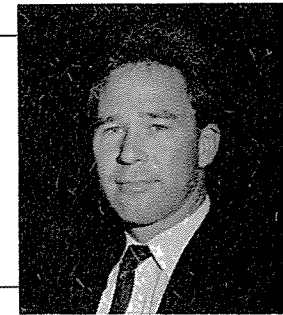

A Section Review by Ross Booth



Top side **Ormond** scored a comfortable 69 point win over **Caulfield Grammarians** two weeks ago but not before they received a shock in the second quarter when Caulfield kicked 7 goals to go to a handy 23 point lead at half time. But that was enough to stir Ormond into action and after half time they added 15 goals and kept Caulfield goalless, as they were two weeks before against **Old Xaverians**. **Paul Schuhkraft** got 10 goals for a season tally of 40, **Paul McDonald** held sway in the ruck and gave Ormond first use of the ball from the centre. **Caulfield's David Matthews** has been playing at full forward because of a ham string problem and not in the ruck.

Second placed **Old Paradians** returned to the winning list but not by much — just 11 points over bottom side **Bulleen-Templestowe**. It was a see-sawing game though OP's did lead at each change. **Tony Woods** generated a lot of drive for OP's from the centre as did **Rick Brian Grills** (4 goals to the PhD!) and rover **Phil Gleeson**.

Third placed Old Xaverians swamped **Uni. Blues** in the first quarter kicking 9 goals to 1 and went on to a big 10 goal win. Full forward fill in **Nick Bowle** who replaced the concussed **Steve Curtain** was sensational in the 1st quarter taking some spectacular marks for 5 goals. He also finished with 10 goals for the afternoon.

North Old Boys scored a narrow victory over **De La Salle**, the margin just over 5 points. It was close all day, a point the difference at the last break and both sides had chances to win but it was North in front at siren time. **Gary Carroll & Steve O'Dowke** continue to be the powerhouse for the **Northerners** and **Mauro Borcich** celebrated his 250th with a sound game on the ball.

Old Scotch moved into the four with their 6 goal win over **Collegians**. **Scotch** scored the first 7 goals for the match and maintained a similar margin for the rest of the game. **Andrew McMillan** was impassable in defence and centre **Brian Hodge** was back to his best. **Collegians** ruckman **Chris Pollock** has glandular fever and his place has been taken by ex SA **Peter King**. **Stuart Hitchen** tried his heart out for the Lions.

Peter French Previews today's matches



What a poor round May 30th was for your correspondent, especially in B Section where **Uni Blacks** bounced back to form with an important win over **Ivanhoe**, and despite having a bob each way with **Therry**, **Fawkner** was not quite up to the task. Wins by **Banyule** and **Parkside** completed a disastrous effort by yours truly. The big upset in C Section was **Balaclava's** fine win over **Old Brighton** and following on the Club's effort the previous week, a great effort indeed by **'Bala'**.

In A Section only **Old Scotch** was to prove me wrong following its decisive win over **Collegians**, for whom a September appearance is fast becoming a pipe dream!

North Old Boys has a great chance to move into the top four this week at the expense of both **Old Scotch** and **De La Salle** who each face tough assignments. **North** has now won 3 on end and at home today against **Collegians** has the players in form to not only revenge the grand final loss of 1986, but more importantly today's win will see the club continue its quiet and unsung approach to rechallenge in 1987. **North's** greatest asset in recent victories has been its aggression at the ball. Put simply they've gone in harder, played in front and wanted the ball more. The **Griffins**, **Considines**, **Borcichs**, **O'Rourke's** are all playing well and the return of **Gus Carroll** has more than compensated for the loss of **Peter Wright**. Although I don't discount the **Lions** they're certainly not playing with the commitment of last year which may have flowed onto its supporters who were notable by their absence at the Trott on May 30th. It's not too late for **Collegians** and certainly the return of **Nipper Parsons** and **Chris Pollock** will be a bonus, but I think **North** will win in a canter.

Old Scotch was rightfully delighted with its win over **Collegians**, and will start the battle for Flinders Park with plenty of confidence. However they will find the **Xavs** a far different proposition. To win, **Andrew Smith** and **Rob Fuller** would need to hold **Xavs** forwards **Steven Curtin** and **Nick Bourke** to low tallies and hope **John Moir** can provide **Steve Reddish** and the brothers **Senior** with more opportunities than the **Xavs** on ball players. Its quite possible all that might happen but I think **Xavs** would still win because its defence led by **Nick Burne**, **Peter** and **John Curtin** will hold the **Scotch** forwards whilst the drive it regularly receives from its centre line and likely inclusion of either **Armstrong** or **Greetham** will provide additional avenues to goal. In what's likely to be a high standard and close game its **Xavs** to win.

Old Paradians will host **De La Salle** for the first time in more than 6 years. I wonder how many D's have ever been to Bundoora? **Greg McHenry**? **Mike Deveson**? **Mike Greene**? There wouldn't be many. Its a vital match for the visitors if they're to stay in the hunt for 4th spot, given that **Ormond**, **Old Xavs** and **Old Paradians** will fill the top three although I'm not yet sure of the order.

I'm selecting the home side as they're more even and have the players to match **De La**. I note Alan Jeans is calling for an alteration of the rules to ensure the man on man tussles are retained. Well he'd love this match watching **Brian Grills** against **Mick Greene**, **Frank Gleeson** on **Mark Lowe**, **Paul Considine** tagging **Gary Connolly** and **Tony Canavan** or **Dale McCann** minding **Colin Lowe**. The running style of both sides will make for an entertaining game but at home the **O.P's** are almost unbeatable and with **Old Xavs** breathing down their necks for the double chance they have the incentive despite a mini slump which saw a loss at **North** and a narrow win at Lower Templestowe

Uni Blues return home to tackle **Caulfield Grammarians** who will need to manage more than one quarter of football before they can expect another win. **Blues** are certainly hot and cold, but even a like warm effort will see them victorious today.

In the remaining match **Ormond** are home to **Bulleen-Templestowe** who last few outings have shown considerable improvement. However this is a case of front playing last and not even the most loyal Bullant supporter would be expecting to upset the Section leaders who will welcome the return of **David McDonald**, **Andrew Mhrtren** and **Craig Tonkin**.

The big match in B Section will be played at Elsternwick Park between competition leaders **Parkside** and **Therry**. It will be a good test for both sides. **Parkside** are the more even but might lack the running players that are vital to **Therry**. However a big plus is the form of **Sturgess** and **Page** and a winning centreline is crucial at Elsternwick which would help the Devils offset the attacking **Therry** defence. The return of **Reidy** is also a big plus for **Therry** and his clash with **Yoksich** will be a real highlight. I'm selecting **Therry** who I feel will play the ground better and like the big clash in C Section I wonder whether I'll be watching a preview of the grand final.

St. Bernards at home will face **Marcellin**, who are on the slide, with plenty of confidence, especially having

won 6 on end. **Marcellin** has dropped its last 2 games and really needs the win but at West Essendon the task is beyond it.

Ivanhoe will creep closer to a place in the four by beating **Old Trinity** and **Uni Blacks** despite a trip to North Road will beat **St. Kilda** who let me and themselves down a fortnight ago.

Fawkner is at home to **Banyule** who have the pride and team spirit to win this game. It is a vital game for both clubs whose 1988 future could well rest on the outcome.

In C Section the long awaited **Kew** and **Old Melburnians** game will be played at Kew. The home side will relish meeting the Navy Blues at Victoria Park where the narrow flanks and pockets will assist Kew to bottle up the game. However **O.M.'s** have the big man strength of **Ed Corder** and **Rohan Brown** to dominate proceedings and have **John Mitchell** and **Ric Pisarski** in form up forward. **Kew's** on ball players might just give them the edge as **Busuttill**, **Bria**, **McCull** and **Burden** are also in top form and **Cavanagh** can be relied upon to kick goals. Much will depend on **Tony Peric**. If the Kew man can concentrate hard all day and keep **Brown** and **Corder** from feeding **Bradshaw Nichols** and Co. Kew can win although I wonder who will pick up **McMullin**? In a game which many apart from **Monash** and **Old Brighton** supporters, already see as a rehearsal of the grand final I believe that at home Kew can hang on to win.

Monash at home will handle **Thomastown** and **Old Brighton** will not slip up two games in a row and so beat the **High School**.

Balaclava can move up the ladder with a big win over Albert Park neighbours **AJAX** and in the local traditional derby **Old Haileybury** will return to the winning list by beating the **Rovers**.

South Australia reversed the result of last year's carnival win with a thrilling 8 point win over **Victoria** at the Adelaide Oval last Sunday.

Victoria opened confidently but missed some relatively easy scoring opportunities and trailed by 10 points at quarter time.

South Australia had an excellent second quarter in which they kicked 6 goals to **Victoria's** 1 and led at one stage by 45 points. The deficit at half time was 37 points and things looked pretty grim.

Victorian coach **Bruce Sheehy** shuffled the side around at half time. Centreman **Phil Mehrten** was moved to full forward just before half time and looked pretty effective - he stayed there and **Richard Herman** who was tentative went to the forward flank. Back pocket **Nick Burne** went to centre half forward, centre-half-forward **Mark McDonald** went to full back and captain **Peter Curtain** into the centre.

The third quarter saw a transformation in the **Vics**. **Mike Yandell** had spent a lot of time in the forward pocket but on the ball he was more effective. **Mehrten**, **Curtain** and **Burne** all fired and the **Vics** rattled on 6 goals of their own to get within 5 points but **South Australia** steadied and led by 21 points at the last break.

But **Victoria** were not to be denied and they continued to fight and at the 13 minute mark got to within 1 point. Victory looked a faint possibility.

The effort unfortunately had taken its toll and **South Australia** was able to get a couple of goals to reassert their ascendancy, and go on to a narrow but deserved victory. They were better on the day.

Norm Nugent Previews the D, E, F, G, H and U.19's



REVIEW OF MATCHES PLAYED 30/5/87 (Round 8)

D SECTION

Uncanny accuracy enabled **Nth Brunswick** to defeat a spirited **Heatherton** after a high scoring game. **Bulleen United** defeated **Old Camberwell Grammarians** by thirty one points. A pleasing feature for **United** must have been their return to accuracy in front of goal. **Old Mentonians** proved too strong for **Old Ivanhoe** when they recorded a thirteen point victory. St. Kevins showed no mercy to **Coburg** as the leaders won by twenty goals. **Elsternwick's** forwards had a day out against **Preston** when aided by unerring accuracy the 'Wicks won by twelve goals.

E SECTION

Brunswick defeated **University High School Old Boys** by fourteen points after an evenly contested game. **St. Bedes** overran **Clayton** to record an eighteen goal victory. **Old Essendon Grammarians** gradually overcame **Old Geelong** after an even first quarter. Their winning margin was twenty six points. **State Bank** recorded one of the biggest scores in their club's sixty season history when they accounted for **Peninsula Old Boys** by more than twenty goals. The closest sectional game was that in **Royal Park** where **West Brunswick** defeated **University High School Old Boys** by seven points.

F SECTION

St. Andrews entered the top four in place of **Williamstown** whom they defeated by over twelve goals. Only inaccuracy prevented **Old Carey** defeating **A.N.Z. Bank** by a margin greater than twenty goals. **LaTrobe University** proved too strong for **Commonwealth Bank** by having a twenty one point lead at the final siren. In the meeting of the sectional leaders **Whitefriars** proved too strong for **Doveton**. This game was a low scoring one and in the circumstances the **Whitefriars** six goal margin was a substantial one. **St. Leonards** recorded a four goal victory over **University Reds** and thus opened their 1987 account. **Aquinas** showed their strength by defeating **Footscray Institute** by just under thirty goals in a game where a score was recorded on average every seventy five seconds.

G SECTION

As I predicted **De La Salle** defeated **Marcellin** although the final result was closer than I expected. **Kew** did prove too talented for **Old Scotch** and won by sixty nine points. **Monash Whites** certainly did not build their percentage at the expense of **St. Bernards** as the **Whites** won by only two points; the consequence of inaccurate kicking. **Port Colts** proved my prediction wrong when they defeated **Collegians** by nineteen points. **Old Haileybury** did record a big victory at the expense of **Old Melburnians** while **Bloods** maintained their unbeaten record at the expense of **GTV9** when despite very heavy conditions they won by eighty six points.

H SECTION

Old Melburnians replaced **C.B.C.St.Kilda** as a result of their twenty six point victory. **St. Bernards** won their elusive fourth victory over an inaccurate **Old Brighton** after an evenly contested game. **Old Scotch** moved

away from **University Blacks** to a comfortable game and a half margin as a result of their fifty point victory. **Banyule** defeated **Thomastown** by thirty points after a high scoring game, while very inaccurate kicking by their opponents **Old Haileybury** enabled leaders **Therry** to record the barest possible victory.

In an evenly contested game which at times became very congested **Monash Blues** held out a keen **Old Paradians Purple** side to win by eight points.

I will stay with winning form and select **Bulleen United**. Two of the sectional leaders **St. Kevins & Old Mentonians** will meet on the **Righetti Oval**. **St. Kevins** are doing all **Alan Quaife** is asking of them and I select them to win today. Neighbours **Preston & Coburg** meet in a game which could determine the fate of each club come the end of the season. **Preston** must win if they hope to feature in the finals while **Coburg** could avoid relegation by winning today. **Preston** should be able to win because their overall 1987 form is superior.

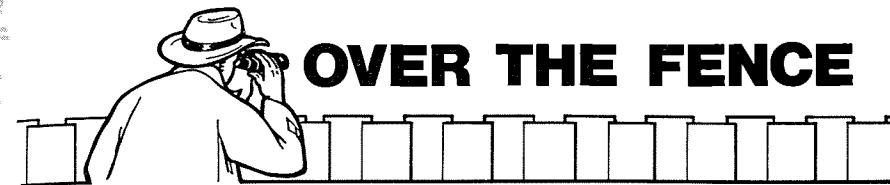

OTF asks are you aware that there are 15 offences for which a player can be reported? As many players and supporters are probably not, we have listed them for all to read.

RULE 16.9 REPORTABLE OFFENCES

A player who commits the following offences shall be reported.

- 16.9.1 Wilfully wastes time.
- 16.9.2 Unduly interferes with a player whilst such a player is kicking for goal.
- 16.9.3 Disputes the decision of an umpire.
- 16.9.4 Unduly interferes with, or assaults, or uses abusive, threatening, or insulting language, or behaviour towards an umpire during the progress of a match or within or without the oval on the day of the match.
- 16.9.5 Assaults another player.
- 16.9.6 Uses abusive, threatening, or insulting language.
- 16.9.7 If when a player is preparing to kick for goal after being awarded a mark or free kick, or if the ball is in transit, a player shakes the goal post.
- 16.9.8 Throws an opponent after that player has taken a mark, or after the ball is otherwise out of play.
- 16.9.9 Violently pushes an opponent after that player has disposed of the ball.
- 16.9.10 Intentionally trips or kicks or attempts to trip or kick an opponent.
- 16.9.11 Strikes or attempts to strike a player with his hand or arm.
- 16.9.12 Charges an opponent.
- 16.9.13 Engages in unduly rough play.
- 16.9.14 Remains on the playing ground not wearing proper uniform after being warned by the umpire.
- 16.9.15 Wears unacceptable equipment — boots studs, rings, jewellery, surgical appliances or guards.
- 16.9.16 Is guilty of misconduct.

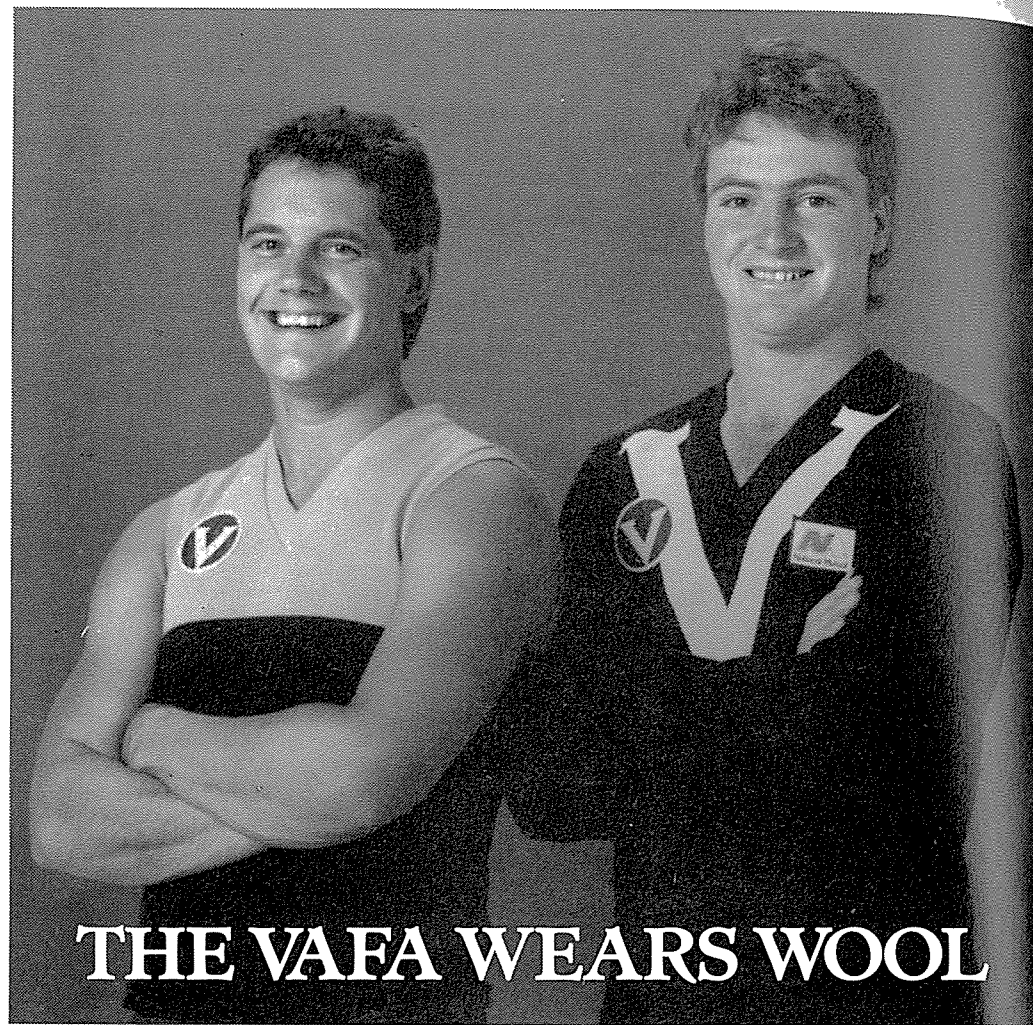

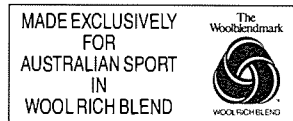

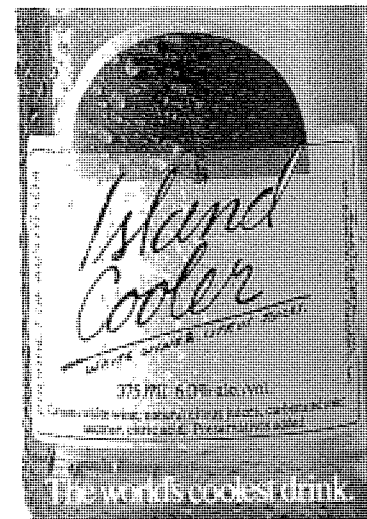

A large gathering of past players and officials is expected, including some of the inaugural 1947 team and Club Founder, Wal Davie.

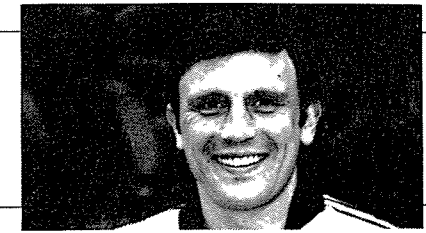
50 GAMES AT AJAX
