumental in giving Ormond a 13 point lead at half time.

Xavs missed the leadership of **Peter Curtain** in the important third quarter when they only got 2 goals with the breeze. It looked hopeless as Ormond led by 31 points partway through the third quarter.

But to their credit the Xavs did fight back through **Peter and John Curtain**, and on-ball players **Brendan Ryan** and **Martin Beattie**. Xavs got to within 11 points. However too many Ormond players wanted it more! How good was **Phil Mehrten** in the centre? **Scott Taylor** was a fabulous defender and didn't young **Paul Nankervis** show maturity on the wing. The 'Monds held Xavs up to win their 6th A Section Flag, the second for coach **Mike McArthur-Allen** in 3 years.

Well done to both sides. Nice to see Xavs players wait for the Presentation too and to **Russell Barnes** acknowledgement of their efforts. Football was the winner!

Peter French previews

today's Finals



Peter French looks at last weekend and Sunday's B Section Grand Final

All associated with last Sundays A Section Grand Final — the players, competing clubs **Ormond and Old Xavs**, VAFA Administration, Umpires and spectators can look back on the day as being a great one, not only for **Ormond** but for the VAFA.

Ross has summed up the day pretty well in his review as did the Sun's **Graeme Johnstone** in his daily column 'A Place in the Sun' (Well worth a read that article!). I'd just like to congratulate all associated with the Ormond Club on its premiership win and at the same time make mention of Old Xaverians consistent season and also congratulate the Club on reaching the Grand Final in its A Section return.

Briefly reviewing the game Old Xavs looked pretty good in the opening stages and with a bit more steadiness may have held a handy lead at the first change. **Martin Beattie & Peter Curtain** had starred for Xavs.

The second and third quarters belonged to the '**Monds Phil Mehrten**, indeed the Ormond centre line was well on top as were rovers **Paul Cox & Joey Young**. **Lindsay McMahon, Tim Hille & David McDonald** were doing their jobs whilst Xavs had few winners apart from **Brendan Ryan & John Curtain**.

Two quick Ormond goals decided the issue for some but then Xavs rallied. **Mark Summers** came into the game and **Peter Curtain** despite a crippling injury led from the front. Xavs got to within 11 points before **Steve McCooke** settled the issue "Maradona style" with an angle kick off the ground.

As good a finals game as we've seen and the very good crowd (est. 5000) enjoyed every minute of it. However the man who enjoyed it most had to be **Ormond** skipper **Russell Barnes** when he stood on the victory dais with the **L.M. Adamson & Sherrin Cups** held triumphantly aloft.

B Section Preview

Marcellin was most impressive in accounting for **Therry** in the Preliminary final last Saturday, and the result of this game could well rest with the performance of **Gary Petroff** at centre half forward for **Marcellin & St. Bernards** skipper **Mick O'Dea** who will oppose him at centre half back.

Petroff was quite superb last week and **O'Dea** will need to punch from behind and have the half backs, centre line and rovers ready to sweep the ball away. The clash between Marcellin's **Steve Psoras & Paul Hogan** will be another highlight and **Carlos Castagna** will need to concentrate hard as his opponent St. Bernard's **Greg Wood** is a potential match winner and one of the longest kicks in the VAFA.

The On Ball players of both sides are evenly matched and neither side lacks in endeavour.

I've had a wretched finals from a tipping viewpoint selecting only two winners to date — Marcellin on both occasions! I'm going with the Eagles again today believing their greater pace and marking strength around the ground will give them the edge.







Grand Final Edition (continued from September 19th)

50 YEARS AGO — 1937

Ormond and **Ivanhoe** make their debut in 'A' Section, **Ivanhoe** having won successive premierships in D, C and B.

Former league stars coaching 'A' Section teams were "**Jiggy**" **Harris** (Coll-Ivanhoe), **Billy Libbils** (Coll. & Melb. - State Bank), **Hughie Dunbar** (Melb. — Ormond), **Bill Cubbins** (St. Kilda - Elsternwick), **Gus Dobrigh** (Collingwood-Old Scotch).

Clarie Vontom who went on to captain **St. Kilda** was appointed captain of **Collegians**, 1936 'A' Section premiers. Famous **State Bank** centre forward **Dick Chandler** (A) opened his season's account with 15 goals.

Legendary forward **Len Boyd-Gerny** kicked 12 goals in his career debut for **MHSOB** against **South Camberwell**. **Frank Higginbotham** starred for **Old Xaverians** whose scribe wrote "He is Bradman, Phar Lap, Lindrum and Bunton all in one".

Jim Greaves, later to be a star with **St. Kilda** made a great debut with **Uni Blacks**.

Jim Peters who captained the **Blacks** to the last premiership had taken on the coaching position.

Bruce Andrew's keenness for amateur football is a source of inspiration to **Parkside** and much of the interest in amateur football in the City of Mordiallic is due to **Bruce's** moral and practical support which is really appreciate. **Bruce**, former Collingwood star, went on to become secretary for many years of Australian National Football Council, and also a sane and sensible member of "World of Sport". **Bruce** was famous for his "Theodolite Brylcream" hairdo, and his insistence on a gaut instep for competitors attempting punt kicks in "Champion Kick". Famous district cricket coach, **Joe Plane**, perhaps familiar to veterans was coach of **Hampton Rovers**.

Alan Forty regular interstate player, played his 200th game for **Glenhuntingly**.

In 1938 players were very dedicated! On King's Birthday weekend, competition matches were played on both Saturday and Monday, and yes, even the **Old Melburnians** fielded a team on both days!

Lindsay Hassett, later to captain Australia at cricket, kicked 7 of **Geelong's** 8 goals against **Old Scotch**. Teams to play South Australia at St. Kilda Cricket Ground was as follows:

RKS: J. Atkins (Old Melb), J. Bray (Ormond), H. Day (Collegians)

RES: R. Kline (Elsternwick), R. Stevenson (Brunswick)

South Australia won 17.14 to 14.10 after trailing by 34 points at the first change and the scores being:

South Australia:	1.5	8.9	12.11	17.14
Victoria:	7.3	9.3	13.9	14.10

The Press Correspondent was obviously disgusted as no description of the game was given.

Old Melburnians (A) welcomed their five schoolboy representatives — **B. Rose, W. Newton, A. Lapin, M. Mills** and **H. Dowsley** with the comment added, "a special mention must be given to **Bill Newton** who showed he is a class ruckman and one of the finest marks in the competition" — **Bill Newton** lost his life in New Guinea in the R.A.A.F. winning a posthumous Victoria Cross.

Bob Flegg, also killed in the Second World War, kicked 103 goals for Ormond to become the first player to bag 100 in a first season in 'A' Section.

Ormond annexed the minor premiership by finishing on top in its first season of 'A' Section football.

Ormond went on to go down to **Collegians** in the 'A' Section Grand Final.

60 YEARS AGO — 1927

New clubs admitted were Flinders Naval Depot, Black Rock, Kingsville, Oakleigh, Pascoe Vale, State Savings Bank, West Hawthorn.

The Metropolitan Football Follower "changed its name on 28 May to "The Amateur Football Follower". V.F.L. were reported to be considering the experiment of replacing players injured during the game! The M.F.L. (V.A.F.A.) had used the rule since the resumption of play after World War 1.

Interstate wicketkeeper, Stuart King, was playing full back for University B.

An Amateur Football Association had been formed in Bendigo with games played on Wednesdays between Railways, School of Mines, Teachers' Training College, Stock Agents, Press and Banks.

Team select to play South Australia at the Albert Ground was as follows: **Bks:** Morris (Els.), Kitson (Old C' field), C. Loughrey (E'wick), **H.Bks:** Brooke (Teacher's College), Scott (St. Pauls), J. Corder (Old Melb), **C:** Tomasett (Sand), Allen (Glenh), Moss (Old Trinity), **H.Fwd:** Ward (B'wick), J. Green (Uni.B.), K. Nicolson (Geel), **Fwds:** Hope (B'ton Vale), H. Oakley (Coll), B. Barnett (Old Scotch), **Rks:** Staley (Old Sc), Teaning (Murr), Rutherford (Old Melb), **Res:** Hansen (F.N.D.), Kelly (Old X), Monteath (Old Hail.), Sunderland (Sand), Alan Staley (Old Scotch) captained the team for third year in succession. He was not captain nor vice-captain of his club. Victoria won, 13.17 (95) to 11.11 (77).

Collegians applauded the splendid defence of **Turnbull**, "still a member of the College XVIII" - later to become very famous as an independent Tasmanian Senator. Another good player for **Collegians** was H.W. Heather-shaw, later associated with Commonwealth Bank in its great "A" Section days, and then a long serving member of V.A.F.A. Executive and Interstate Selector. **Checker Hughes** of Richmond fame (in those days) gave the **Hampton** team a fine lecture on the game.

University B, under leadership of "**Crofty**" **Rhoden** (later to become famous as father of Peter, **Old Xaverians** and V.A.F.A Interstate coach, and 1987 tribunal member) came back from 60 points down against minor premiers **Old Scotch** to get up on the bell to win the second semi by one point. In the other semi "**Varsity A**" lead for the first three terms and then crumpled before the rapier thrusts of **Elsternwick** — **Charlie Loughrey**, later a Melbourne star was a brilliant player for the 'Wicks'.

University B then beat the 'Wicks' in the preliminary final with again a superb last quarter to win 17.15 to 11.9 and go on to meet **Old Scotch** in the grand final. Great forward **Jack Green**, later to star with Carlton, and even later to become a well known football broadcaster with Norman Banks, kicked 8 against the 'Wicks' to bring his tally to 100 for the season.

The "**Varsity B**" boys could not repeat their semi final win and went down to **Old Scotch**, gaining them 4 premierships in 5 years. The match was played at Brighton Cricket Ground. The **Old Scotch** list as printed in "The Australian F.F." was **C.A. Fergie** (c.c.) **D. Swan, B. A. Barnett, J. McLorinan, A. McTaggart, N. Law, A. Stanley** (v.c.), **M. Moran, C. Swan, G. Cathcart, G. Law, R. Meares, A. Moore, W. Vickers, B. Ingram, R. Barkway, I. Telford, G. Paterson, G. Higson, I. Vickers, J. Davis, S. McLorinan, K. Campbell**.

The "**Varsity B**" team was **C. Rhoden** (c) **J. Green** (v.c.) **K. Cussen, S.P King, A. Dalton, E. A'Becket, J. Bald, L. Clements, S. Harvie, N. Peverill, W. Humphris, E. Horan, B. Scharpe, E. Mitchell, J. Benjamin, C. Cohen, Quinn, A.P. Edwards, H. Grounds, L. Treadwell, H. Whitehead, J. Loughnan, J. McAuliffe, J. Tunbridge, R. Tynan, W. Cawley**.
